To whom it may concern:

We are writing on behalf of Shalom Mennonite Fellowship, a church located at 6044 E 30th St. We are requesting the restoration of the church's tax exemption, since we failed to file the annual claim for tax exemption earlier this year, due to an oversight.

The property in question consists of two parcels: book 131, map 12, parcels 028A and 0260. Parcel 028A was purchased on March 22, 1974. The adjoining parcel 0260 was purchased on September 30, 1997.

Shalom Mennonite Fellowship has used this property since 1974 for its religious services and related activities. We have a weekly worship service and education hour, with an average attendance of approximately 70. We also have a Friday morning prayer service, a monthly mid-week potluck meal, monthly Sunday noon potlucks and a variety of irregularly scheduled meetings for various church activities. The church has been active in supporting events of the regional and national Mennonite church (border educational activities, peace promotion meetings, environmental consciousness, etc.)

Since 1982, Community Home Repair Projects of Arizona (CHRPA) has located its facilities on a portion of our property. There are also two housing units located on our property. One of them has been used for many years as housing for Mennonite Voluntary Service (MVS) unit volunteers. This past summer, the MVS house became empty, so we are currently using it to provide housing for a family of refugees from the Congo, charging only minimal rent to assure that costs are covered for this short-term mission. Shalom has used the other housing unit for a variety of ministry activities over the years, for instance, as a peace center, a place to receive church guests, a "Girls with tools" club, storage and Sunday School space.

The property includes a community garden. In the past, the church has also hosted a neighborhood bicycle club on the property.

For the past 9+ years, we have rented the worship space to Church of God a Worldwide Association (COG-WA) congregation for their weekly services.

Based on all the above, we are requesting restoration of our church's tax exemption.

ARTICLE I

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The name of the corporation shall be Evangel Mennonite Church of Tucson, Arizona; it shall commence upon the issuance of a Certificate of Incorporation by the Arizona Corporation Commission, and continue for 25 years thereafter.

ARTICLE 11

The principal location of the said corporation shall be Pima County, Arizona.

There shall be no capital stock of the corporation. Participation in its affairs shall be limited to membership in the corporation as provided in its by-laws and Constitution.

Philip Jones of 4777 East 5th Street, Tucson, Arizona, who has been a bona fide resident of the State of Arizona for more than three years last past, is hereby appointed the lawful and statutory agent of the corporation to accept and acknowledge service of all necessary process The Board of Trustees may, at their discretion, revoke such appointment and designate another qualified person to serve as statutory agent of the corporation.

ARTICLE XIV

The members of the corporation shall adopt by-laws and a Constitution of the corporation which may be amonded from time to time in a manner to be provided in the by-laws and Constitution. The by-laws and Constitution shall provide the qualifications of members in the corporation.

ARTICLE XV

The total indebtedness of the corporation at any given time shall be limited to the sum of \$500,000.00.

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The Constitution of Shalom Mennonite Fellowship

ARTICLE I. <u>Name</u>

The name of this organization is Shalom Mennonite Fellowship.

ARTICLE II. Affiliation

The organization is affiliated with Mennonite Church USA (MCUSA) and with Pacific Southwest Mennonite Conference (PSMC), and their boards and agencies.

ARTICLE III. Purpose

The purpose of this organization shall be to support participants to follow Jesus.

ARTICLE IV. Statement of Faith Identity

We are an Anabaptist Christian congregation.

ARTICLE V. Membership

A. The membership of this organization shall consist of persons who accept the commitments of this organization along with one of the following:

- 1. Letter of transfer from another Christian congregation.
- 2. Baptism into this church.
- 3. Confession of faith in Jesus Christ.
- B. Membership in this organization shall end under the following conditions:
 - 1. Death.
 - 2. Letter of transfer.
 - 3. Forfeiture of membership as provided for in the Word of God (Matt. 18:15-17) and described in by-laws.
 - 4. Formal request by the person involved.

ARTICLE VI. Church Leadership

- A. Four elders will be called by the congregation to be the primary authority to guide and, together with pastor(s), to lead the congregation in vision, mission and spiritual matters and in conducting the affairs of the organization.
- B. The congregation has the final authority in all decisions.
- C. The officers of the corporation shall be the administrative elder, the treasurer, and the secretarial elder.

ARTICLE VII. Annual Meeting

There shall be an annual meeting of members as provided for in the by-laws. At this annual meeting, a financial report shall be presented.

