YEAR 1 HIGHLIGHTS

- Served over **1,100** individuals from August 2023 to August 2024
- 65% reduction in rebookings within 1 month of release
 - Control group: 28% rearrested
 - TC participants: 10% average
- Avg. of 158 fewer bookings per month
 - \$80,000 in reduced booking fees, per month
- 99% used at least 1 service





Operations Highlights

Justice Navigators: 4 County, 1 City (and 2nd in recruitment)

Positive feedback from Tucson Police Department, businesses in the vicinity of jail (reports reduced loitering), and justice partners (judges referring from IAs)

Impacts: encampment assistance (getting warrants quashed to enable housing placement), family support and connection to services

Enhanced Virtual Services: serving as a virtual “one stop shop” to get information and resources regardless of where someone is at in the justice system

Priorities in Year 2



Sustainability / Funding



Expanding hours to weekends



Expanding emergency shelter options (especially in evening hours)



Enhanced data collection and outside evaluation
