Re: Additional Information for the April 16, 2024 Board of Supervisors Meeting -

Addendum Item No.12 - Fiscal Year 2024/25 Recommended Budget Update

District 2 Supervisor Dr. Heinz requested additional historical background on the General Fund Impact of State Legislature Cost Shifts and Disclosure of these State Cost Shifts to Taxpayers Policy D 22.13. This policy was adopted by the Board on August 10, 2021.

Since the policy was adopted there have been numerous discussions regarding the implementation of this policy. At the end of this memo is the timeline detailing how this policy was implemented since its adoption with the various memos addressing the decisions surrounding its implementation.

In FY 2022, the County incurred \$5.613.303 in additional State Cost Shifts. Per the State Cost Shift Policy, the recommended tax rate for FY 2023 should have increased approximately \$0.0561. As part of the budget adoption process, a decision was made to not increase the tax rate to recoup these additional costs.

In FY 2023, the County incurred \$15,969,518 in additional State Cost Shifts. Per the State Cost Shift Policy, the recommended tax rate for FY 2024 should have increased to cover these additional costs. As part of the budget adoption process, the General Fund Primary tax rate was increased \$0.1502.

In FY 2024, the County incurred \$3,901,838 in additional State Cost Shifts. Per the State Cost Shift Policy, the recommended tax rate for FY 2025 should increase to cover these additional costs. As part of the budget adoption process, the General Fund Primary tax rate is proposed to increase \$0.0572.

However, it is possible the State may direct additional cost shifts to the various Counties to cover their projected \$1.3 billion short fall for FY 2024 and FY 2025 combined.
