OFFER AGREEMENT

1. INTENT:

This document is intended to establish a Master Agreement ("MA") to provide Pima County ("County") with Roadway Sweeping Service on an "as required basis" by issue of Delivery Order ("DO") or Delivery Order Maximo ("DOM").

As defined by the Pima County Standard Terms and Conditions included herein, this contract is non-exclusive and County may terminate it for any reason without penalty or cost.

All Goods and Services that Contractor offers or provides pursuant to the contract will conform to the requirements defined by or referred to by the solicitation documents including *Solicitation Addenda, Instructions to Offerors, Standard Terms and Conditions*, and this *Offer Agreement*, all of which are incorporated herein.

This document, including all attachments and documents incorporated by reference, constitutes the entire contract between the parties pertaining to the subject matter hereof, and merges all prior or contemporaneous agreements and understandings, oral or written, herein.

2. CONTRACT TERM, RENEWALS, EXTENSIONS & REVISIONS:

The initial term of the MA will be for a one (1) year period and include four (4) one-year renewal options that the parties may exercise upon written agreement as follows:

Contract extensions, renewals, or revisions will occur through the issuance by County to Contractor of a revised MA document setting forth the requested changes. Failure by Contractor to object in writing to the proposed revisions, terms, conditions, scope modifications and/or specifications within ten (10) calendar days of issuance by County will signify acceptance of all such changes by Contractor and the revision will be binding upon the parties, effective on the date of issuance.

3. CONTRACTOR MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

Contractor Minimum Qualifications are intended to establish the Offeror's capacity and responsibility for providing the services or products contained herein.

Failure to provide the information required by these Minimum Qualifications and required to substantiate *responsibility* may be cause for the Offeror's bid to be rejected as **Non-Responsive**

4. PRODUCT OR SERVICE SPECIFICATIONS & SCOPE:

The Contractor will provide the County all the labor, materials and equipment necessary to perform Roadway Sweeping Services, as indicated and identified on EXHIBIT A: Specifications for Roadway Sweeping and Exhibit B: Roadway/Street Sweeping Inventory.

The sweeping locations with and without curb are in PIMA COUNTY. All locations are further described in the contract in EXHIBIT B: Street Sweeping Inventory.

The CONTRACTOR shall be required to keep the Operations Division Manager or his designee advised of where the individual sweepers are each working day. Additionally, the CONTRACTOR shall notify the Operations Division Manager or his designee within 30 minutes of any sweepers breaking down or leaving a scheduled or emergency work area prior to the work being completed.

5. OFFER ACCEPTANCE AND ORDER RELEASES:

County will accept offer and execute this contract by issue of a MA (recurring requirements) to be effective on the document's date of issue without further action by either party. The MA will document the term of the agreement.

Pursuant to the executed MA, County departments requiring the goods or services defined herein will issue a DO or DOM to the Contractor. County will furnish the DO or DOM to Contractor via facsimile, e-mail or telephone. **If County gives the order verbally, the County Department issuing the order will transmit a confirming order document to Contractor within five (5) workdays of the date it gives the verbal order.**

Contractor must not supply materials or services that are not specified on the MA and are not documented or authorized by a DO or DOM at the time of provision. County accepts no responsibility for control of or payment for materials or services not documented by a County DO or DOM.

Contractor will establish, monitor, and manage an effective contract administration process that assures compliance with all requirements of this contract. In particular, Contractor will not provide goods or services in excess of the executed contract items, item quantity, item amount, or contract amount without prior written authorization by contract revision that County has properly executed and issued. Any items Contractor provides in excess of those stated in the contract are at Contractor's own risk. Contractor will decline verbal requests to deliver items in excess of the contract and will report all such requests in writing to the County Procurement Department within one (1) workday of the request. The report must include the name of the requesting individual and the nature of the request.

6. ACCEPTANCE OF GOODS AND SERVICES:

The County Department designated on the issued order (DO or DOM) will accept goods and services only in accordance with this contract. Such acceptance is a prerequisite to the commencement of payment terms.

7. COMPENSATION & PAYMENT:

Contractor will submit Request(s) for Payment or Invoices to the location and entity defined by County's PO, DO, or DOM document.

