Funding Purpose:

Approval of this contract amendment will allow for the no cost, one year extension of the provision of CDBG funding for the operation of the Flowing Wells Neighborhood Association and Community Coalition, including the provision of marketing, education materials, supplies, fairs, workshops and public meetings. The agency will continue to use funds appropriated in the original contract from the FY2013-2014 Pima County CDBG allocation.

Program Goals/Predicted Outcomes:

FWNACC program goal is to enhance community participation in neighborhood improvement activities, increase access to community resources, disseminate information on educational and employment opportunities, and advance communications within the neighborhood as part of a HUD approved Neighborhood Revitalization Strategy Area ("NRSA") Plan.

Public Benefit:

Residents of Flowing Wells will remain organized to effectively leverage resources for their community and the region. To date, FWNACC has been instrumental in attracting over \$25 million dollars in local, state and federal investment from various sources and has been recognized as an "All American City" for its efforts.

- Workshops and meetings conducted for NRSA residents related to neighborhood governance, enhancement, development, and improvement
- Monthly Flowing Wells Newsletters prepare, printed and distributed
- Grant applications prepared to obtain funding for the betterment of the neighborhood and pay any costs associated with the preparation and submission of such applications;
