Title: Pima County Workforce Investment Board - Member Reappointment

Introduction/Background:

The Pima County Workforce Investment Board (WIB) serves as the County's Local Workforce Development Board as authorized by the US Department of Labor and as designated by the Governor of Arizona to carry out the functions of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act in Pima County. The WIB provides recommendations on local workforce policy and oversight of the local workforce development system that connects eligible Adults, Dislocated Workers, and Youth to local growth in-demand industries. WIB members are appointed by the Board of Supervisors and represent business, workforce, community-based organizations, and mandated partners under the act.

Discussion:

The following individuals continue to be in good standing and seek reappointment to serve another three-year term. If approved by the Board of Supervisors, their terms would expire September 30, 2026.
