Re: **Agenda Item #18: Facilities Management.**

This agenda item is extending the contract with **Catholic Community Services of SO AZ, Inc.** to 3/6/2025 to provide services at **the Drexel facility** to the illegal border crossers.

This is only one of many agenda items concerning your use of my tax dollars to encourage more people to come to the U.S. in violation of federal law. How is it not a crime, and a violation of your oath of office, to incentivize illegal behavior?

Why is public money being used to pay a sectarian organization? County money is not paid to Catholic schools, which educate our children. Why isn't Catholic Community Services supported by the Catholic church? Is this not unconstitutional?

Why are illegal border crossers the county's concern? Previously, immigrants were expected to pay their own way. Many arrived with virtually nothing, but were quickly able to find work.

While illegals are encouraged, the environment of our county, which IS your responsibility, gets worse and worse. Roads are in poor repair, and public spaces are deteriorating and unsafe. Shopping is inconvenient (e.g., no shopping carts available), prices are up because of shoplifting, stores are closing, trash is everywhere, and violent and property crimes are up. Criminals are not being held accountable. Public health is threatened by filthy conditions and large numbers of unscreened entrants who may be carrying tuberculosis and other contagious diseases.

Pima County can expect a downward spiral as businesses and productive people do not want to move to a chaotic, impoverished, and dangerous area. A short drive around the county is enough to convince prospective employers and taxpayers to look elsewhere.
