Dear Members of the Board of Supervisors:

I am a parent of three children, 2 of them are ineligible for vaccinations, but attend school. My youngest, **see**, age 5 has **see at the second secon** 

Children under twelve are not yet eligible for the Covid vaccine. In order to do all that we can to protect children—school age and younger—I am asking the Pima County Board of Supervisors to require K-12 staff and students to wear masks while on campus and in the buses that transport students to and from campus. Last year, when the vaccine was not available, the county imposed a broader mask requirement designed to protect all members of the community. The children in our community deserve the same protection.

I am well aware that the State Legislature and the Governor have passed a law intended to prevent local governments from requiring masks. I have little hope for the State to modify this law. Therefore, I am also urging the Board of Supervisors to ask the courts for a stay in the execution of this law in order to buy time to argue for its unconstitutionality.

Our children are currently in person at school because after keeping them home all year last year we knew we had to have them in person this year. The mental health and developmental impacts of having them home and isolated for longer was concerning.

They have been wearing masks all day indoors and out for a month and doing just fine with it!

Dear Board of Supervisors,

I understand that you will again be taking up the issue of requiring masking in schools at today's board of supervisors meeting. I urge, verging on imploring you, to pass a resolution requiring masking in all schools, regardless of vaccination status. Even if you pass something that goes only until Sept. 29th when Ducey's law goes into effect. Your resolution could then be revisited shortly before that 9/29 deadline based on the community spread of Covid-19 at that time.

We are writing to you as concerned parents and teacher to thank you for adding <u>Resolution of the Pima</u> <u>County Board of Supervisors Mandating the Use of Face Coverings in All K-12 Schools Within the</u> <u>County, as an Effective Mitigation Strategy to Keep our Children Safe from COVID-19; Effective</u> <u>Immediately</u> back to the Pima County Addendum Agenda for 8/10/21. Thank you to the Pima County Supervisors who voted in favor of this critical Resolution.

Thank you to the Pima County Supervisors for bringing the issue back to the Board of Supervisors on Monday, August 16 and urge you to vote in favor of the County Resolution requiring a universal mask requirement in K-12 schools. A county mandate will help keep our children and community safe.

According to Banner Health Chief Clinical Officer, Dr. Marjorie Bessel hospitals have seen a 95% increase in Covid-19 patients since July 1 and 300% increase in ventilators and there is substantial spread in the vast majority of Arizona counties. Arizona is also second in the nation for pediatric deaths related to COVID-19, according to <u>data</u> published recently by the American Academy of Pediatrics. The science around masking is settled. Masks work to prevent disease transmission. All recent public health agencies, both national and local, have issued statements recommending universal masks for K-12 students in schools.<sup>[1]</sup>

Arizonans have a right to safe schools for Arizona kids. Governor Ducey is attempting to prevent school officials from implementing any public health mitigation strategies in line with leading public health agencies, including the CDC and Arizona Department of Health Services (ADHS) to help protect students, all while COVID19 cases are again rising in our communities and more contagious variants are becoming more widespread.

The law passed by the state. banning schools from implementing such policies is likely unconstitutional,<sup>[2]</sup> doesn't take effect until Sept. 29 and poses a serious risk to life and health.

Pima County has a duty to protect the health of the community under Arizona law. Arizona Revised Statute Title 36 authorizes counties and local health jurisdictions to protect the health of the community during contagious diseases outbreaks. It is your duty to take action.

Hello Pima County Board of Supervisors,

I am a Tucson Family Physician and my husband is a Hospitalist who is currently caring for the increasing number of sick COVID-19 patients, once again. We are writing in support of a Pima County K-12 school indoor mask mandate. I'm sure that as board members, you have had access to briefings and statistics from many medical experts about this current COVID-19 surge, and how it is clearly affecting young people at a higher rate and with more severity, so I will not reiterate the numbers or data here. But the links to many of the studies/stats I allude to in this note are listed below.

