*Purpose:

Funding provided to the Sheriff's Department, County Attorney's Office and Adult Probation Office to facilitate, support and enhance collaborative drug control efforts throughout Arizona. Indirect costs are not allowed for the Southwest Border HIDTA-Arizona.

*Procurement Method:

Grant award was reviewed and signed by PCAO.

*Program Goals/Predicted Outcomes:

The intent of the HIDTA program is to enhance collaborative drug control efforts among law enforcement agencies to dismantle and disrupt illegal drug trafficking organizations and thereby significantly reduce the impact of illegal drug trafficking and use of drugs throughout Arizona.

*Public Benefit:

Public safety and reduction of drug trafficking activities.

*Metrics Available to Measure Performance:

Grant to defray drug trafficking costs; no metrics available.

*Retroactive:

Yes, received Intergovernmental Agreement from the Arizona HIDTA on 5/23/2025. Due to the length of time the Department and County processes, the first eligible Board of Supervisors meeting is on 7/1/2025. This agreement allows Pima County to cover costs incurred while working with various entities to stem the flow of illegal drugs and crimes associated with the border. If this award is rejected, funding will not be provided to assist Pima County towards the grant objectives.

35. Terms And Conditions

Terms and Conditions

1. A. GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- (1) This award is subject to the Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements in 2 C.F.R. § 200 (the "§ 200 Uniform Requirements"), as adopted and implemented by the Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP) in 2 C.F.R.§3603. For this award, the § 200 Uniform Requirements supersede, among other things, the provisions of 28 C.F.R. §§ 66 and 70, as well as those of 2 C.F.R. §§ 215, 220, 225, and 230. B. RECIPIENT INTEGRITY AND PERFORMANCE MATTERS

Reporting of Matters Related to Recipient Integrity and Performance

(1) General Reporting Requirement

(3) Reporting Procedures

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- (a) Administrative proceeding means a non-judicial process that is adjudicatory in nature in order to make a determination of fault or liability (e.g., Securities and Exchange Commission Administrative proceedings, Civilian Board of Contract Appeals proceedings, and Armed Services Board of Contract Appeals proceedings). This includes proceedings at the federal and state level, but only in connection with performance of a federal contract or grant. It does not include audits, site visits, corrective plans, or inspection of deliverables.
- (b) Conviction, for purposes of this award term and condition, means a judgment or conviction of a criminal offense by any court of competent jurisdiction, whether entered upon a verdict or a plea, and includes a conviction entered upon a plea of nolo contendere.
- (c) Total value of currently active grants, cooperative agreements, and procurement contracts includes—
- (1) Only the federal share of the funding under any federal award with a recipient cost share or match; and
- (2) The value of all expected funding increments under a federal award and options, even if not yet exercised.

C. PAYMENT BASIS

- (1) A request for advance or reimbursement shall be made using the HHS/PMS system (https://pms.psc.gov/).
- (2) The recipient, must utilize the object classes specified within the initial budget/grant application each time they submit a disbursement request to ONDCP. Requests for payment in the PMS system will not be approved unless the required disbursements have been entered using the corresponding object class designations. Payments will be made via Electronic Fund Transfer to the award recipient's bank account. The bank must be Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) insured. The account must be interest bearing.
- (3) Except for interest earned on advances of funds exempt under the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act (31 U.S.C. § 6501 et seq.) and the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act (25 U.S.C. § 5301 5423) awardees and sub-awardees shall promptly, but at least annually, remit interest earned on advances to HHS/PMS using the remittance instructions provided below.

Remittance Instructions – Remittances must include pertinent information of the payee and nature of payment in the memo area (often referred to as "addenda records" by Financial Institutions) as that will assist in the timely posting of interest earned on federal funds.

Pertinent details include the Payee Account Number (PAN), reason for check (remittance of interest earned on advance payments), check number (if applicable), awardee name, award number, interest period covered, and contact name and number.