All Invoice documents will reference the County's PO, DO or DOM number under which the services or products were ordered. **ALL** Invoice line items will utilize the item description, precise unit price and unit of measure defined by the County's order document. County may return invoices that include line items or unit prices that do not match those documented by the County's order to Contractor unprocessed for correction. **Contractor will not accept orders, or provide services or products that cumulatively exceed the contract amount.**

Standard payment terms are **Net Thirty (30)** days from the date of valid invoice document and do not commence until the later of 1) the receiving County Department receives goods or services into County's payment system or 2) County Financial Operations receives and verifies Contractor's invoice.

OPTIONAL EARLY PAYMENT DISCOUNT TERM: Pima County Administrative Procedure No. 22-35 Section 2.2.4 defines County's practice regarding discounts for early payment. Contractor offers the following discounts to those prices to be used for all orders issued pursuant to this contract. County will utilize the existing payment code that best matches that offered and does not exceed the offered discount percentage. Payment days cannot be less than ten (10) calendar days. Contractor will submit valid invoice document consistent with the associated PO, DO or DOM to County Finance Department at least seven (7) calendar days prior to the date on which the discounted payment is due. If desired, for any

order issued pursuant with this contract, Contractor may offer early payment discounts that exceed this Standard Early Payment Discount.

Standard Early Payment Discount Percent: 0.0 % if payment tendered within n/a Days as above.

The MA or PO issued to accept Contractor's offer will define the not-to-exceed amount of the contract.

The parties may negotiate and establish unit pricing in writing under the contract for items included in the scope of the contract that has not previously defined unit pricing.

Unless the parties otherwise agree in writing, all pricing will be *F.O.B. Destination & Freight Prepaid Not Billed ("F.O.B. Destination")*. Contractor will deliver and unload products or services at the destination(s) that the delivery article of this contract or accepted *Order* indicates. The offered Unit Price must include all freight costs.

Although an order may not fully define State and City sales tax, County will pay such taxes as are DIRECTLY applicable to County and Contractor invoices such taxes as a separate line item. Contractor must not include such taxes in the item unit price.

Price Warranty. Contractor will give County the benefit of any price reduction before actual time of shipment.

Price Escalation. All unit prices include compensation for Contractor to implement and actively conduct cost and price control activities. Pricing will remain firm during the initial year of the contract term after which the parties may consider price increases no more frequently than once per year. Contractor will submit a written request to County that includes supporting documents justifying requested increases at least ninety (90) days prior to the renewal date. Contractor will provide evidence, cite sources, demonstrate specific conditions and document how those conditions affect the cost of its performance, and identify specific efforts Contractor has taken to control and reduce those and other costs to avoid the need to increase prices. County will review proposed pricing and determine if it is allowable, fair and reasonable, and in the best interest of County to accept the proposal. County reserves the right to continue, accept or reject the price proposal, or terminate and re-solicit the contract.

Quantities in this solicitation are estimates only. County reserves the right to increase or decrease quantities and amounts. County makes no guarantee regarding actual orders for items or quantities during the term of the agreement. County is not responsible for Contractor inventory or order commitment.

Contractor's unit prices must include all incidentals and associated costs required to comply with and satisfy all requirements of this solicitation, which includes the *Instructions to Offerors, Standard Terms and Conditions, and Offer Agreement*. County will make no payments for items not in the contract.

Contractor will provide detailed documentation in support of payment requests, which should be consistent with and not exceed County's PO, DO, or DOM document. Contractor will bill County within one (1) month after the date on which Contractor's right to payment accrues ("Payment Accrual Date"), which, unless this contract specifically provides otherwise, is the date Contractor delivers goods, performs services or incurs costs. Invoices must assign each billed amount to an appropriate line item of County's order and document each Payment Accrual Date. County may refuse to pay any amount that Contractor bills in which does not conform to County's PO, DO, or DOM document. County will refuse to pay any amount that Contractor bills more than six (6) months after the Payment Accrual Date, pursuant to A.R.S. § 11-622(C).

8. DELIVERY:

"On-Time" delivery is an essential part of the consideration that Contractor is to provide to County under the contract. Contractor will make delivery in accordance with the Instructions to Offerors, Standard Terms and Conditions and to the location(s) on the PO, DO, or DOM document.