ARTICLE VIII. Quorum

A quorum for congregational business meetings shall consist of those members present at meetings for which there has been proper notification.

ARTICLE IX. <u>Amendments</u>

This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds majority vote of members present at the meeting, providing proper notification of a congregational meeting has been made. Two notices of time, place, and motion must be given beginning at least two weeks prior to the date of the meeting, the second notice

given one week before that date.

The By-Laws of Shalom Mennonite Fellowship

ARTICLE I. Elders and Deacons

A. <u>Elders</u>

The four elders meeting with the pastor(s) shall be the decision-making board of the congregation. Any member or attender who desires to attend an elders' meeting may do so as a nonvoting participant. The elders shall have the following responsibilities:

1. Meet regularly and as needed to coordinate the operation of the church. Provide oversight and leadership for the congregation in the areas of administration, worship, community life and peace, justice and wide welcome. Call ad hoc committees into being as needed (e.g. for pastoral selection, or other purposes). Be the communication hub and connection to persons in various roles within the congregation. Maintain the church calendar.

2. Call quarterly congregational meetings. Set meetings and bring proposals (including recommending an annual budget, bringing nominations to fill vacancies in the elders and deacons, recommending wording for new policies...).

3. Provide oversight and support to other congregational bodies, including with the deacons as they fill vacancies other than elders and deacons, periodically appointing someone other than the treasurer to review the books, and approving gifts or loans in excess of \$200 granted by the deacons and large facilities-related expenses.

4. Supervise and be a sounding board for the pastor(s). Manage pastor(s) employment procedures (e.g. updates to annual covenant of understanding, vacation, sick leave, leaves of absence, etc.)

5. Appoint contact persons as needed (e.g. for conference, Mennonite Disaster Service, Mennonite Central Committee, Supportive Congregations Network).

6. Approve time-sensitive public statements, sponsorship of events, and endorsements on behalf of the congregation. Approve congregational practices that are either time-sensitive or not significant enough to bring to the whole congregation.

7. Appoint a Secretarial Elder. Maintain and share minutes of Elder and congregational meetings.

8. Assure that decisions made in elders' and congregational meetings are implemented by the designated person or group.

9. Appoint positions of administrative elder, community elder, worship elder and peace, justice and wide welcome elder.

10. Serve as members of the Board of Directors of Shalom Mennonite Fellowship, Inc.

B. <u>Deacons</u>

The deacons shall have the following responsibilities:

1. Administer the Deacons' Fund responding to financial needs within and outside the congregation.

2. Offer visitation and caring support to church members and attenders.

3. Encourage and support the formation of small groups.

4. Work with pastor(s) to prepare for reception of new members. Maintain the membership list when the pastoral position is vacant.

5. Work with pastor(s) to facilitate gift discernment, the filling of needed congregational roles including discernment of the members of the Pastor-Congregation Relations Committee (PCRC).

C. Qualifications of Elders, Deacons:

1. Shall be members of the congregation and an example to the congregation in spirituality and devotion to the Lord's work. (I Tim. 3:8-13).

2. Shall reflect the gifts of the Spirit in accordance with the responsibilities of the position.

D. Elder Terms

Each of the four elders shall be elected by the congregation in accordance with Article IX for a staggered two-year term and shall be eligible for two consecutive terms.

E. Deacon Terms

Each of the three deacons shall be elected to serve in accordance with Article IX for a staggered three-year term. Each shall be eligible for two consecutive terms in office.

ARTICLE II. <u>Pastoral Ministry</u>

A. Pastors(s)' Responsibilities

The pastor(s)' responsibilities will be delineated in their job descriptions. They include leadership in conjunction with elders in areas of vision, identity and ministry of the congregation, participation in meetings of the elders and being an ex-officio member of all commissions. The pastor(s) receive new members on behalf of the congregation. Other responsibilities include such areas as leading in spiritual formation, worship, pastoral care, peace, justice and wide welcome, care for congregational structures/administration and facilitation of congregational connections to community in this region and the broader Mennonite community.

B. Pastoral Calling and Notice Due

Initial pastoral appointment shall be determined by working closely with conference representatives and by the approval of three-fourths of members attending a congregational meeting called with notice of that agenda. The pastor(s) as well as the congregation are requested to give a 90-day minimum notice if either desires to terminate this appointment, unless pastor(s)' call is ended for cause as determined by the elders and/or the congregation.

C. Pastoral Accountability

The pastor(s) shall provide an accountability plan for their work each year. Appointed pastor(s) shall serve on an open-ended term and shall be accountable to the elders, who will provide ongoing supervision.

