U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS)/Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)/Emergency Food and Shelter Program (EFSP) National Board.

*Project Title/Description: Fiscal Agent Pima County / FEMA Emergency Food and Shelter to Families and Individuals encountered by The Department of Homeland Security (DHS)- Phase HR22.

*Purpose:

The Emergency Food and Shelter Program National Board (EFSP) has granted Pima County administrative flexibility to expend the \$5,216,146.91 balance remaining in its Phase HR22 subaward. Pima County will use this balance to cover monthly costs related to eligible EFSP-H activities aiding legally processed asylum seekers who have been processed and released by the Department of Homeland Security. The current average number of legally processed asylum seekers arriving in Pima County is 1,282 per day. The awarded \$5,216,146.91 will extend Pima County's humanitarian aid services to April 30, 2024.

*Procurement Method:

This Subrecipient Agreement is a non-Procurement contract and not subject to Procurement rules.

*Program Goals/Predicted Outcomes:

Provide legally processed asylum seekers with temporary shelter, food, and transportation supports to help them reach their identified U.S. destination. The intended outcome is that legally processed asylum seekers exit Pima County humanitarian aid services as quickly as possible.

*Public Benefit:

Safeguard the health and safety of Pima County by humanely and expeditiously facilitating the movement of asylum seekers, from the point of release by federal authorities in the community onward to their final destination.

*Metrics Available to Measure Performance:

Subrecipients Catholic Community Services of Southern Arizona and the City of Tucson—to bill timely and with sufficiently detailed backup to meet EFSP-H standards and federal grant requirements. Back up documentation, accurate data submission, and on time reporting will be required for subrecipients. Allowable costs will be outlined in budgets and correspond with the Emergency Food and Shelter Program National Board (EFSP) guidance.

See email below sent on January 19, 2024. This is our only written confirmation (so far) that the EFSP National Board voted to allow Pima County to spend its \$5.2 million balance of its EFSP-H Phase HR22 award (the former termination date was March 31, 2023).

You can also see below that United Way Worldwide (the fiscal agent for the EFSP National Board) added performance period terms for HR22—i.e., the \$5.2 million balance can only be expended from March 1, 2024 through April 30, 2024.

Hello Regina,

This is written notification of the decision made by the National Board for the Emergency Food and Shelter Program in response to the request received from Pima County, GMI seeking administrative flexibility to spend the \$5.2 million balance of the Fiscal Year 2022 (HR22) humanitarian funding in calendar year 2024.

After receiving the information from PIMA County GMI indicating need and the increase in the number of migrants requiring services once released by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) and the receipt of additional independent data provided by DHS to reflect the unusually high numbers of individuals being processed in the sector, the National Board agreed to allow Pima County, GMI the administrative flexibility to spend the HR22 balance in 2024. The National Board determined that the analytic process undertaken using data provided not only by Pima County but also by the Department of Homeland Security was defensible, proved the unique need, and could be used in the future if circumstances warrant.

The HR22 balance must be spent during a specific time frame that does not overlap with expenses that have been or will be paid with FY23 (CR23 and HR23) funds. The HR22 funds must be spent only during the months of March and April 2024, again, no FY23 funds can be used for expenses incurred during that period. Pima County GMI will need to be fully accountable to the National Board in documenting use of the funds with the completion and submission of the HR22 Final Report which is due June 14, 2024. With the administrative flexibility granted, the HR22 spending period for Pima County, GMI will be October 1, 2022 through March 31, 2023 plus March 1, 2024 through April 30, 2024. Remember that FY23 funds may only be used for expenses through February 29, 2024. While Pima County may spend HR22 funding in March and April of 2024, please remember that Final Reports for HR22, CR23 and HR23 must be filed separately, do not combine support documentation for the three awards. The administrative flexibility is granted only once, no additional adjustments will be allowed to spend the HR22 funding after April 30, 2024.

Thank you for your participation in the Emergency Food and Shelter Program and all that your agency and partners are doing to provide humanitarian services to individuals and families arriving in your communities each day.