Define delivery locations – Countywide

Contractor guarantees delivery of product or service in less than two (2) calendar days after issue date of order. If necessary to satisfy the guaranteed delivery time, Contractor will utilize premium freight method at no additional cost to County.

9. TAXES, FEES, EXPENSES:

County is exempt from federal excise taxes for goods. County is subject to State and City sales tax. County will pay no separate charges for delivery, drayage, express, parcel post, packing, insurance, license fees, permits, costs of bonds, surcharges, or bid preparation unless the contract expressly includes such charges and the solicitation documents itemize them.

10. OTHER DOCUMENTS:

Contractor and County in entering into this contract have relied upon information provided or referenced by Pima County Solicitation No. 306228 including the Invitation for Bids, Instructions to Offerors, Standard Terms and Conditions, Solicitation Addenda, Contractor's Bid Offer, documents submitted by Contractor or References to satisfy Minimum Qualifications and any other information and documents that Contractor has submitted in its response to County's Solicitation. The Contract incorporates these documents as though set forth in full herein, to the extent not inconsistent with the provisions of this contract.

11. INSURANCE:

The Insurance Requirements herein are minimum requirements for this Contract and in no way limit the indemnity covenants contained in this Contract. Contractor's insurance shall be placed with companies licensed in the State of Arizona and the insureds shall have an "A.M. Best" rating of not less than A- VII. Pima County in no way warrants that the minimum insurer rating is sufficient to protect the Contractor from potential insurer insolvency.

Minimum Scope and Limits of Insurance:

Contractor shall procure and maintain, until all contractual obligations have been discharged, the insurance coverage with limits of liability not less than stated below. Pima County in no way warrants that the minimum insurance limits contained herein are sufficient to protect the Contractor from liabilities that arise out of the performance of the work under this Contract. The Contractor is free to purchase additional insurance that required by the County. If necessary, Contractor may obtain commercial umbrella or excess insurance to satisfy the County's Insurance Requirements.

Commercial General Liability (CGL) – Occurrence Form with limits of \$2,000,000 Each Occurrence and \$2,000,000 General Aggregate. Policy shall include bodily injury, property damage, personal/advertising injury and products – completed operations.

Business Automobile Liability – Bodily Injury and Property Damage for any owned, hired, and/or non-owned automobiles used in the performance of this Contract with a Combined Single Limit (CSL) of \$1,000,000 each accident.

Workers' Compensation (WC) and Employers' Liability – Arizona Statutory requirements and Employer's Liability coverage with policy limits of \$1,000,000 and each accident and each person - disease.

Professional Liability (Errors and Omissions) Insurance – This insurance is required by Pima County when Professional Liability or any other E&O coverage is excluded from the Contractor's CGL policy. The E&O policy limits shall be not less than \$2,000,000 Each Claim and \$2,000,000 Annual Aggregate. The insurance policy shall cover professional misconduct or negligent acts of anyone performing any services under this contract.

Claim-Made Insurance Coverage - If any part of the Required Insurance is written on a claims-made basis, any policy retroactive date must precede the effective date of this Contract, and Contractor must maintain such coverage for a period of not less than three (3) years following Contract expiration, termination or cancellation.

Additional Insured: The General Liability and Business Automobile Liability Policies shall each be endorsed to include Pima County, its departments, districts, boards, commissions, officers, officials, agents, and employees as additional insureds with respect to liability arising out of the activities performed by or on behalf of the Contractor.

Subrogation: The General Liability, Business Automobile Liability and Workers' Compensation policies shall each contain a waiver of subrogation endorsement in favor of Pima County, and its departments, districts, boards, commissions, officers, officials, agents, and employees for losses arising from work performed by or on behalf of the Contractor.

Primary Insurance: The Contractor's policies shall stipulate that the insurance afforded the Contractor shall be primary and that any insurance carried by Pima County, its agents, officials, or employees shall be excess and not contributory insurance.

Insurance provided by the Contractor shall not limit the Contractor's liability assumed under the indemnification provisions of this Contract.

Notice of Cancellation:

Verification of Coverage:

Contractor shall furnish Pima County with certificates of insurance as required by this Contract. An authorized representative of the insurer shall sign the certificates.

