

In 2023, **36,037,177 pounds of food** were distributed, including **13,444,116 pounds of produce**

School Pantries and After School Snacks

School pantries provide easily accessible food assistance to students and their families.

We also provide healthy, filling Snacks for kids up to age 18 at community sites across Southern Arizona. Food is provided as part of the USDA's federal Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP). Super Snacks include ready-to-eat meal components such as fruits, vegetables, grains, dairy, and protein.









Pima County School Pantries

School pantries and markets provide easily accessible food assistance to students and their families.

26 PANTRIES

are open during the school year, in 9 districts: Tucson Unified, Sunnyside, Flowing Wells, Amphitheater, Marana, Baboquivari,

3,023 CHILDREN

received meals and snacks at youth programs after school including libraries

525,401 MEALS

served to 16,180 families and 31,717 children through the School Pantry Program, including 146,738 lbs. of fresh produce.




Caridad Community Kitchen 845 N. Main Avenue • Tucson, AZ 85705

Santa Cruz River Farmers' Market

Located in the Mercado MSA Annex (267 S. Avenida del Convento), our weekly, year-round market features:

- Fresh fruits and vegetables grown locally in Southern Arizona without chemical pesticides
- Double-Up SNAP food stamp matching program
- Cooking demonstrations and food samples
- Culturally relevant foods not available in grocery stores
- Community spaces to engage with growers and neighbors
