**Agenda Item #12: Update on County Initiatives to Address Homelessness and Public Safety.**

**Our Comment:** The City of Tucson has been looking at changing ordinances to get people out of public spaces, but they think we are happy with them camping in our city parks. The Same goes for Pima County. Between the two of them, they have proven to be unable to limit crime and provide people with safe living and rehabilitation options. The first step in cleaning this up is personal accountability -- crime is crime and should be punished. Leaving this issue with no accountability for bad behavior has increased the problem. Our top priority is a clean, safe city.

**Agenda Item #14: Fiscal Year (FY) 2025/26 Overall Budget Development.**

**Our Comment:** The last budget was a huge amount. You don't have to be an accounting genius to see that the County is spending our tax dollars without fiscally responsible accountability. It is time for the county administrators to do a better job. They can do better. One example is housing assistance. Out of \$2.5 billion, \$1.4 of it went to administration costs. ***If the Gospel Rescue Mission received this money it would be put to better use and help many more people.*** Our budget priorities are: fixing the jail; smooth safe obstacle-free roadways without panhandlers; clean and safe water and an efficient sewer system; immediate response to public safety calls.