All certificates and endorsements, as required by this written agreement, are to be received and approved by Pima County before work commences. Each insurance policy required by this Contract must be in effect at, or prior to, commencement of work under this Contract. Failure to maintain the insurance coverages or policies as required by this Contract, or to provide evidence of renewal, is a material breach of contract.

All certificates required by this Contract shall be sent directly to the appropriate County Department. The Certificate of Insurance shall include the Pima County project or contract number and project description on the certificate. Pima County reserves the right to require complete copies of all insurance policies required by this Contract at any time.

Neither the County's failure to obtain a required insurance certificate or endorsement, the County's failure to object to a non-complying insurance certificate or endorsement, or the County's receipt of any other information from the Contractor, its insurance broker(s) and/or insurer(s), constitutes a waiver of any of the Insurance Requirements.

Approval and Modifications:

The Pima County Risk Manager may approve a modification of the Insurance Requirements without the necessity of a formal Contract amendment, but the approval must be in writing.

Pima County ("COUNTY") will publicly open responses on the date and at the location as stated in the *Invitation for Bid (IFB)* or *Request for Proposal (RFP)*. The County will read each respondent's name, and for responses to an IFB will also read the total bid amount. COUNTY will open proposals so as to avoid disclosure of the contents of any proposal to competing offerors during the evaluation process. COUNTY invites all interested parties to attend the bid opening.

2. EVALUATION:

COUNTY will evaluate responses to determine which are most advantageous to COUNTY considering conformity to the specifications stated in the IFB, evaluation criteria stated in the RFP, and other factors, regardless of solicitation type.

If COUNTY makes an award, COUNTY will enter into an agreement with one or more Contractor(s) that submitted the lowest responsive bid(s) or highest scoring proposal that COUNTY determined responsible for providing the required goods or services. Unless otherwise specified on the IFB document, COUNTY will determine the low or lowest bids considering all items listed in the Unit Price Schedule.

Maximo ("DOM") revision or amendment as the COUNTY's Procurement Code requires. All quantities are estimates and COUNTY provides no guarantee regarding actual usage.

10. PACKING:

Contractor will make no extra charges for packaging or packing material. Contractor is responsible for safe packaging conforming to carrier's requirements.

11. DELIVERY:

On-time delivery of goods and services is an essential part of the consideration that COUNTY will receive.

Contractor must provide a guaranteed delivery date, or interval period from order release date to delivery if the Price proposal document requires it. Upon receipt of notification of delivery delay, COUNTY at its sole option and at no cost to COUNTY may cancel the order or extend delivery times. No verbal agreement for adjustment is acceptable.

Nothing in this clause reduces Contractor's responsibility to proceed without delay in the delivery or performance of an order.

13. INSPECTION:

COUNTY may inspect or test all goods and services at place of manufacture, destination, or both. Contractor will hold goods failing to meet specifications of the order or contract at Contractor's risk and COUNTY may return such goods to Contractor with costs for transportation, unpacking, inspection, repacking, reshipping, restocking or other like expenses to be the responsibility of Contractor. In lieu of return of nonconforming supplies, COUNTY, at its sole discretion and without prejudice to COUNTY's rights, may waive any nonconformity, receive the delivery, and treat the defect(s) as a warranty item, but any waiver of any condition will not apply to subsequent shipments or deliveries.

17. RIGHTS AND REMEDIES OF COUNTY FOR DEFAULT:

In the event any item that Contractor furnishes in the performance of the contract should fail to conform to the specifications thereof, or to the sample that Contractor submitted, COUNTY may reject same, and it thereupon becomes the duty of Contractor to reclaim and remove the same, without expense to COUNTY, and immediately replace all such rejected items with others conforming to the specifications or samples. Should Contractor fail, neglect, or refuse immediately to do so, COUNTY has the right to purchase in the open market, in lieu thereof, a corresponding quantity of any such items and to deduct from any monies due or that may become due to Contractor the difference between the price named in the MA or Purchase Order ("PO") and the actual cost to COUNTY.

21. INDEMNIFICATION:

23. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS:

Contractor will comply with all federal, state, and local laws, rules, regulations, standards and Executive Orders, without limitation. In the event any services that Contractor provides under this contract require a license issued by the Arizona Registrar of Contractors (ROC), Contractor certifies that a contractor licensed by ROC to perform those services in

Arizona will provide such services. The laws and regulations of the State of Arizona govern the rights, performance and disputes of and between the parties. Any action relating to this Contract must be filed and maintained in a court of the State of Arizona in Pima County.

