Grantor - Institute of Museum and Library Services Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) funds passed through the Arizona State Library.

***Project Title/Description:**

Library Outpost at the Pima County Juvenile Court Center (PCJCC)

***Purpose:**

The goal of this project is to transform library services at the Pima County Juvenile Court Center (PCJCC) by adopting a discovery-based Outpost model more appropriate to the changing needs and interests of high-risk adjudicated youth. Funds will be used to purchase display features, signage, and other materials needed to redesign the current library program space, improve brows-ability, and increase youth readership, as well as to support interest-driven activities facilitated by experts in residence (artist, reader, writer).

***Procurement Method:**

Not applicable to grant awards.

***Program Goals/Predicted Outcomes:**

This project is intended to transform the currently under-utilized library program into a dynamic, youth-tailored Library Outpost. Specifically, the project will a) bring greater visibility to available books; b) help youth more easily discover reading materials they seek; c) make youth more independent in the space and d) simplify reshelving to expedite turnaround of the collection and make it easier for youth to access materials recommended by their peers.

***Public Benefit:**

PCPL believes that the lasting impact will be seen in increased reading activity and book discussion, transitions to community library involvement, and improved educational and social outcomes among youth.

***Metrics Available to Measure Performance:**

Through the Outpost project, PCPL expects to be better prepared to quickly adapt the use of the collection in response to evolving needs and interests of youth. Project Outcome-based surveys will measure the success of the desired outcome for the new collection and the programming provided. PCPL will also implement an in-house use survey using barcode scanning to collect data related to browsing activity which can be used to inform future retention and purchasing decisions.



Community members, specifically youth in juvenile detention, will benefit because of the more youth-friendly collection design and more dynamic engagement activities provided.	
What will be the benefit to Pima County?	<p>PCPL staff receive consistent feedback that many youth report finishing their first book while in detention. Jessica Redhouse, who works closely with the program, explains, "We watch youth's interest in reading increase and grow over time. The program can produce inspiration for them and a positive outlook for their future."
