
To Whom It May Concern:

Dear Sirs,

I am writing this letter to express my opposition to the rezoning of the Sumter Drive plan, P16CA00002, by the Wong Family LP.

My reasons for being against the plan are twofold. First, the area around the plan is already saturated with medium-low intensity housing. The roads, infrastructure, drainage, public safety and public school facilities are already overwhelmed. The roads are unsafe to drive on with numerous potholes and the shoulder crumbling away. More ~~med~~ low intensity housing will only make this worse. The traffic on Shannon is very dangerous with the extra traffic from the nearby Ironwood Ridge High School.

Secondly, the housing on the north side of Sumter is low intensity housing. It makes more sense to keep both sides of Sumter the (over)

Same type of zoning to blend in with the existing housing. By doing so, more of the natural desert landscape is likely to remain with low density housing. In the 300' notification area we already have hundreds of homes packed into subdivisions with no natural desert remaining. I live in one of these subdivisions on the east side of Shannon. Sumter drive should remain low intensity zoning.

I would invite the Board of Supervisors to come look at Thornydale and Shannon roads around 4:30 P.M. on any weekday and see what a mess these roads are already. We don't need any more medium-low housing in this area.
