

Statement by Dr. Ned Norris Jr., Chairman of the Tohono O'odham Nation to the Pima County **Board of Supervisors**

On behalf of the Tohono O'odham Nation, I would like to express our full and unwavering support of Dr. Theresa Cullen.

Dr. Cullen has devoted her career to providing the very best medical care and health care access for Pima County residents, including tribal citizens of the Tohono O'odham Nation.

Dr. Cullen previously worked as a family practice physician for Indian Health Service (IHS) in Sells and San Xavier and from 1994 to 1999, she was the Clinical Director on the Tohono O'odham Nation for IHS.
