Amendment Amount: N/A: Purpose of this amendment is to extend the term of the existing agreement. There is no increase in the original contract amount, which is \$484,289.00. The contract is to run for four years, with more youth being enrolled as the initial youth graduate out.

Term End Date: 05/31/16


Funding Source: A grant from the United States Department of Labor (DOL) Employment and Training Administration that was awarded to Pima County for Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) activities in Pima, Santa Cruz, Cochise and Yuma counties.

Purpose: Implementation of two-year programs in Cyber Security and Industrial Technology for 11th-grade students enrolled at Yuma and Kofa High Schools. The programs will be aligned to prepare students for Arizona Western College degree and certificate programs in Industrial Maintenance Technology, Welding, Computer Security and Computer Information Systems, and to address requirements for local information technology and manufacturing jobs and trends.

Program Goals/Predicted Outcomes: Provide training and support for 60 youth.

Public Benefit: Assist economic development efforts by helping to develop a trained and productive labor force that meets regional employers' needs.

Metrics available to Measure Performance: Quarterly progress reports of participants outcomes (e.g. Progress to date, challenges and successes encountered, corrective actions and success stories) as required by the Department of Labor.