ARTICLE III. Treasurer

The treasurer shall be selected through the gift discernment process. The treasurer shall be selected for a two-year term and be brought to the congregation for affirmation.

The treasurer shall have the following responsibilities:

- A. Provide oversight for all financial assets and responsibilities of Shalom Mennonite Fellowship.
- B. Insure that all monies received by the church are channeled to the treasurer or the treasurer's designee.
- C. Disburse church monies according to approved budget. Unbudgeted expenses and line item overruns may be approved by the treasurer, in consultation with the administrative elder. Expenditure of unplanned surpluses shall be decided by the congregation on the recommendation of the treasurer and the administrative elder.
- D. Maintain custody of all monies, securities, and investments of the church.
- E. Report the financial status of the church to the congregation yearly and to the elders quarterly or as

needed, including receipts and disbursements.

- F. Work with the elders to prepare an annual budget for congregational approval.
- G. Provide an annual report after December 31 to known contributors of his/her contributions.
- H. File timely reports with Arizona Corporation Commission and State and Federal agencies, as needed.
- I. Serve as Treasurer of Shalom Mennonite Fellowship, Inc.

ARTICLE IV. Commissions, Committees, Working Groups

Commissions, committees, working groups, and individuals will aid in the coordination of church ministries. Areas of work include: spiritual formation, fellowship, peace, justice and wide welcome, property, and worship. When there is an active acknowledged commission, that commission shall be the body that makes decisions related to use of budgeted funds in their area of responsibility. Each commission decides on their decision-making structure and reports that to elders. Fuller descriptions of these groups can be found in the Additional Documents.

The Pastor-Congregation Relations Committee (PCRC) facilitates the relationship between the congregation and the pastor(s); reports to the elders; and facilitates pastor-congregation review at regular intervals. Members of the PCRC are discerned by the deacons.

ARTICLE V. Representatives to the Wider Church

Conference delegates are members of Shalom Mennonite Fellowship who may be appointed by the elders, or nominated and selected at congregational meetings, for each convention or assembly. Responsibilities include:

- 1. Attend gatherings of the conference or denomination of which Shalom is a member to vote and speak on behalf of Shalom.
- 2. Report back to the congregation on the conference or denominational sessions, and publicize conference activities or issues as called upon by either Shalom or the wider Church.

ARTICLE VI. Areas of Church Ministry

The work and ministry of the congregation is divided into the following four areas for purposes of organization. The four elders will each take responsibility for one of these areas. The elder will be a communication channel for the groups and/or individuals serving in these areas.

- A. Worship
 - 1. Worship Commission (includes ushers, nursery, bulletin preparation, music...)
 - 2. Audio visuals
- B. Administration
 - 1. Treasurer
 - 2. Property Commission and other property-related matters
 - 3. Relations with government
- C. Community
 - 1. Deacons (includes small group life)
 - 2. Fellowship Commission

- 3. Spiritual formation for children youth and adults
- 4. Library
- D. Peace, Justice and Wide Welcome
 - 1. Mennonite Voluntary Service
 - 2. Immigration justice-related ministries
 - 3. Colombia Sister Church project
 - 4. Other activities, initiatives and relationships related to mission, peace, justice, creation care and wide welcome including CHRPA, interfaith and ecumenical activities

ARTICLE VII. <u>Church Membership</u>

A. Voting and Leadership

Only active and associate members in good standing with the congregation and who are in regular attendance at gatherings of the congregation are eligible to vote, or serve as elder, deacon or treasurer.

B. Types of Membership

There shall be three types of membership:

- 1. ACTIVE MEMBERS are those who have been accepted into membership and are active in the life of the congregation. They shall have full voting privileges.
- 2. ASSOCIATE MEMBERS are those who have been accepted into membership, but continue to hold membership with another congregation. They shall have full voting privileges while resident in this community and actively involved in the life of the Shalom congregation.
- 3. INACTIVE MEMBERS are those who have been accepted into membership, but have not been actively involved in the life of the congregation for a period of 2 or more years, or who have moved from the Tucson area. Their membership is dormant. They shall not have voting privileges. Upon return to active participation in the life of the congregation, they return to their previous status of active or associate member.

C. Forfeiture of Membership

Members in continuing violation of God's Word as interpreted by this congregation, who have been approached according to the mediation process described in Matthew 18, with no evidence of repentance, forfeit their membership.

