RE: Purchase of Right of Way Across State Trust Land for Base of Wildlife Bridge to Cross Oracle Road

Dear Chair Bronson and Supervisors:

We understand that you will be evaluating the allocation of funds for the purchase of 13 acres of right of way across State Trust Land at the base of the soon-to-be-built wildlife bridge across Oracle Road at your February 18, 2014 meeting. This is a letter of support for the allocation of these general funds for this purpose.

As you know, the Coalition for Sonoran Desert Protection has been involved with every aspect of the planned wildlife crossings across Oracle Road, with construction now scheduled to start sometime this year. We appreciate Pima County's continued commitment to this project and we are very thankful to have you as a partner in the protection of the Sonoran Desert's wildlife linkages.

The purchase of permanent right of way across State Trust Land at the base of the Oracle Road wildlife bridge is critical to ensuring that this wildlife bridge is functional and attractive for wildlife to move across. These 13 acres of land will provide a valuable buffer to nearby development and increase the amount of intact Sonoran Desert habitat directly adjacent to the wildlife bridge. Given the overall investment of \$11.2 million by the RTA into the two wildlife crossings along Oracle Road, we believe this is a wise use of Pima County funding.

It is also our understanding that Pima County is currently negotiating the sale of a piece of Pima County property directly south of the wildlife bridge. If this sale is completed, a portion of the funds from the sale are proposed to be returned to the general fund to reimburse the county for the cost of the State Trust Land right-of-way. The remainder of the funds will be allocated for future purchase of open space.

However, since the Arizona State Land Department has scheduled the auction of the State Trust Land right of way for March 11, 2014, the County needs to act now to purchase this valuable open space.