Any changes in the governing laws, rules, and regulations during an agreement apply, but do not require an amendment or revisions.

24. ASSIGNMENT:

Contractor may not assign its rights to the contract, in whole or in part, without prior written approval of COUNTY. COUNTY may withhold approval at its sole discretion, provided that COUNTY will not unreasonably withhold such approval.

25. CONFLICT OF INTEREST:

This contract is subject to the provisions of A.R.S. § 38-511, the pertinent provisions of which are incorporated into and made part of all COUNTY MAs or POs as if set forth in full therein.

26. NON-DISCRIMINATION:

CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all provisions and requirements of Arizona Executive Order 2009-09 which is hereby incorporated into this contract as if set forth in full herein including flow down of all provisions and requirements to any subcontractors. During the performance of this contract, CONTRACTOR must not discriminate against any employee, client or any other individual in any way because of that person's age, race, creed, color, religion, sex, disability or national origin.

27. NON-APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS:

COUNTY may cancel this contract pursuant to A.R.S. § 11-251(42) if for any reason the COUNTY Board of Supervisors does not appropriate funds for the stated purpose of maintaining the contract. In the event of such cancellation, COUNTY has no further obligation, other than payment for services or goods that COUNTY has already received.

28. PUBLIC RECORDS:

Disclosure. Pursuant to A.R.S. § 39-121 et seq., and A.R.S. § 34-603(H) in the case of construction or Architectural and Engineering services procured under A.R.S. Title 34, Chapter 6, all documents submitted in response to the solicitation resulting in award of this Contract, including, but not limited to, pricing schedules, product specifications, work plans, and any supporting documents are public records. As such, those documents are subject to release and/or review by the general public upon request, including competitors.

Records Marked Confidential: Notice and Protective Order. If Contractor reasonably believes that some of those records contain proprietary, trade-secret or otherwise-confidential information, Contractor must prominently mark those records "CONFIDENTIAL." In the event a public-records request is submitted to County for records marked CONFIDENTIAL, County will notify Contractor of the request as soon as reasonably possible. County will release the records 10 business days after the date of that notice, unless Contractor has, within that period, secured an appropriate order from a court of competent jurisdiction, enjoining the release of the records. County will not, under any circumstances, be responsible for securing such an order, nor will County be in any way financially responsible for any costs associated with securing such an order.

The Contractor agrees to waive confidentiality of any price terms in the event of a contract award.

29. CUSTOM TOOLING, DOCUMENTATION AND TRANSITIONAL SUPPORT:

Costs to develop all tooling and documentation, such as and not limited to dies, molds, jigs, fixtures, artwork, film, patterns, digital files, work instructions, drawings, etc. necessary to provide the contracted services or products and unique to the services or products supplied to COUNTY are included in the agreed upon Unit Price unless the contract specifically states otherwise. Such tools and documentation are the property of COUNTY and will be marked, as is

practical, as the "Property of Pima County" and COUNTY so requests, Contractor will deliver a copy of the tooling and documentation to COUNTY within twenty (20) days of acceptance by COUNTY of the first article sample, or not later than ten (10) days of termination of the contract associated with their development, without additional cost to COUNTY. Contractor also agrees to act in good faith to facilitate the transition of work to a subsequent Contractor if and as reasonably requested by COUNTY at no additional cost. Should exceptional circumstances be present that may justify an additional charge, Contractor may submit said justification and proposed cost and negotiate an agreement acceptable to both Contractor and COUNTY, but Contractor may not withhold any requested tooling, document or support as defined above that would delay the orderly, efficient and prompt transition of work. Should conduct by Contractor result in

additional costs to COUNTY, Contractor will reimburse COUNTY for said actual and incremental costs provided that COUNTY has given Contractor reasonable time to respond to COUNTY's requests for support.

30. AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT:

31. NON-EXCLUSIVE:

Contracts resulting from this solicitation are non-exclusive and are for the sole convenience of COUNTY, which reserves the right to obtain like goods and services from other sources for any reason.

