Re: Building Ownership - Collateral Pool

During the Board meeting on July 11, 2023, a question was raised regarding the ownership and maintenance of the Public Works Building.

In FY 2007/08, the County changed its capital projects funding strategy from using voter-authorized debt to Certificates of Participation (COPs). As part of this strategy shift, several buildings, including the Public Works building, were identified as collateral for the County's issuance of these COPs. This financial mechanism enables the County to utilize these assets as a collateral pool for COPs issuances, supporting various Board approved capital improvement projects.

To facilitate this arrangement, the County entered into a lease-purchase agreement with U.S. Bank Trust Company, National Association for the buildings included in the collateral pool. A critical aspect of this arrangement is ensuring that the replacement value of the collateralized properties surpasses or equals the amount of the outstanding COPs, which requires the County to maintain the building and equipment such as the heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) units. This criterion is diligently reviewed whenever considering additional debt issuances.

By utilizing these buildings as collateral, the County has successfully secured the necessary financing to undertake numerous Board approved capital improvement projects including \$150 million to help fund the 10-Year Road Repair and Preservation Program.
