Project Title/Description:

Sexually Transmitted Disease Services

Purpose:

The Arizona Department of Health Services (ADHS) and the Pima County Health Department (PCHD) entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement for a five year term, beginning January 1, 2014 for STD prevention and control in Pima County.

The purpose of Amendment 2 is to add an objective to the initial contract and to revise the scope of services to include the collaboration between PCHD, ADHS and the contracted health care provider at the Pima County Juvenile Detention Center related to screening at risk detained youth for chlamydia and gonorrhea infections.

Program Goals/Predicted Outcomes:

Decrease the prevalence and potential to transmit STD infection in the community through proper screening, timely treatment, and increased education of our most at-risk population: adolescents and young adults.

Public Benefit:

The Health Department has a statutory obligation to investigate infectious or contagious disease and adopt measures to prevent the spread of disease as referenced in ARS 36-624.

Metrics Available to Measure Performance:

Screen 85% of all adolescents 17 years of age or less who are detained in the Pima County Juvenile Detention Center for chlamydia and gonorrhea.

SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED DISEASE SERVICES

Effective upon signature, it is mutually agreed that the referenced Agreement is amended as follows:

1. Pursuant to the Terms and Conditions Provision Six (6) Contract Changes, Section 6.1 Amendments, Purchase Orders and Change Orders, the Scope of Services Provision One (1) Background is revised to add the following:

1.4 Gonorrhea and chlamydia infections are considered major causes of pelvic inflammatory disease (PID), ectopic pregnancy and related infertility among women in Arizona and in the United States. In 2013, there were a total of 30,923 cases of chlamydia, and 6,503 cases of gonorrhea in Arizona. Roughly 49% of the chlamydia cases and 27% of the gonorrhea cases were among females under 25 years of age. The Arizona Department of Health Services (ADHS) Sexually Transmitted Disease Control Program (STDCP) is charged with meeting several outcomes for the new five (5) year Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA). One of the requirements of this grant is to provide assistance of at least 13.5% of the overall award amount to non-profit organizations that have demonstrated their ability to provide safety net STD clinical preventive services. This assistance could be used to screen and treat women and their partners for CT and GC to prevent infertility.

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It is most important to recognize that the vast majority (70-90%) of chlamydial infections in women are asymptomatic as are a substantial proportion (at least 50%) in men. These infections remain undetected and untreated unless providers screen at-risk women and men. A recent study has shown that if the prevalence of chlamydia is at least 3% in a given population of women, (e.g., women younger than twenty-five (25) years), then annual screening of this group of women is cost-effective. Prevalence monitoring surveillance has indicated that women, less than twenty-five (25) years of age, screened for chlamydia in family planning settings and other high risk settings such as correctional facilities have a prevalence greater than 3%. More specifically, current juvenile detention centers within the STDCP have positivity rates between 18-20%. The primary purpose of this project is to screen and treat women at high risk, seventeen (17) years of age or less, while also working to reduce racial/ethnic disparities in gonorrhea and chlamydia. Collaboration with Pima County's contracted health care provider to screen youth in the Pima County Juvenile Detention Center (PCJDC) will facilitate meeting the outcomes and objectives of this grant.

2. The Scope of Services Provision Two (2) Objective is revised to include the following:
 - 2.2 Decrease the prevalence and potential to transmit STD infections in the community through proper screening, timely treatment, and increased education of our most at-risk population: adolescents and young adults.
3. The Scope of Services Provision Three (3) is revised to include the services related to the STD infections, as identified in the Amendment Attachment A, incorporated herein.
4. The Agreement Price Sheet is revised and replaced with the Price Sheet of this Amendment number Two (2).



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ATTACHMENT A

1. SCOPE OF WORK

Collaborate with Pima County's contracted health care provider to screen, treat and educate all adolescents presenting at Pima County Juvenile Detention Center (PCJDC) who are thirteen to seventeen (13 to 17) years of age of chlamydia and gonorrhea infection.

2. TASKS

The Pima County Health Department, in collaboration with the health care provider at PCJDC shall:

- 2.1. Test all male and female inmates, thirteen to seventeen (13 to 17) years of age at the PCJDC for chlamydia and gonorrhea using a combo CT/GC test supplied by the STDCP ADHS' contracted laboratory;
- 2.2. Provide treatment or referral for treatment to clients testing positive for chlamydia and/or gonorrhea;
- 2.3. Provide appropriate client-level counseling and education strategies used to prevent and control chlamydia and gonorrhea including:
 - 2.3.1. The importance of partner referral and treatment,
 - 2.3.2. The impact of untreated and repeat infections on future fertility,
 - 2.3.3. Comprehensive STD prevention messages, and
 - 2.3.4. Risk-reduction strategies, such as abstinence, monogamy (i.e. being faithful to a single sexual partner), reduction of the number of partners, or using condoms consistently and correctly;
- 2.4. Provide the following data elements on all specimens submitted to the ADHS' contracted laboratory;
 - 2.4.1. Patient First and Last name;
 - 2.4.2. Patient home zip code;
 - 2.4.3. Patient gender;
 - 2.4.4. Date of birth;
 - 2.4.5. Age;
 - 2.4.6. Patient race;
 - 2.4.7. Patient ethnicity;
 - 2.4.8. Reason for test and screening;
 - 2.4.9. Provider First and Last name;
 - 2.4.10. Provider Address;
 - 2.4.11. Provider zip code;
 - 2.4.12. Provider phone; and
 - 2.4.13. Specimen collection date.
- 2.5. Ensure proper reporting of diagnosis and treatment to the ADHS STDCP through the use of PRISM;

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- 2.6. Adhere to all laboratory instructions/guidelines for laboratory testing requisitions, specimen preparation, specimen shipping, ordering of supplies, shipping, and monitoring of test results.
- 2.7. Provide agency contact name, phone number, and e-mail address.

4. STATE PROVIDED ITEMS

- 4.1. Laboratory processing services for chlamydia and/or gonorrhea (including collection kits and shipping) for screening for eligible clients through the STDCP contracted laboratory;
- 4.2. Consultation on Project guidelines;
- 4.3. Consultation on STD testing, diagnosis, treatment and partner services issues;
- 4.4. Training on laboratory procedures and online user interface;
- 4.5. Designated contacts for handling laboratory-related problems; and
- 4.6. Report on status of Project.

5. APPROVALS

Reports shall be submitted to the ADHS STDCP Manager for approval.

6. DELIVERABLES

- 6.1. Pima County Health Department shall provide a year-end report for the calendar year to the STDCP Chlamydia Surveillance Epidemiologist before **February 28th** of each year.
- 6.2. The report shall include the total number of all patients, thirteen to seventeen (13 to 17) years of age (unduplicated), seen at the PCJDC health clinic for services.
- 6.3. Aggregated data for each of the following data elements shall be included in the report:
 - 6.3.1. Total by Gender;
 - 6.3.2. Total by Age; and
 - 6.3.3. Total not reimbursed by insurance or other source.

7. ACCEPTANCE

Acceptance is signified by signature of the ADHS STDCP on the CER showing performance is satisfactory for payment.
