FUNDING AGREEMENT BETWEEN

PIMA ANIMAL CARE CENTER AND FRIENDS OF PIMA ANIMAL CARE CENTER FOR ONE PROVISIONAL VETERINARIAN POSITION

1. Parties and Purpose.

- 1.1. <u>Parties</u>. This Funding Agreement ("Agreement") is between Pima County, a body politic and corporate of the State of Arizona (the "County"), on behalf of Pima Animal Care Center ("PACC"), and Friends of Pima Animal Care Center ("Friends of PACC"), an Arizona nonprofit corporation; collectively, "the Parties."
- 1.2. <u>Purpose</u>. PACC currently employs a staff of veterinarians. Friends of PACC currently funds one of the veterinary staff positions at PACC. Friends of PACC wishes to enter into an Agreement to provide funding for one provisional full-time veterinarian position at PACC. If one of the existing veterinarian positions becomes vacant, the provisional veterinarian will fill that open position.
- 1.3. <u>Authority</u>. The County is authorized to enter into this Agreement pursuant to A.R.S. § 11-251(62).

2. Term.

- 2.1. <u>Initial Term</u>. The term of this Agreement for funding is for a one-year period that commences on July 1, 2023 and will terminate on June 30, 2024 ("Initial Term"). "Term," when used in this Agreement, means the Initial Term plus and exercised extension options under Section 2.2. If the commencement date of the Initial Term is before the signature date of the last party to execute this Agreement, the Parties will, for all purposes, deem the Agreement to have been in effect as of the commencement date.
- 2.2 Extension Options. The County may renew this Agreement for up to three (3) additional periods of up to one year each (each an "Extension Option"). An Extension Option will be effective only upon execution by the Parties of a formal written amendment.
- 3. **Scope of Work**. The County and Friends of PACC agree upon the Scope of Work as described in **Exhibit A** (1 Page), at the dates and times described in **Exhibit A**, or, if **Exhibit A** contains no dates or time frames, then upon agreement by the Parties.
- 3.1. <u>Personnel</u>. Friends of PACC will be consulted on the hiring and date of hire for the one provisional veterinarian position. Friends of PACC will be consulted when existing PACC veterinarian positions become vacant. The provisional veterinarian

must hold a current Arizona license to practice veterinary medicine (per A.R.S. 32-2215 et seq) and a current Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) license for the prescription and administration of controlled substances is required at the time of appointment and must be maintained as a condition of employment. A valid driver's license is required at the time of application. A valid Arizona driver's license and access to a registered/insured vehicle for business travel is required (business mileage reimbursed) at time of appointment.

4. Financing.

- 4.1. <u>Payment</u>. Friends of PACC will commit to funding for one provisional full-time veterinarian position (including benefits) for a maximum of \$150,000 for the term of the Agreement in the event that all current veterinarian positions are filled. Friends of PACC agrees to reimburse the County for the employment costs (salary and employee-related expenses) for one provisional Veterinarian (Pima County Classification 7203 Veterinarian Unclassified).
- 4.2 <u>Invoices</u>. Within 30 days of the end of each quarter, the County will submit a detailed invoice to Friends of PACC for the total of all costs related to the personnel referenced herein and paid by PACC during that quarter period. The Parties understand that the County issues paychecks every two weeks and the payday falls on the Friday after the close of a pay period. Invoices will be billed to Friends of PACC based on pay period end-dates. Within thirty (30) days of receipt of an invoice from County, Friends of PACC will remit to the County the amount due.

5. Reporting.

- 5.1 <u>Semi-annual Reporting.</u> PACC will submit semi-annual reports of all activities of the provisional veterinarian personnel supported by this Agreement. The reports are due on October 31 and April 30. Reports will include the following:
- Number of animals examined by the provisional veterinarian over the previous six (6) months.
- Number of surgeries performed by the provisional veterinarian over the previous six (6) months.
- Number of foster appointments over the previous six (6) months.
- Number of pets saved (live outcomes) during each month over the previous six (6) months.
- Summary for each period of any notable activities, challenges, or outcomes.
- 6. **Notice**. Any notice required or permitted to be given under this Agreement must be in writing and be served by personal delivery or by certified mail upon the other party, as follows:

7. Laws and Regulations.

- 7.1 <u>Compliance with Laws</u>. The County will comply with all federal, state, and local laws, rules, regulations, standards, and Executive Orders in carrying out the Activities under this Agreement.
- 7.2 <u>Choice of Law; Venue</u>. The laws and regulations of the State of Arizona govern the rights and obligations of the Parties under this Agreement. Any action relating to this Agreement must be filed and maintained in the appropriate court of the State of Arizona in Pima County.
- 8. **Conflict of Interest.** This Agreement is subject to cancellation for conflict of interest pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-511, the pertinent provisions of which are incorporated into this Agreement by reference.

9. **Non-Discrimination**. Friends of PACC will comply with all provisions and requirements of Arizona Executive Order 2009-09, which is hereby incorporated by reference into this Agreement, including flow-down of all provisions and requirements to any subcontractors. During the performance of this Agreement, Friends of PACC will not discriminate against any employee, client, or any other individual in any way because of that person's age, race, creed, color, religion, sex, disability, or national origin.

EXHIBIT A (1 Page) SCOPE OF WORK 7203 – VETERINARIAN UNCLASSIFIED (STAFF VETERINARIAN) FOR PIMA ANIMAL CARE CENTER

Position Description

This position, with rotating days (PACC is open 7 days a week) and shifts (6:00 am to 2:00 pm; 1:00 am to 7:00 pm; 1:00 pm to 9:00 pm), is located in the Pima Animal Care Center and includes weekends, evenings, and early mornings with rotating shifts.

Duties/Responsibilities

Work assignments may vary depending on the department's needs and will be communicated to the applicant or incumbent by the supervisor.

- Performs daily observations and examinations of impounded animals.
- Provides requisite veterinary services necessary to diagnose animal health-related issues, develops appropriate therapy/treatment regimens, and administers first aid if necessary.
- Examines and assesses impounded and found animals that have bitten humans for symptoms
 of rabies.
- Documents the identification of rabies in impounded or found animals and assures proper notification of local/state health agencies, individuals who have been in contact with rabiesinfected animals and their physicians, healthcare, and public health agencies.
- Performs high-volume animal alteration surgeries.
- Assists in the training of staff on proper surgical procedures, animal evaluation, and monitoring for pre-/intra-/post-surgical signs and symptoms.
- Assists in the training of staff on preparation of sterile surgery packs, animals, and maintenance of sterile surgical fields.
- Assists in the control, security, record keeping and use of controlled drugs by staff in the PACC and ensures conformance with federal, state, and local laws, rules, and regulations to maintain the facility and personal Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) licenses and permits.
- Informs/advises/trains staff on animal care topics, which may include, but is not limited to, diagnosis, therapy and treatment of impounded animals, emergency veterinary techniques, husbandry, nutrition, preventive care, first aid, and control/containment/preventive measures for communicable diseases in an animal shelter environment.
- Trains/advises staff on principles and practices of animal restraint and chemical capture, detection, identification, and dispositions of animal welfare/cruelty cases.
- May testify in court as an expert witness relative to veterinary issues related to PACC operations.

Minimum Qualifications

Graduation from an accredited school of veterinary medicine with a doctoral degree in Veterinary Medicine (DVM) or (VDM) at the time of appointment.