32. PROTESTS:

An interested party may file a protest regarding any aspect of a solicitation, evaluation, or recommendation for award. Protests must be in accordance with the Pima County Procurement Code, Section 11.20.010.

33. TERMINATION:

COUNTY reserves the right to terminate any MA, PO, Delivery Order, DOM or award, in whole or in part, at any time, without penalty or recourse, when in the best interests of COUNTY. Upon receipt of written notice, Contractor will immediately cease all work as directed by the notice, notify all subcontractors of the effective date of termination and take appropriate actions to minimize further costs to COUNTY. In the event of termination under this paragraph, all documents, data, and reports prepared by Contractor under the contract become the property of COUNTY and Contractor must promptly deliver them to COUNTY. Contractor is entitled to receive just and equitable compensation for work in progress, work completed and materials accepted before the effective date of the termination. The cost principles and procedures defined by A.A.C. R2-7-701 apply.

34. ORDER OF PRECEDENCE-CONFLICTING DOCUMENTS:

In the event of inconsistencies between contract documents, the following is the order of precedence, superior to subordinate, that will apply to resolve the inconsistency: MA, DO or DOM, PO, Offer Agreement or contract attached to a MA, PO, DO or DOM; these standard terms and conditions; any other solicitation documents.

35. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR:

The status of Contractor is that of an independent Contractor. Contractor and Contractor officer's agents or employees are not considered employees of COUNTY and are not entitled to receive any employment-related fringe benefits under the COUNTY Merit System. Contractor is responsible for payment of all federal, state and local taxes associated with the compensation received pursuant to this Contract and will indemnify and hold COUNTY harmless from any and all liability which COUNTY may incur because of Contractor's failure to pay such taxes. Contractor is solely responsible for its program development and operation.

36. BOOKS AND RECORDS:

Contractor will keep and maintain proper and complete books, records and accounts, which will be open at all reasonable times for inspection and audit by duly authorized representatives of COUNTY. In addition, Contractor will retain all records relating to this contract at least five (5) years after its termination or cancellation or, if later, until any related pending proceeding or litigation has been closed.

37. COUNTERPARTS:

The parties may execute the MA or PO that COUNTY awards pursuant to this solicitation in any number of counterparts, and each counterpart is considered an original, and together such counterparts constitute one and the same instrument. For the purposes of the MA and PO, the signed proposal of Contractor and the signed acceptance of COUNTY are each an original and together constitute a binding MA, if all other requirements for execution are present.

38. AUTHORITY TO CONTRACT:

Contractor warrants its right and power to enter into the MA or PO. If any court or administrative agency determines that COUNTY does not have authority to enter into the MA or PO, COUNTY is not liable to Contractor or any third party by reason of such determination or by reason of the MA or PO.

39. FULL AND COMPLETE PERFORMANCE:

The failure of either party to insist on one or more instances upon the full and complete performance with any of the terms or conditions of the MA, PO, DO or DOM to be performed on the part of the other, or to take any action permitted as a result thereof, is not a waiver or relinquishment of the right to insist upon full and complete performance of the same, or any other covenant or condition, either in the past or in the future.

The acceptance by either party of sums less than may be due and owing it at any time is not an accord and satisfaction.

40. SUBCONTRACTORS:

CONTRACTOR is fully responsible for all acts and omissions of any subcontractor and of persons directly or indirectly employed by any subcontractor, and of persons for whose acts CONTRACTOR may be liable to the same extent that CONTRACTOR is responsible for the acts and omissions of persons that it directly employs. Nothing in this contract creates any obligation on the part of COUNTY to pay or see to the payment of any money due any subcontractor, except as may be required by law.

41. SEVERABILITY:

Each provision of this Contract stands alone, and any provision of this Contract that a court finds to be prohibited by law is ineffective to the extent of such prohibition without invalidating the remainder of this Contract.

42. LEGAL ARIZONA WORKERS ACT COMPLIANCE:

CONTRACTOR hereby warrants that it will at all times during the term of this Contract comply with all federal immigration laws applicable to CONTRACTOR's employment of its employees, and with the requirements of A.R.S. § 23-214 (A) (together the "State and Federal Immigration Laws"). CONTRACTOR will further ensure that each subcontractor who performs any work for CONTRACTOR under this contract likewise complies with the State and Federal Immigration Laws.

