They offered the following comments:

- The Board was encouraged to include courthouse renovation in the package.
- The longer the delay, the more expensive the projects would be.
- Bonds would boost the economy and create jobs.
- The Tucson Symphony publicly expressed support.
- Concerns about the possibility of an increase in taxes were expressed.
- Benefits to tourism and the future of the community were reviewed.
- The bond package would help make the area more desirable and competitive.
- The package offered projects that varied widely in geographic area as well as community impact.
- Businesses supported the bond package, particularly the Sonoran Corridor and Oro Valley Incubator Accelerator projects.
- The bond package included economic development and other projects that would improve job creation and livability of the community.

Sandy Sjostrand objected to the proposed Nicotine/Tobacco-Free Healthy Workforce Initiative and expressed concern regarding discrimination.

Brian Bickel spoke in support of the proposed Nicotine/Tobacco-Free Healthy Workforce Initiative and encouraged the Board to investigate the fiduciary aspects of the initiative, not just the emotional.

Geri Ottoboni addressed the Board about property tax interest rates and spending.

# HUMAN RESOURCES

7. The Board of Supervisors on December 16, 2014, continued the following:

## Pima County Nicotine/Tobacco-Free Healthy Workforce Initiative

Staff recommends selection of one of the following options for Fiscal Year 2015/16:

- Option 1 Approval of the tobacco hiring policy requiring all job applicants to certify they have been nicotine/tobacco-free for the previous 12 months in order to be considered for employment, as well as a biweekly medical insurance surcharge of 30 percent of the Employee-only premium amount for tobacco users.
- Option 2 Approval of only the tobacco hiring policy.
- Option 3 Approval of only the tobacco surcharge.

At the request of Supervisor Valadez and with one objection by Supervisor Miller, this item was continued to the Board of Supervisors' Meeting of February 17, 2015.

## 8. Medical Insurance for County Employees - Fiscal Year 2015/16

Staff recommends approval of the medical rates for FY 15/16, along with the continuation of the current County Health Savings Account funding strategy and Healthy Lifestyle Premium Discounts.