D. Loss of Legal Rights of Former Members

Former members, that is, those who have died, forfeited their membership, transferred to another congregation, or requested an end to their membership, lose all rights and privileges to any and all properties belonging to this congregation.

E. Voting Policy for Attenders

Regular attenders shall have the right to voice their opinions on any issue. They may not vote unless specifically permitted to do so by congregational decision. Attenders are welcome to serve on committees other than elders and deacons.

ARTICLE VIII. Business Meetings

A. Quarterly congregational meetings are recommended. The elders shall be responsible for establishing and communicating the time and the agenda for these meetings. Each meeting shall be announced at

least two weeks in advance in order to facilitate congregational attendance. One of these meetings near the end of the fiscal year will include adopting a budget, and shall be called the annual meeting.

- B. There may be special business meetings for decision making called by the elders if the need arises. These special meetings shall be announced two weeks in advance, and again one week prior to the meeting.
- C. Active and associate members who are present at congregational meetings may vote. Elders may also facilitate member participation and/or voting via other means.
- D. Additional impromptu meetings with no decisions being made may be called at any time by the elders for discussion or informational purposes.

ARTICLE IX. Elections of Elders and Deacons

The congregation shall elect elders and deacons. The slate of nominations for these positions will be discerned by the elders from among the active and associate members of the congregation. Elders and deacons will be elected by a plurality vote. The administrative elder shall appoint people to tally the votes and assure that candidates and congregation are informed of decisions.

ARTICLE X. Fiscal Year

The fiscal year of this organization shall begin on July first, and end on June thirtieth.

ARTICLE XI. <u>Amendments</u>

These by-laws may be amended by a majority vote of members present at a congregational meeting that has been given proper notification.

ARTICLE XII. Corporate Officers

- A. The President of Shalom Mennonite Fellowship, Inc. ("the Corporation") shall be the administrative elder, who shall be elected as prescribed in Article IX of these by-laws.
- B. The Secretary of the Corporation shall be the secretarial elder, who is designated by the elders to serve as the congregational secretary.
- C. The Treasurer of the Corporation shall be the congregational treasurer, who shall be selected as prescribed in Article III of these by-laws.
- D. The Board of Directors of the Corporation shall be the four elders and the treasurer.

Resolutions and Statements of the Congregation

Listed below are resolutions and statements duly acted upon in congregational meetings but not part of the Constitution or By-Laws.

1. Welcome Statement, adopted 1/17/2016

Shalom Mennonite Fellowship welcomes you. You are welcome. No matter if you are plain or fancy, confident or questioning, whole or in pieces, you are welcome. Whether we see you every Sunday, for a season, or on sweet rare occasions, you are welcome. Whatever your identities, in age, race, abilities, sexual orientation, gender, immigration status... you are welcome as member, worshipper, participant, observer, leader... There are so many ways to be part of this community that no one can or should do them all. You may roll through the doorway, dance up an aisle, slide quietly into a back seat, dive into fellowship, engage earnestly in meetings, feast at potluck, delight in learnings, dig into work for immigration justice, peace and creation-care... We invite you to find the niche that is right for you.

2. Covenant Statement of Shalom Mennonite Fellowship, last amended 2011

With God's guidance and the power of the Holy Spirit, I commit myself to Shalom Mennonite Fellowship, Tucson, Arizona, a faith community in the Anabaptist tradition, that:

- Holds the life, death, resurrection, and teachings of Jesus Christ as the core of its faith, understanding the Bible with his teachings as central, striving to follow his example in daily life, and accepting him as both Savior and Lord.
- Holds community as the center of its life, where forgiveness is practiced, Scripture is interpreted in community, and the Christian life is best lived in relational groups.
- Holds reconciliation as the center of its work in the world, reconciling people to God and one another, rejecting all forms of injustice and violence, and encouraging peaceful alternatives to war and other conflicts.

Together with others in this community, I will actively engage my gifts and resources to care for the physical and spiritual needs of others, and to give and receive counsel in a spirit of openness and love.

3. Shalom Congregational Job Description, adopted 8/21/2016

Worship:

Be a joyful, dynamic worshipping body:

- Plan and coordinate worship through Worship Commission
- Preach (usually monthly, more in the summers)
- Make great music
- Engage intergenerationally with symbols, art, poetry and movement
- Take part in worship rituals (e.g. Lord's Supper, laments or celebrations of world events, marking welcomes, leavings, marriages, baptism, memorials, and child dedication)

Peace, justice and wide welcome (mission and ministry (e.g. immigration justice, creation care, undoing oppressions, neighborliness, MVS, SOOP...)):

- Be a welcoming congregation for long term Tucsonans, newcomers, seasonal participants and people of diverse identities.
- Have a positive influence on the wider world through congregational action and supporting the actions of individual members.