I was very disheartened to see the county mandate voted down at last week's meeting, and I am thrilled it is back on the agenda for this week. Thank you so much for taking the time to revisit this important agenda item. I pray that those of you who voted against it have had some time to review all the emails/letters/phone calls, etc showing the public support for a county mandate, and to look at the large increase in cases and abscences in schools just since your previous meeting, and to read about the precedent of other cities and school districts in AZ, TX, and FL who have instituted mandates in defiance of state orders, and to look at the lawsuits that are currently ongoing in TX and AZ regarding mandates and the positive outcomes in favor of mandates so far.

We have a son at Marana High School, and I spoke at our school board meeting on 8/12/21 to encourage them to issue a mask mandate. Afterward, a board member told me that he supported a school mask mandate, but that the board could likely not afford the potential legal ramifications from the state. I suspect the majority of school boards feel the same way: they would LOVE to have a simple rule in place that requires a proven and FREE method of protecting the safety of students, staff, and the public, but they cannot afford the potential costs. What a devastating position to put our school administors in. They know how to help, and it will cost them nothing, but they are being told they can't do it. And the fact that private school administrators are NOT in this position seems actually discriminatory when it comes to public safety during a pandemic.

If a county-wide K-12 mask mandate could enable public schools to keep their community safer while alleviating the legal and financial burdens on them, I feel you have a responsibility to institute this mandate at the earliest possible date. Not only are the numbers of sick children increasing rapidly, other exposed children are missing school due to quarantine (with no good option to keep up with the 10 days of missed school work since there is no virtual learning). Therefore, we are on the verge of an academic crisis, as well. I feel strongly that both history and the law will be on the side of those who did whatever it takes to slow a pandemic, keep kids in school, and decrease the number of hospitalizations, deaths, and chronic illness where ever they could. Note: I added "chronic illness" to this list because an AZ study has just shown that even among mild to moderate cases of COVID-19, 77% still had symptoms 2

months out from diagnosis. It's clear that just decreasing hospitalizations and death are not our only goal posts here.

Every additional layer of protection that a population employs decreases the spread of this virus a little further, and we have a simple, safe, cheap, and effective "layer" at our disposal: masks. However, they work far better if at least 80% of people are wearing one, and sadly, the only way we will reach that percentage is if masks are mandated. My son is one of about 10% of people at MUSD wearing a mask, despite the fact that our administration has "strongly recommended" them. This morning my son woke up **and the set of the set of**

I emailed you prior to the last meeting, attended my school board meeting, emailed several of you individually, met with my elected supervisor, and am emailing you as a group again now.

I cannot attend Monday's meeting as I will be caring for COVID patients in an overflowing ICU at Banner University Medical Center where I am a physician.

My nephew **Exercise** during his first week at school and now seven family members are ill. Four children all under the age of 12, as well as three vaccinated adults, all who share the same household.

My sister is a kindergarten teacher in the Marana school district - the same district in which my nieces and nephews **Constitution** Only 5 of the 20 kids in her class are being sent to class with masks, and few of the teachers are masked. She has a health condition that makes me very worried about her welfare despite her vaccinated and masked status.

My children, ages 5 and 9, are both students in the Catalina Foothills district. Neither of their teachers are masking. My sister in law also teaches there. They just shut down a kindergarten classroom tonight. More will surely follow.

Ducey's law puts our children in danger. There are more children sick and hospitalized than at any point in this pandemic and school has barely started. Many of the adult patients in my ICU are sickened by their kids and grandkids. Many will die. Vaccines aren't available to children under 12 yet. The kids depend on things that are not being done in our schools. There is no social distancing as there is no online option and classes are packed. There is no masking because of an unjust law.

Many counties across the country are standing up to similarly unjust laws by similarity misguided governors. I ask that you do the same.

I am writing again to express my support for requiring face coverings in all K-12 schools.

I am a parent of two. One, a junior high student, **Second 1999**; the other, an elementary student, is still too young to be eligible for the vaccine. Both of them studied remotely all of last year. It was a very difficult year for them, as it was for many other students. My husband and I assured them that they would be able to return to in person school this academic year. With vaccinations and precautionary measures in place, we thought that we would finally have low levels of community transmission. I, along with countless others, was very disappointed in last week's vote on the issue. Particularly as it appeared that most would have been in favor of such a measure, and acknowledged that such a measure is necessary, if it weren't for State law. A law whose constitutionality is being currently challenged. A law that needs to be challenged by our county as well.

