Funding Source: A grant from the United States Department of Labor (DOL) Employment and Training Administration that was awarded to Pima County for Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) activities in Pima, Santa Cruz, Cochise and Yuma counties.

Purpose: Implementation of the Youth Career Connect Program. Contractor shall develop and implement two-year Career Technical Education programs in Health Information Technology, Industrial Technology, Bio-Technology and Aviation Technology, for 11th/12th-grade students at public high schools and JTED central campuses. The programs will be aligned to prepare students for Pima College programs leading to industry-recognized credentials and to address requirements for local jobs and trends in the targeted fields.

Program Goals/Predicted Outcomes: Provide training and support for 180 youth.

Public Benefit: Assist economic development efforts by helping to develop a trained and productive labor force that meets regional employers' needs.

Metrics available to Measure Performance: Quarterly progress reports of participants outcomes (e.g. Progress to date, challenges and successes encountered, corrective actions and success stories) as required by the Department of Labor.
