Voting Centers disenfranchise all in-person voters but hurts minority and low-income voters the most. These groups often have limited transportation options, and less time or flexibility to vote. There are many problems with E-Pollbooks: they're connected to the internet, have no uniform standards and are easily hackable. E-Pollbooks have contributed to chaos in multiple states with their malfunctions, which has caused excessive delays, preventing people from voting. Voting Centers and E-Pollbooks separately or together equal the definition of Voter Suppression.