I implore you to vote in favor of this resolution. We know that masks work when everyone is masking up; not just some. Masks do not cause any harm to the wearer. Masks help prevent the spread of the COVID-19 virus. Our children need not only their peers, but also their teachers and school staff to be masked, so that they can be protected. Last year was extremely difficult for my child. His 4th grade school year abruptly ended in-person learning, and teachers did the best they could with limited time and resources to try to ensure critical skills were taught. The following school year began remotely, and my son was excited to start "school" again. The teachers were much more prepared, the district had received more resources to support remote learning as well as families, providing a space (with social distancing and face masks) for kids to learn "remotely" from the school if needed.

I cannot begin to fully express the sheer joy that my son had when he was allowed to return to "in person" learning with masks and social distancing. My son's school again had received more resources for staffing, and since some remote options were still available for vulnerable families, social distancing was more attainable. When schools returned to "remote learning" again due to the winter surge, he struggled much more. His teachers had a harder time keeping the kids' focus, but the silver lining was the hope to return to "in-person" as vaccinations were rolling out.

When my son returned, even with a full day and decreased social distancing due to more kids in the classroom, his school had zero outbreaks, likely due to mask use and more staffing to allow greater distancing during lunch.

Due to the success of the prior year, I felt confident in sending my son back to school, knowing that everything done proved that the schools knew how to operate during the pandemic. But things are different this year. Schools do not have the remote learning options that they had last year. Schools do not have the additional staffing and resources they had last year, and they have more kids in the school. Schools do not have the authority to follow the guidelines of local public health officials with regards to masking, otherwise they risk losing their regular funding.

As a parent, I was hoping that other parents were paying attention to the level of transmission. I was hoping that other parents read the isolation and quarantine measures that have to be followed with any positive COVID case, especially in the absence of mask wearing. As a responsible parent, I asked my son to wear his mask and to try to stay around other children who wear their masks. Because ultimately, as a parent, I have been shocked by how many kids are not wearing their masks. Only about a third on a good day.

Maybe those numbers will improve as more kids are having to self isolate, keeping parents at home that otherwise would be at their jobs. Maybe people have to actually experience the disruptions and return to "remote learning" that have and will continue to occur over and over before they connect the dots. Or maybe I'm in the minority, and most people just don't care anymore, and are willing to risk it all so that life can "return to normal."

My son is ten years old, so I don't have the option of getting him vaccinated. Since he's in elementary school, no other child has that option. So my options as a responsible parent are to "homeschool" by paying for some

remote learning that my son will hate, or pull my son out of the school he has been at his whole life and send him to another school with mask mandates to navigate a new school, new friends, and new teachers.

I cannot begin to express the level of anxiety, anger and sheer bewilderment that I feel daily. I have expressed all of my concerns to the district superintendent and the principal on a few occasions just in the past week alone. I know I am not the only one. The district is not willing to risk their funding, at least not at this time. Knowing that they will have the support of local County officials may change that. I have never felt so powerless as a parent to be able to protect my child, and I have never been so ashamed of some of our elected officials' statements, actions, and lack of action.

You all have the numbers available to you. Imagine you were just looking at the data, there was no anti mask mandate, but you did have health care providers and associations to guide you regarding the increased transmissibility of the delta variant. Would you vote to pass a mask mandate in schools to help prevent disruptions from learning? To help teachers do their job in the classroom? To protect the kids who can't get vaccinated? If you would, then you should. Any law that affects the public's health that doesn't allow for local adjustments given more information or changes in the situation should be struck down. As a Pima County resident, taxpayer, and parent, I am strongly in favor of the County voting for a mask mandate in schools when local transmission is high and/or hospitalizations are nearing/at capacity. I am in favor of the County adding their resources to challenge the law so that more districts will feel comfortable following suit.

We have entered a new and challenging phase related to the apread of COVID. Consistent with our stated examitment, and in compliance with state law, the district inside mask wearing optional. Those obcosing to wear masks varies by canony participation of the state of the state

Since we resumed in-person instruction has week, there have been:

- \* 78 on-campus, confirmed cases of COVID
- 31 confirmed cases among students who did not come to school.

