Wastewater Surveillance for SARS-CoV-2 Mentorship Program

*Purpose:

To receive further technical guidance from national experts and an external health department mentor to guide PCHD in interpreting wastewater concentration levels and effectively communicating information to the public. We will also develop a wastewater surveillance data sharing communications strategy.

Amendment #1 extends the grant for one year in order to complete planned activities and submit invoices with documentation dated beyond the current period of performance.

*Procurement Method:

This Subrecipient Agreement is a non-Procurement contract and not subject to Procurement rules.

*Program Goals/Predicted Outcomes:

Develop a community engagement, communications strategy, and toolkit to share wastewater surveillance data in Pima County. This will be done through engagement with the Pima County Public Health Ethics Committee, stakeholders and two high priority populations (elderly/disabled and individuals impacted by the mpox outbreak). These groups will work together to identify benefits, risks, ethical considerations, and strategies in sharing wastewater data with the public for current and expanded wastewater surveillance capacity. PCHD is conducting epidemiology "with communities" and not "to communities", an approach that is in alignment with the CDC's guidance. Working with communities will help guide communications about community wastewater surveillance, a new tool in the epidemiology toolkit.

*Public Benefit:

Community members will be able to provide input on health department use of wastewater surveillance data, including messaging, appropriate interventions, and potential expansion of Pima County's wastewater surveillance efforts.

*Metrics Available to Measure Performance:

Data sharing and community messaging strategies using a dashboard or other community identified format, co-development of community interventions that will be used to create a final wastewater surveillance toolkit to address emerging community health issues.

*Retroactive:

Yes. The previous version of the grant ended on July 31, 2023. The final copy of this extension amendment arrived on August 31, 2023. If not accepted, we will lose the funding for this small but valuable project.

MODIFICATION OF AGREEMENT – ATTACHMENT I

SCOPE OF WORK

Justification for Modification: PCHD justification for the extension: Pima County Health Department (PCHD) requests to extend the NACCHO Wastewater Surveillance Grant to complete activities on our workplan, spend down funds, and submit invoices with documentation dated beyond the current period of performance. PCHD has been working diligently on the workplan components. Next week, we are vetting our COVID-19 wastewater data and proposed community public health response on our state health department's CoP call. We are making progress on our toolkit. Wastewater surveillance ethical considerations will be incorporated into the toolkit following our community forums that will be scheduled in the fall. We are so grateful to be a part of this collaboration and have benefitted from the monthly group meetings and individual data analytic meetings. We plan to present our county SARS-CoV-2 data demonstrating the relationship between SARS-CoV-2 wastewater concentrations and community illnesses. We owe our progress to working with our mentor. We are looking forward to using wastewater concentrations as another "tool" in our "epi toolkit" as we prospectively monitor COVID-19 and to contribute to ethical considerations involved with wastewater surveillance.

Grantee Scope of Work

March 15, 2023 - July 31, 2024

- Participate in a mentorship program kick-off call in April 7, 2023 and develop a short presentation to
 introduce your jurisdiction, share proposed activities, and anticipated outcomes. The call will introduce
 program contacts from National Association of County and City Health Officials (NACCHO), Centers for
 Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), mentor and mentee sites, and discuss program expectations
 and requirements.
- Complete a pre-assessment to establish a baseline for the status of wastewater surveillance in your jurisdiction (both mentors and mentees).
- Complete the deliverables outlined in the workplan by July 31, 2024.
- Participate in monthly check-in calls with NACCHO and the mentor and mentee sites. These calls are
 designed for mentorship program participants to share progress on the workplan, describe any
 challenges they may be facing, and to work with program staff to re-focus efforts as appropriate.
- Participate in an end-of-year webinar to share lessons learned.
- Submit final report (format to be determined by NACCHO) summarizing all activities conducted during
 the project, lessons learned, and any materials, including tools, standard operating procedures,
 sampling plans, etc. produced as a part of this project by July 31, 2024.
- Complete a post-assessment to determine successes, challenges, and lessons learned at the conclusion of program (*mentees only*).