COUNTY has the right at any time to inspect the books and records of CONTRACTOR and any subcontractor in order to verify such party's compliance with the State and Federal Immigration Laws.

Any breach of CONTRACTOR's or any subcontractor's warranty of compliance with the State and Federal Immigration Laws, or of any other provision of this section, is a material breach of this Contract subjecting CONTRACTOR to penalties up to and including suspension or termination of this Contract. If the breach is by a subcontractor, and the subcontract is suspended or terminated as a result, CONTRACTOR will take such steps as may be necessary to either self-perform the services that would have been provided under the subcontract or retain a replacement subcontractor as soon as possible so as not to delay project completion.

CONTRACTOR will advise each subcontractor of COUNTY's rights, and the subcontractor's obligations, under this Article by including a provision in each subcontract substantially in the following form:

"SUBCONTRACTOR hereby warrants that it will at all times during the term of this contract comply with all federal immigration laws applicable to SUBCONTRACTOR's employees, and with the requirements of A.R.S. § 23-214 (A). SUBCONTRACTOR further agrees that COUNTY may inspect the SUBCONTRACTOR's books and records to insure that SUBCONTRACTOR is in compliance with these requirements. Any breach of this paragraph by SUBCONTRACTOR is a material breach of this contract subjecting SUBCONTRACTOR to penalties up to and including suspension or termination of this contract."

Any additional costs attributable directly or indirectly to remedial action under this Article is the responsibility of CONTRACTOR. In the event that remedial action under this Article results in delay to one or more tasks on the critical path of CONTRACTOR's approved construction or critical milestones schedule, such period of delay will be excusable delay for which CONTRACTOR is entitled to an extension of time, but not costs.

43. CONTROL OF DATA PROVIDED BY COUNTY:

For those projects and contracts where COUNTY has provided data to enable the Contractor to provide contracted services or products, unless COUNTY otherwise specifies and agrees in writing, Contractor will treat, control and limit access to said information as confidential and will under no circumstances release any data provided by COUNTY during the term of this contract and thereafter, including but not limited to personal identifying information as defined by A.R.S. § 44-1373, and Contractor is further prohibited from selling such data directly or through a third party. Upon termination or completion of the contract, Contractor will either return all such data to COUNTY or will destroy such data and confirm destruction in writing in a timely manner not to exceed sixty (60) calendar days.

44. ISRAEL BOYCOTT CERTIFICATION:

Contractor hereby certifies that it is not currently engaged in, and will not for the duration of this Contract engage in, a boycott of Israel as defined by A.R.S. § 35-393.01. Violation of this certification by Contractor may result in action by the County up to and including termination of this Contract.

END OF PIMA COUNTY STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS

EXHIBIT A: Specifications for Roadway Sweeping Services**DESCRIPTION**

The work shall consist of the sweeping of sand and debris accumulated on the roadways with and without curbs, median curbs and at intersections, major interchanges, normal extra sweeping and emergency sweeping areas as designated by PIMA COUNTY. Debris is defined as all litter, rubbish, leaves, sand, dirt, garbage and any other foreign materials capable of being removed with a mechanical street sweeper.

LOCATION OF WORK

The sweeping locations with and without curb are in PIMA COUNTY to include the Ajo Township. All locations are further described in the contract in EXHIBIT B: Street Sweeping Inventory. The CONTRACTOR shall be required to keep the DOT Operations Division Manager or his designee advised of where the individual sweepers are each working day. Additionally, the CONTRACTOR shall notify the Operations Division Manager or his designee within 30 minutes of any sweepers breaking down or leaving a scheduled or emergency work area prior to the work being completed.

SWEEPING REQUIREMENTS

It is anticipated that the accumulated debris on curbed streets will be removed by Pick Up Broom sweeping or Vacuum Sweepers. The CONTRACTOR shall provide whatever equipment is necessary to insure and perform the sweeping in such a manner that the roads, streets or intersections are swept clean and free of any and all loose debris. COUNTY will be the sole source in determining if the roads, streets and intersections have been adequately swept. CONTRACTOR will provide curb to curb or edge of pavement to edge of pavement sweeping (FULL WIDTH SWEEPING). Complete intersections and turn bays shall be swept during sweeping. CONTRACTOR shall make as many passes as necessary to accomplish the task of removing all debris.

