Please read my comments into the official record.

To: Supervisors Scott, Heinz, Bronson, Christy, and Grijalva, and To the Clerk of the Board,

Roughly 626,000 Pima county residents voted in the 2020 election. While you consider all of the reasons why you should reduce voting locations by 57% and implement the use of Electronic Poll Books, please take into the consideration the following reasons to NOT REDUCE polling locations and implement ELECTRONIC POLL BOOKS.

1. Over 70% of conservatives (both Republican and Independents) believe the 2020 election was riddled with fraud and deception. VOTER CONFIDENCE and ELECTION INTEGRITY is a HUGE PROBLEM. You can fully anticipate these voting groups to not only show up to vote "in person" in record numbers but to be personally involved in the process, at every step! We will NOT let what happened in 2020 happen again! By reducing voting precincts and using electronic poll books and wireless printing devices, you are making it HARDER for Pima County voters and creating more, not less, distrust in the voting process. The ones disenfranchised the most, minority and low-income voters.

2. There are currently 37 election integrity bills being introduced at the State Legislature which will reduce technology, create higher security, improve Voter ID, better our voter roll maintenance, and create more scrutiny by officials and observers. These bills were introduced as a result of the REAL Election Integrity issues discovered during the Audit of Maricopa County in 2021. These are REAL issues and the voters of Pima County are fully engaged and paying attention. WE WANT LESS TECHNOLOGY and MORE SECURITY. By reducing voting precincts and implementing Electronic poll books and wireless printers, you are going against the People of the County you serve!

3. The number one voter integrity issue in Pima County (and the State of AZ overall) our voter rolls. The lack of maintenance and purging over the years has resulted in numerous issues for the potential of voter fraud. This was identified in the Maricopa Audit and was a major recommendation. Additionally, "True the Vote", an organization which was instrumental in ensuring election integrity in Virginia's recent election, has also indicated that AZ's voter rolls are fraught with the potential for fraud due to the lack of maintenance and

purging. HOW CAN YOU ALL IN GOOD CONSCIENCE implement the use of electronic poll books, wireless printers, and voting centers when you are starting with "DIRTY VOTER ROLLS"!!!!

4. The Pima County Administrator just hired a new Elections Director that we know nothing about, except her work history. I know, that should be sufficient. But, it's not.

Until more election integrity laws and oversight are implemented, YOU CAN NOT introduce more technology which a large majority of your voters don't trust. Reducing polling precincts and implementing electronic voting books/wireless printers only leads to VOTER SUPPRESSION. CLEAN UP OUR VOTER ROLLS FIRST!!!!!!

Now is the time for the Pima County Board of Supervisors to earn back the trust of the voters by ensuring our local voting precincts remain as they are and you do not change our paper poll books.

I am asking that you do not allow the District #3 addendum. Anyone watching the last meeting realizes there was confusion in what was being voted on, and these 2 items (using vote centers in place of polling places and awarding Tenex Software Solutions, LLC a contract) will only add to that confusion. **This addendum needs no consideration at this late date; it must be opposed.**

The people of Arizona have little trust in the voting process at this point. The only way to correct and uphold the integrity of our election process is to have an open, transparent process: manual counting, bipartisan poll watching and oversight, elimination of voting machine use and one day in person voting. Those who have physical disabilities and are not able to make it to their polling precinct and those serving overseas, of course, should be allowed voting access by requesting their ballot and voting by mail.
