The fact that Heinz is using this bill to argue for funding is wrong in several ways. First, it has nothing to do with SNAP benefits ending in November of 2025. It was passed in July, and nothing changed but the rules -- if people were not going to get benefits it would have happened in August. Second, it shows a clear lack of understanding of the Continuing Resolution that needs to be passed by the US Senate to fund the SNAP program and pay federal employees (60 senators must vote for it to pass -- it is the only issue holding up federal funding). Third, it is unnecessary divisive political rhetoric, and a perfect example of the which is intended to drive a wedge into communities and prevent them from coming together to help each other. Finally, isn't it interesting that there is plenty of money now, but when we are talking about affordable housing we have to have a tax increase?"