- Be sanctuary—compassionately working for justice in relation to immigrants.
- Support MVS, SOOP, CHRPA, our Sister Church relationship, Brethren Mennonite Council for LGBT Concerns, Interfaith Community Services, Café Justo, and emerging initiatives.
- Undo oppressions.
- Care for creation.
- Be a good neighbor.

Congregational care (vision, identity and ministry direction, admin, healthy communication):

• Be a vibrant, urban, Anabaptist congregation that ministers with vision, coordination, and healthy communications (elders, Building Commission, various admin tasks (e.g. bulletin making, everyone@shalom listserv, and more).

Spiritual formation and growth, discipleship, theological education/teach the Word:

- Grow in faith
- Lead and participate in spiritual formation opportunities that are an invitation to faith and to deeper faithfulness (e.g. second hour, Sunday school and youth activities, small groups, and worship).

Mutual care towards full exercise of spiritual gifts, in crisis, and in healing:

• Be a community where gifts are nurtured, affirmed and grown, and that exercises mutual care through all members—and particularly through fellowship events, deacons and small groups.

Connections beyond the congregation (Broader Mennonite and ecumenical):

- Be a faithful, prophetic member of Mennonite Church USA and Pacific Southwest Mennonite Conference (e.g. embodying and growing our Mennonite beliefs and practices, participation in conference assemblies and national conventions, giving of time and finances, serving as a resource to the broader church in areas of immigration justice and undoing oppression).
- Be connected in the context of other spiritual communities in Tucson.

4. RESOLUTION: Women in the Church (1980)

After much discussion, the consensus of the Shalom Mennonite Fellowship on the issue of women in the church is that there should be no distinction between men and women when considering persons for responsibilities in the church. We feel that women are an essential part of our people resources and open positions should be filled by persons having the abilities and gifts needed for those positions regardless of sex.

5. RESOLUTION: Central American Refugees (1985)

We, the Shalom Mennonite Fellowship, Tucson, Arizona, are willing to help Central American refugees, regardless of immigration status, when they need food, shelter, or transportation within the U.S. or other human needs. Furthermore, the pastor, church council chairman, and chairman of the Outreach Committee may, in urgent need, make decisions on amount of financial help of a limited nature.

6. Hiring Policy with regard to Immigration Status (2016 updated 1/2017)

Shalom will not discriminate in hiring based on immigration status. We therefore will not use the I-9 form in hiring/employment processes, and take congregational responsibility for potential, but unlikely legal consequences.

7. Marriage Statement (3/27/2017)

In relation to marriage, Shalom affirms the <u>Confession of Faith in a Mennonite Perspective</u> article 19 on "Family, Singleness and Marriage," with the exception of the phrase "between one man and one woman." Shalom stands ready to bless those who enter marriage regardless of gender combination. For all marriages that they officiate, including for people who have been divorced, Shalom's pastors will endeavor to use careful discernment of and support for readiness for marriage. We hold the vision and support the commitment of marriage for life. We also offer God's fullness of grace to those for whom that has not been the case. Divorce or remarriage are not deterrents to exercise of gifts within Shalom.

8. Child Protection and Abuse Response Policy (8/2017)

Introduction:

Each child is a special gift from God. Jesus placed high value on children during his earthly ministry. We seek to make all our church activities and facilities safe, especially for children. It is the responsibility of adults to do all we can to protect children.

Sadly, child* abuse is prevalent. It is hurting children, families, churches and societies everywhere. What is child abuse and neglect?

- 1. Physical abuse exists when a child has a non-accidental injury.
- 2. *Emotional abuse--*examples include verbal assault, consistent or harsh blaming or shaming of a child, flirtatious behavior, asking a child to hold the adult's secrets, treating a child as more special than other children...
- 3. Sexual abuse exists when an adult uses a child as a part of any type of sexual act.
- 4. *Emotional neglect* is when the child suffers from an adult failing to give chances for feeling loved, wanted, secure, and worthy.
- 5. *Physical neglect* is when an adult does not provide basic needs. Examples: not providing the necessary supervision; not providing needed liquid to drink in hot weather.

