Federal Government Shutdown and Program Impact

- Federal Government Shutdown started
 October 1st
- Most recent shutdown was 2018 / 2019 and lasted for 35 days
- Government Shutdown Scenarios for County Impact
 - Federal programs that rely on federal fiscal year first quarter funding

- Some government funded programming can use roll-over funds from previous fiscal years through shutdown period

State-pass through fund availability for programs

- Core functions of government retention during shutdown period; Workforce furloughs, reduction in force

- County programmatic impacts and withstanding an extended shutdown period

Medicaid Benefits:

Roughly 1/3 of Pima County residents are enrolled in AHCCCS

- Traditional Enrollment 66%, Prop 204 Expansion Group 26%, Affordable Care Act Expansion-4%. & ALTCS - 4%
- 37% of the AHCCCS enrollees in 2025 are children.
- Compared to the traditional Medicaid population the expansion populations are: 66% more likely to have received care associated with **mental**, **behavioral**, **or neurodevelopmental health**
- More than 1/3 of Medicaid enrollees have a diagnosis of mental, behavioral, or neurodevelopmental disorder



SNAP Benefits:

In FY 2023, US Census Bureau estimates that ~59,000 households are 'with cash public assistance of Food Stamps / SNAP' (13% of all Pima County households). On average 10.2% of Arizona households were food insecure between 2020 and 2022.



Work Requirements and Eligibility Verification

Reorganization of Federal Departments and Programs – Health and Human Services (affecting public health, mental health and substance use programming) and Department of Labor job training programs



Impacts todate from Shutdown Grant Portals

- JustGrants (DOJ) is <u>offline</u> no award actions until operations resume – potentially affecting grants for Justice Services, Courts, Pima County Attorney's Office, Public Defense Services and Pima County Sheriff's Department
- · Grants.gov open but reduced capacity
- DOT discretionary grant programs are expected to be paused / delayed
- EPA, USDA, HUD & Education are in varying states of suspension – administrative, permitting and discretionary grant actions are paused – potentially affecting grants for Community Workforce & Development, Department of Environmental Quality, Pima County Health Department

 Assessing risk of funds that anticipated start of federal fiscal year funding on October 1st – Women Infants & Children Programming (retained by both the House and Senate in Appropriations)

MAHA allocation \$20.6B which represents shifts from CDC, HRSA, and other HHS agencies – determining specific grant oversight; LIHEAP, CSBG retained. PHEP reduced.



Other Federal Impacts of Litigation

- Funds paused from Department of Homeland Security – annual grant award for Pima County Office of Emergency Management
- The County is reviewing litigation and conducting a risk assessment on other potential indirect or direct impacts to Pima County
- Currently there are 439 lawsuits tracked against the administration
- Lawsuit Status:
 - 195 are awaiting Court Ruling
 - 29 are Blocked
 - 83 are Temporarily Blocked
 - 10 are Temporarily Blocked, Temporary Block Denied in Part
 - 23 are Closed
 - 7 are Closed / Dismissed in Favor of Government
 - 2 Transferred



Grants Risk Assessment and Pima County General Fund Impact

- Pima County Administrator's Office, Pima County Finance & Risk Management, and Grants Management and Innovation are collectively working with Departments on Shutdown / Appropriations Risk Plan
- The County currently manages 212 grant awards with 77% of those directly federally funded or funded through a pass-through agency

As the government shutdown continues, we will update the BOS on any blocks to County funds, projects, or general fund impact

Upon completion of any Continuing Resolution or finalization of Appropriations, will provide the **net** impact on funds and programs