3 understand COVID fatigue. I personally do not like wearing a mask any more than you or your students do, but in order to slow the transmission of COVID on our companies. I am again calling on our staff, students, and you, our families, to partoer with us by voluntarily agreeing to mask up while indicate on our companies. Public health officials are clear on what the two best tritignition strategies are to stem this new tide of COVID transmissions: 1) vaccination and 2) wearing a mask. 

## Pima County COVID-19 cases by MMWR










# COVID-19 Cases by Day with 7 Day Rolling Average from





## Pima County COVID-19 deaths by MMWR Week




# Pima County COVID-19 cases that are hospitalized by MMWR



# PCHD Weekly Percent (%) of COVID-Like-Illness (CLI) Visits VS Pneumonia (PNA) Visits by MMWR



1. Insubstantial: A CDC-funded review on masking in May 2020 came to the conclusion: "Although mechanistic studies support the potential effect of hand hygiene or face masks, evidence from 14 randomized controlled trials of these measures did not support a substantial effect on transmission of laboratory-confirmed influenza... None of the household studies reported a significant reduction in secondary laboratory-confirmed influenza virus infections in the face mask group." 2. Unreasonable: "Evidence that masking as a source [of] control results in any material reduction in transmission was scant, anecdotal, and, in the overall, lacking... Dear Supervisors,

I write in follow-up to my previous message in which I asked you to impose a mask mandate. I am concerned at the lack of action by the Catalina Foothills School District, and most districts in Tucson, to impose the mitigation measures that have been shown to help protect our community and our students from the spread of Covid-19.

School has been back in session for a week. That's five days in which my child has attended 7 classes each day (8 on Wednesday), plus lunch. Five hours (give or take) of PE and band; 35 hours around other students and teachers, many of whom are not masked. In multiple classes, she is well within 3 feet (let alone 6) of unmasked classmates. In some classes, the teachers are unmasked, despite their repeated contacts with unvaccinated students throughout the school day. Each day, she bears the looks of those who are not masked and comes home and changes her clothes and showers immediately, just as her father does when he returns from his medical clinic. The difference? His cancer patients <u>need</u> his services and he has made a promise to them to take these kinds of risks. My 13-year-old, and her unvaccinated 10-year-old brother, have not. In the event that any of us contract the virus, we will likely have spread it within the household and, no doubt, to others as well, all without intention or knowledge. Short of us not interacting as a family or having to choose homeschooling when we believe strongly in the social value of education, CFSD and our other community schools are putting us in an untenable position of knowing that we are not doing everything that we can be doing to prevent the spread, because our older child spends her day sitting next to students who are unmasked (and perhaps unvaccinated).

I understand that the County didn't want to take a position contrary to the Governor and Legislature. I can understand that academically, if not personally. And while I hope that you will pass the resolution to support districts that take a stand, there are still other actions to be taken that would not necessitate such a position. Doing nothing risks not only the health of my family, but the health of our community. And with so many other districts and schools being willing to take a stand, it is disheartening that CFSD is not and that the County has not given the District any support in that regard. I hope it will not take having to quarantine classes and close schools, and the attendant impact that will have on our business community, not to mention our health care providers, for the County to take action. I fear it will.

I haven't seen any reason that the County has not encouraged all schools to facilitate social distancing or provide a distance learning option to those who require or request it, nor do I understand the inaction. (We have hundreds of students in the county who are quarantined. If we are truly concerned about their educations, why aren't they provided a method by which to learn while they are asymptomatic?) Likewise, testing and hand-washing should already be in place. If parents don't want to require masking, and I assume that's why the County did not enact a mandate, then students (and their families) should regularly be tested for COVID. We cannot rely on identifying the symptomatic students in order to contain this virus, and certainly not with the Delta variant.

We've been rather lucky so far, but the numbers are increasing exponentially. Again. Don't we want our children to learn from history?

Please don't wait any longer. Please take immediate steps to protect our students, their families, and our community as a whole.

