PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, domestic violence occurs in epidemic proportions across the U.S., affecting more than 6 million people each year; and

WHEREAS, October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month across the U.S., signified by the wearing of purple as a reminder that we must stop this dangerous and deadly epidemic; and

WHEREAS, domestic abuse causes untold trauma to children and adults and harms families physically, emotionally and economically; and

WHEREAS, what began as a grassroots movement in August 1975 with the Tucson Center for Women and Children has evolved into a survivor-centered organization dedicated to fostering healing, safety, and liberation for all, and celebrating its 50th anniversary this year; and

WHEREAS, in 2024, 5,345 individuals experiencing domestic abuse received services at Emerge, 12,782 emergency shelter bed nights were provided to families and wrap-around services were offered to victims, and 95% of participants shared that their safety improved after receiving services from Emerge; and

WHEREAS, in 2024, the Tucson Police Department and the Pima County Sheriff's Department received more than 16,000 domestic violence calls and documented over 7,500 incidents; and

WHEREAS, Emerge Center Against Domestic Abuse, Pima County and other partners are committed to a comprehensive response to end domestic violence in our community.

NOW, THEREFORE, **BE IT RESOLVED** that the Pima County Board of Supervisors hereby proclaims the month of October 2025 to be:

"DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AWARENESS MONTH"

and encourages our community to wear purple clothing or a purple ribbon to stand in solidarity with domestic abuse victims.