Child abuse prevention within our church community:

We seek to prevent all types of child abuse and neglect and to strengthen families. Shalom aspires to offer learning opportunities for both adults and children to this end. We also aspire to be part of the healing of abuse beyond Shalom.

This policy applies to all church ministries and activities, including but not limited to Sunday school, youth activities and nursery. Shalom commits to:

- 1. Make our church facility safe for children.
 - 1.1. Assure that there is easy visual access into all rooms where children or youth ministry is conducted (e.g. windows in doors...)
 - 1.2. A first-aid kit is available in the church building.
- 2. Provide safe and adequate supervision to children.
 - 2.1. Except where Shalom leadership approves an exception, Shalom will avoid situations where a child or children are alone with one adult who is not their parent or guardian. Children's

programming will be conducted with the presence of two approved workers. This is especially important at overnight activities and when activities are in private locations.

- 2.2. With high school or junior high youth, both workers must be at least 21 years old. A person under eighteen years should not teach/care for children without a supervising adult.
- 2.3. A parent/guardian must be notified ahead of time and give consent before their child is transported away from church facilities.
- 2.4. No physical discipline (e.g. hitting, slapping) may be used. When a child misbehaves, use redirection and/or verbal means to guide the child's behavior. If this does not work, the child will be taken to their parent. Very young children who endanger themselves or others may be briefly, gently physically restrained from that danger.
- 2.5. Children need love. At times, this can be appropriately expressed through physical touch, such as hugging, a pat on the back, an arm around the shoulder, holding an infant or toddler, etc. Touch should be age appropriate, never private parts (except as needful for diaper changing/wiping) and only as a response to the child's need. Touch should not be based on the adult's emotional need, nor ever forced on a child.
- 3. Attend personnel issues.
 - 3.1. Before starting to work with children with Shalom, a person will receive this policy, fill out, sign and return the form below. Before hiring/starting, a background check, including nation-wide search of criminal history, child abuse and sex offender registries, will be run for all church staff and volunteers who will have contact with young people (e.g. pastors, Sunday school teachers, youth leaders, MVS local program coordinators, nursery workers...).
 - 3.2. In addition, individuals must have either regular involvement in Shalom for at least four months, or consistently positive references before starting to work with Shalom children.
- 4. Deal appropriately with offenders and allegations of abuse.
 - 4.1. If abuse or neglect is witnessed, or if a child discloses, Shalom child workers will act quickly to: 4.1.1. Ensure the child's safety.
 - 4.1.2. Make a report to <u>Childhelp National Child Abuse Hotline</u> 1-800-4ACHILD, or the Arizona hotline 1-888-SOS-CHILD (767-2445), or the police (911), and
 - 4.1.3. Notify a Shalom pastor or elder knowledgeable in the area of child abuse.

Note: It is not Shalom's role to require evidence or proof. Shalom will not do an investigation. Shalom will cooperate with professionals who conduct an investigation.

- 4.2. When notified, Shalom leadership will follow these steps:
 - 4.2.1. Assure that a report has been made to the child protection authorities.
 - 4.2.2. Immediately attend to the victim and their family's safety and needs within Shalom and through referral to an outside agency, like a child advocacy center. Keep the victim's needs at the center of any process.
 - 4.2.3. Immediately relieve the accused from all responsibilities involving leadership or contact with children until the conclusion of the investigation.
 - 4.2.4. Inform PSMC leadership and Shalom's insurance company within 24 hours of the report.
 - 4.2.5. Keep victim(s) and accused separated during the investigation. Support child victim(s) to engage in age-appropriate activities. If accused is a child/youth, find alternate activities for them.
 - 4.2.6. Consider the possibility that there may be more than one child harmed. Within 48 hours, notify all parents whose children may have encountered the accused in a Shalom context, that allegations have been made and reported.

- 4.2.7. After the investigation, if abuse is confirmed, follow all legal implications for the offender. Inform the entire church. Secrecy not only makes children unsafe, it also does not help offenders.
- 4.2.8. If abuse is not confirmed, attend to the dynamics that prompted the allegations and carefully consider the degree to which victim(s) and accused need to remain separated.
- 4.2.9. Make pastoral care available to all involved. Prioritize the needs of the victim over the offender.
- 4.2.10.Tend to the healing of the congregation as a whole (e.g. informational meetings, gatherings to hear harms and feelings, problem-solving for the future).
- 4.3. If there is uncertainty as to whether a situation requires reporting to authorities, it will be referred to a pastor, a church child program leader, or an elder knowledgeable in the area of child abuse.
- 4.3.1 If someone who has a history of abusing a child and/or is a registered sex offender should attend Shalom, the congregation will be notified at the time this information becomes known to Shalom leadership. Families with children who are new to Shalom will be notified of this information within two months of beginning to attend. Shalom will take steps to see that the person has no unsupervised contact with children. They will not be part of children/youth ministry. Shalom leadership will seek to establish a covenant with that person including that they will avoid interaction with children and will not abuse.