Last year my preschooler skipped out on school and my oldest attended first grade virtually until April when the emotional toll because too much and it was clear she needed to be in person. We felt comfortable making that decision because schools were doing a great job of keeping kids safe. This school year we knew in person was the best option for our girls emotional well being but it is terrifying everyday sending them to school. The staff at my preschoolers school made the decision to all wear masks to help kids safe which I am so appreciative of. My children cannot be vaccinated due to their young ages (11 and 8). At present, in CFSD, there are no remote learning options and no ability for students to maintain social distancing. The only thing they can do to protect themselves is wear masks. Unfortunately, if other students or staff do not wear masks, they remain at unnecessary risk. A mask optional policy is akin to having a "no peeing" section of the pool. Everyone in the pool is affected, even those in the "no pee" zone.

Most children who get COVID will be OK. However, quarantining for illness or exposure has a detrimental impact on learning. It also strains families, preventing parents from working when their children are required to stay home. My wife is a psychiatrist at the VA. If she is forced to stay home while our children are ill or in quarantine, she will need to cancel patients, placing additional burdens on an already strained healthcare system. More concerningly, she could pick up COVID from our children and pass it on to her oftentimes frail and vulnerable patients. Or, in a worst case scenario, a child becomes seriously ill or dies. Dear Pima County Board of Supervisors:

County boards are widely recognized as the principal democratic body capable of representing its citizens in decisions of distinctly local importance. In most years, this decision-making is fairly benign, but on occasion situations arise that require boards to take uncomfortable but necessary steps. I am writing today to urge you take one of those uncomfortable but necessary steps by implementing a universal mask mandate, in all county schools, in order to protect the children and families of this district.

Throughout American public health history, masks and social distancing have been used to prevent the wider spread of everything from Tuberculosis to Ebola. A mask must be worn by both the carrier of the illness, as well as persons in the carrier's vicinity, in order for the protection afforded by a mask to be effective. This well-settled science is echoed in public school guidance issued by many leading health and child-focused professional organizations (e.g., American Academy of Pediatrics<sup>1</sup>, the CDC<sup>2</sup>, the Pima County Health Department<sup>3</sup>, and U.S. Department of Education<sup>4</sup>) this school year.

The American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) was among the first respected medical organizations to study and report on the effects of remote-learning during the pandemic. It was also among the first to study and report on mitigation measures that were found to effectively mitigate the spread of the original SARS-CoV-2 virus in public schools. Last year, citing the AAP, many local schools reliably implemented the leading two mitigation strategies-- social distancing (via decompressed classrooms/hybrid learning) and universal masking—and by all accounts these methods enabled students to return to school quicker and remain in school during the 2020-2021 school year.

While we all had hoped that the downward trend in cases heralded by the availability of vaccines would continue, the advent of the highly contagious Delta variant has changed the playing field entirely. Instead of starting the school year with fewer cases, we are starting it with a local spread that, last year, would have required hybrid learning. Instead of starting the year free from fears of contracting COVID-19 by virtue of having been inoculated by a vaccine, we are starting with a variant that is an equal opportunist among the vaccinated and those who are not. Instead of starting with local control of school health mitigation measures, we are starting with political grandstanding and a usurpation of the local public health control power.

Despite all of this, our children still need us to do what is right and that is implement what worked last school year. Will you do it? Will you stand for our kids? Will you prevent the

I want to raise my objection to the mandatory mask/vaccine mandate that you are considering.

First, as a follower of Jesus Christ, I object to any product that used aborted fetal tissue in the development process which the new vaccines have done.

I understand and appreciate your desire to solve problems. You were elected to do so but I caution you to carefully consider this mandate before your vote.

My first question is **why would you mandate a vaccine for a virus that has a 99+% recovery rate if you were to even get the virus?** Flu vaccines are not mandated when they have an equally high rate of recovery. The new delta variant has shown that while it is more easily transmitted, it is less deadly. This is common for viruses as they mutate.

You may know that these vaccines were expediated through the FDA approval process in a program called Operation Warp Speed. The average time for a vaccine to go through the entire approval process is 8-10 years and these were administered to the public in around a year. Do you believe that these new vaccines can be safe and effective when they achieved emergency use authorization in 10-20% of the time of a normal vaccine. Either the normal time frame for vaccine approval is unnecessarily long or these new vaccines have been put out long before patient safety can be assured.

