I. SUMMARY OF THE PROPOSED ORDINANCE AMENDMENTS TO PIMA COUNTY CODE TITLE 17 (AIR QUALITY)

Pima County Department of Environmental Quality (PDEQ) is proposing amendments to Pima County Code Title 17 to update the composition of the Air Quality Hearing Board to conform to the Arizona Revised Statutes. PDEQ's intention in updating this rule is to amend the composition of the five members of the board to conform to the composition of the Air Quality Hearing Board as put forth in A.R.S. 49-478. This revision will not have an economic impact on businesses in Pima County, and will not impose additional costs on the regulated community, small businesses, political subdivisions, and members of the public beyond that already incurred by reason of federal or state rule or law. The costs of compliance for the hearing board have already occurred, and were considered when the state rule or law was proposed and adopted.

II. PUBLIC NOTICE

PDEQ published notice of the proposed ordinance amendments of PCC Title 17 on our website beginning March 27, 2015 (Attachment A). The Public Notices were published on March 27, 2015, in two local newspapers (Arizona Daily Star and the Territorial Newspaper) (Attachment A). In addition, PDEQ e-mailed a notice of the proposed ordinance amendments to interested parties who had requested rulemaking notifications in the past.

III. ARIZONA ADMINISTRATIVE REGISTER

Pursuant to A.R.S. 49.471.08 PDEQ filed a Notice of the Proposed Expedited Rulemaking with the Secretary of State for publication in the Arizona Administrative Register (A.A.R.) (Attachment B). The notice of a rulemaking Docket Opening and the Notice of Proposed Expedited Rulemaking were published on Friday, March 27, 2015 (Attachment C). The publication of the Notice of Proposed Expedited Rulemaking coincided with the Public Notice and allowed for thirty days (30-days) for PDEQ to accept public comment on the proposed ordinance.

IV. PUBLIC COMMENTS


During the 30 day public comment period PDEQ did not receive comments on the proposed amendments.

These requirements are not consistent with the requirements set forth in the Arizona Revised Statutes Discussion: The Pima County Department of Environmental Quality is requesting the Board of Supervisors to adopt the attached Ordinance No. 2015-_____ to amend Pima County Code Section 17.04.190 to update the composition of the Air Quality Hearing Board. This amendment is proposed to remove additional requirements for members that are not in the Arizona Revised Statutes (A.R.S. § 49-478). No studies were reviewed in reference to this rulemaking action. Conclusion: In an effort to achieve consistency and accuracy in Title 17 of the Pima County Code, Pima County Department of Environmental Quality (PDEQ) is requesting that this rule be amended to conform the composition of the Air Quality Hearing Board as put forth in A.R.S. § 49-478. Recommendation: Staff recommends the Board of Supervisors adopt Ordinance No. 2015-_ to amend Pima County Code Section 17.04.190, relating to the composition of the Air Quality Hearing Board. Fiscal Impact: This amendment will not have an economic impact on businesses in Pima County, and will not impose additional costs on the regulated community, small businesses, political subdivisions, and members of the public beyond that already incurred by reason of federal or state rule or law.