*In this policy "child" and "children" refer to persons under the age of 18.

A. TIHAN (Tucson Interfaith HIV-AIDS Network). Member.

B. DPAA (Death Penalty Alternatives for Arizona). Member.

C. Sanctuary Movement. Member. (January 2016)

D. ICS (Interfaith Community Services). Member. (January 2016)

E. SCN (Supportive Communities Network) of the Brethren and Mennonite Council for LGBT Issues. Member. (May 2016)

Description of Roles, Commissions, Committees and Working Groups

Membership in Shalom is not a requirement of membership or leadership of the groups below. These descriptions can be updated by the commission/group to be approved by elders if changes affect other parts of the congregation.

A. Fellowship Commission:

Ideally the commission consists of at least two members who reflect spirit of hospitality and concern for the well-being of others. The Fellowship Commission foments fellowship opportunities and a spirit of welcome and celebration in Shalom's culture. The fellowship chair leads the commission in this, doing some of the commission's tasks and delegating others.

The following responsibilities are under the Fellowship Commission's care

- 1. In conjunction with the elders and other groups, coordinate and promote events which lead to improved fellowship in the congregation.
- 2. Organize, promote and assure care through clean-up stage for fellowship events (such as pot lucks, picnics, fun/game events) and for special events in the life of the congregation (e.g. baby or wedding showers, farewells, graduation or retirement events...).
- 3. Assure purchase of necessary food items and supplies for Sunday mornings (creamer, coffee, teas...) and church events coordinated by this commission.
- 4. Assure routine maintenance of kitchen and coffee room.
- 5. Assure preparations and cleanup of hospitality beverages on Sunday mornings.

B. Property Commission:

As of 2017 the Property Commission accepts responsibility to maintain the property and manage the grounds and buildings. Property Commission may also organize for medium large improvements to existing property/buildings (e.g. solar, cooling, roof...), but does not take responsibility to work on new construction or major renovation.

Responsibilities that were formerly Property Commission's, but in 2017 are held by elders and/or pastor(s):

- 1. Provide/coordinate janitorial services.
- 2. Ensure that church building is locked after Sunday services.
- 3. Assure that any building or land uses are in accordance with local zoning codes.
- 4. Assure that insurance policies are current and cover both liability and property damage.

Decision-making for needed building related repairs (approved by Property Commission and elders 2017):

- if under \$500 rotating point person (from property commission) is empowered to make decision
- if between \$500-\$1000 checked off by at least 3 property commission members and/or the pastor related to property
- if more than \$1000 and not urgent, goes to elders for approval
- if more than \$1000 and an emergency, bring to admin elder for approval and do it!

Who responds to requests for property use? (elders' decision 8/2017)

The admin elder or either pastor may respond to a request for one-time use of Shalom property/facilities after checking the Shalom calendar to assure that there are no conflicts and resolving issues like entrance to the building, locking up, etc. That person will take responsibility to assure that residents who may be affected are informed of the planned additional use, to put it on the Shalom calendar and inform the other pastor(s)/admin elder about the new scheduled use.

C. Worship Commission:

Members should be individuals who are interested in coordinating and leading worship, music, ushering and other worship events.

The Worship Commission has the following responsibilities:

- 1. Provide vision, direction, oversight, and evaluation for worship in conjunction with pastor(s).
 - a. Plan worship themes
 - b. Identify and schedule worship leaders and preachers
 - c. Identify ushers and other personnel to assist in worship
 - d. Coordinate nursery staffing
 - e. Ensure bulletin preparation
- 2. Work to include all ages in the worship service.
- 3. Work towards accessibility of worship (attending to special needs, hearing impairment, need for interpretation...)
- 4. Encourage, train, and organize worship leaders, music leaders, instrumentalists, ushers and other participants in leading worship.
- 5. Give oversight to:
 - a. Celebrating/observing seasons of the church calendar.
 - b. Planning communion in conjunction with pastor(s).
 - c. Planning additional services for special occasions, observations, and presentations.