If you are going to mandate medical treatment, which you are doing if you mandate masks and vaccines, you must adhere to the Hippocratic oath, that is, "**First do no harm**". Let me repeat that, "First do no harm". It doesn't matter if you think doing this will lessen sickness or save lives, if there is a risk of harm in getting the vaccine, you should not approve it.

What is the risk in getting these vaccines? Anyone who says that there is no risk is not being honest. You may know of the governmental self-reporting site VAERS and there are thousands of adverse effects reported by people following getting these vaccines. These range from relatively minor things like soreness at the injection site, fatigue, headache on to more severe things like myocarditis (inflammation of the heart), blot clots, auto-immune problems, Gullain Barre syndrome and death. Are all these caused by the vaccine? It is impossible to know exactly but there are certainly a lot of symptoms supposedly healthy people get following their vaccination. Please, before you vote, you owe it to yourself to go to the VAERS website and look at the adverse effects reported. It will open your eyes.

In the health care world, there is a requirement called **informed consent**. This is used for surgical procedures, root canals and even chiropractic spinal adjustments whereby a patient is informed of the potential risks involved with the procedure that has been recommended. Some people sign it without reading. Others read it and decide that the benefits of the procedure outweigh the risks. Still others decide that the risk of adverse effects outweigh the potential benefits of the procedure and decline to undergo the procedure. There is no informed consent for people mandated to get a vaccine so they are unable to evaluate the risks vs benefit of getting the shot.

If you mandate that all county employees and licensed health care workers get the vaccine without their informed consent and, God forbid, something catastrophic happens, you are responsible. You may not suffer legally but, those people (and their families) suffering is on you!

My name is Randi Levin. I am an **Experimentation** mother of 2 students in the Catalina Foothills School District (4th grader at Sunrise, 8th grader at OGMS). I'm also part of the MaskUpCFSD group that met with Rex Scott on Friday.

I wanted to write to say that I fully echo and support the other parents who are contacting you about the need for masks in schools.

Dear Scottsdale Unified School District Parent Community Partners:

We have entered a new and challenging phase related to the spread of COVID. Consistent with our stated commitment, and in compliance with state law, the district made mask wearing optional. Those choosing to wear masks varies by campus. In some places, there were almost no masks on the first day of school and in others, as many as 70-80% chose to wear them. I recognize that the question of masks has been politicized and is polarizing for our community. However, what we are seeing in the <u>larger community</u> and, more specifically, in our school buildings threatens to disrupt our ability to continue providing in-person instruction unless we take more aggressive steps to mitigate the spread of the virus.

Since we resumed in-person instruction last week, there have been:

- 78 on-campus, confirmed cases of COVID
- 31 confirmed cases among students who did not come to school
- 150 symptomatic students sent home
- 632 students quarantined as close contacts, in compliance with orders of the Maricopa-County Department of Public Health.

We know that providing in-person teaching and learning apportunities is critical for our students, and you have told us that is your preference. At the same time, our ability to do so is predicated on controlling the spread of COVID on our compuses. Last year, we saw very few cases of on-campus spread, due in large part to mitigation strategies that included wearing masks and a different strain of the COVID vins. In just the first 7 days of tibis new school year, outbreaks have already been identified at 5 schools and there is more evidence of on-campus transmission than we saw <u>all affust year</u>. This trend, if not disrupted, will invariably require not only quarantining even larger numbers of students, but potentially require us to also close elasstooms or buildings for significant periods of time and return to virtual learning. Some of our acigliboring distriets have already had to do this.

I understand COVID fatigue. I personally do not like wearing a mask any more than you or your students do, but in order to slow the transmission of COVID on our eampuses, I am again calling on our staff, students, and you, our families, to partner with us by voluntarily agreeing to mask up while indoors on our campuses. Public health officials are clear on what the two best mitigation strategies are to stem this new tide of COVID transmissions: 1) vaccination and 2) wearing a mask. COVID does not discriminate based on partisan politics, and it is circulating more rapidly now than ever among our school-aged youth. As a district committed to minimizing the chances of transmission to nearly 22,400 students learning in-person every day, we respectfully ask that you join us in that effort.