D. MVS (Mennonite Voluntary Service) Support Committee:

The work of the MVS Support Committee will be to give oversight to the functioning of the MVS unit, to hire or appoint a Local Program Coordinator(s) (LPC), and to relate to the Mennonite Mission Network. MVS Local Program Coordinator shall be a ¹/₄ time salaried position (or other part-time arrangement as

decided by the MVS Support Committee). LPC(s) serve as the primary liaison between MVS volunteers, the Shalom community and Mennonite Mission Network. The Local Program Coordinator position will be filled by, and be responsible to, the MVS Support Committee, which will also discern the duties and responsibilities of the MVS Local Program Coordinator. The Local Program Coordinator position will be jointly funded by Shalom Mennonite Fellowship and the MVS Unit.

E. The Pastor-Congregation Relations Committee (PCRC)

Open-ended pastoral terms require careful and purposeful ongoing reflection and a regularly scheduled time of assessment, review and discernment. The PCRC or individuals with concerns are expected to contact pastors about those concerns.

The PCRC consists of at least 2, preferably 3 members with staggered 3-year terms. Deacons facilitate discernment of the members of the PCRC.

PCRC Responsibilities:

- Facilitate relationship receive feedback from congregation and pastors
 - Meet with pastor(s) quarterly, or as needed, to support the pastor and provide feedback
 - o Meet with admin elder periodically
 - o Facilitate ongoing check-ins with subsets of congregation
 - Facilitate and model for direct communication and appreciative inquiry
- Facilitate a comprehensive pastor/congregation review every 3-5 years, and report the result to the elders and congregation.
- Encourage affirmation of pastors and provide opportunities to show support of leadership ministry.

F. Responsibilities of the administrative elder include:

- 1. In consultation with pastor(s) and other elders, prepare the agenda for elder meetings.
- 2. Oversee or delegate the pastoral search process when needed.
- 3. Call ad hoc meetings of the elders as needed.
- 4. With other elders and pastors prepare agenda for congregational meetings. Assure that congregational meetings are announced, facilitated and, when needed, that agenda is distributed prior to meeting.
- 5. Maintain contact with treasurer, PCRC and other congregational leaders.
- 6. Be knowledgeable about congregational processes.

G. Shalom Mennonite Fellowship membership prep summary (June 2018, co-pastors with elders' and deacons' review):

We follow Jesus. (Jesus is the center of our faith.) What is your relationship with Jesus? Following Jesus means we...

<u>We witness to God's Peace.</u> (Shalom/Just peace/reconciliation is the center of our work): We seek to embody creative and active nonviolence. We refrain from and seek to undo violence, war and oppression. "Peace, justice and wide welcome" is how Shalom describes our work in the world. Some areas of particular focus include immigration justice, LGBTQ justice and creation care. *What piece of the peace does your life give witness to?* We experience Transformation. The Spirit transforms us to reflect and embody God's love. *How are you seeking to grow in faith?*

<u>Community</u> is the center of our life.

Shalom Mennonite Fellowship is organized to facilitate community and witness.

• Congregational job description: worship, peace, justice and wide welcome, congregational care, spiritual formation, mutual care and connections beyond.

- Structures: elders, deacons, commissions, congregational meetings,
- Co-pastors have different roles. We might share anything but couldn't possibly share everything.
- o Gift Discernment: What is your part in making Shalom Mennonite vibrant and giving community?

Shalom is part of the Body of Christ through the Mennonite Church USA (Pacific Southwest Mennonite Conference). MCUSA is diverse and sometimes divided (including as relates to LGBTQ inclusion). We participate in and are supported by our larger family of faith in many ways including shared missions like Mennonite Voluntary Service (MVS) and Serving in Partnership (SOOP).

I. **Open to pastors identifying as LGBTQ:** The next time there is a pastoral search discernment, wish to discern from the broadest list of qualified pastoral candidates, including those who identify as LGBTQ." Elders approved 6/2018

J. **Re drivers and background checks:** on 4/24 Tina and Carol worked to clarify questions related to Shalom drivers and need for background checks. This was then reviewed by deacons 4/26: -In general on Sunday mornings, Shalom drivers bring families (adults and the children of their family), so no background check is required. -To bring children without an adult from their family would be an unusual exception rather than an ongoing practice. A background check would be required and an explicit exception to the policy preference for two adults would also be required (example: summer 2017 getting kids to camp).



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