When Side Cast Sweepers, Pick Up Broom Sweepers, loaders, graders and any other equipment utilized for debris sweeping / removal are used, CONTRACTOR shall employ any and all means necessary to insure the sweeping is done in strict compliance with any and all of PIMA COUNTY DEPARTMENT of ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY CONTROL requirement and guidelines. The COUNTY will monitor the sweeping and debris removal to insure that CONTRACTOR employs all reasonable means and measures to insure strict compliance. The COUNTY may stop work immediately if the COUNTY determines additional measures are needed or in the event that any procedure used is not producing the required PIMA COUNTY DEPARTMENT of ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY CONTROL requirements. **This is not a pay item.**

During routine sweeping, Contractor shall be responsible for cleaning all loose sand and debris accumulated to a depth of 2" or less. As directed by the COUNTY, if sand and debris exceeds 2" and/or is hard packed in certain areas, these areas will be re-swept at the hourly rate bid.

Emergency sweeping may be required to occur during normal work hours or after normal work hours. Emergency Sweeping is defined as sweeping required for occasions or events, such as spills or auto accidents requiring accelerated response times to protect the safety of the driving public. If the event occurs during normal working hours, PIMA COUNTY shall pay the hourly rate bid, from the time the sweeper leaves the previously scheduled work site or parking area. If emergency sweeping is required after work hours, the hourly rate will be paid by PIMA COUNTY from the time the operator of the sweeper leaves the Contractor's place of business until the job is completed or a minimum of two hours, at the hourly rate bid

The CONTRACTOR is not responsible for the clean up or pick up of hazardous spills. Those tasks will be performed by the Hazardous Response team contracted by the COUNTY.

Routine Hourly Sweeping

Additional sweeping services at an hourly rate may be required at various times during normal working hours. Such instances may include pre-sweeping for surface treatments, new subdivisions accepted by Pima County but not yet in the sweeping inventory, or other non emergency situations that do not require an accelerated response time. The response time for routine hourly sweeping is one full working day after notification is made. For example, if the COUNTY notifies on a Wednesday, the CONTRACTOR shall start sweeping by Friday morning. Payment shall be at the hourly bid rate.

NO HOURLY RATES WILL BE PAID UNLESS APPROVED IN ADVANCE BY THE OPERATIONS DIVISION.

The Contractor shall utilize a pager system, or other similar radio or communication systems, with each sweeper. Emergency phone numbers and contacts shall be provided for emergency call outs prior to starting work. The contractor shall also provide Pima County DOT Operations Division e-mail address for the CONTRACTOR. Additionally the Contractor shall furnish Pima County Operations Division a listing of the CONTRACTORS names of personnel responsible for this contract and a listing of the "chain of command" within the CONTRACTORS organization. This information shall be provided at the post award meeting.

The post award meeting will be held after the contract has been fully executed by both parties. Such date will be communicated to the CONTRACTOR at a later time.

SWEEPING PRACTICES

The CONTRACTOR shall at all times use good sweeping practices and will be responsible to make any and all adjustments to the equipment as needed or as directed by the COUNTY. The CONTRACTOR shall exercise due care so as to prevent spilling, scattering or dropping of refuse through the sweeping activities and shall immediately clean up any spillage, dropping, or scattering. Sweeping practices shall include, but are not limited to:

1. Positioning gutter brooms at the proper angle and pressure to the gutter line, touching the curb at locations where median or edge line curbing exists.
2. Setting the main broom in a level position to assure debris is picked up. Apply appropriate broom pressure necessary for sweeping conditions.
3. Adjust water spray nozzles to keep dust, caused by sweeping, to a minimum.
4. Center dirt reflectors and main drag shoes shall be properly maintained and adjusted, or any other device designed for the particular sweeping device being used to direct the debris to the proper pick up broom or to the desired location.
5. Sweeping speed shall be adjusted as necessary to achieve the cleanest possible street, road, median, left or right turn bays to assure the pavement is free of any loose debris.
6. Common sense and good judgment shall be used at all times.
7. The CONTRACTOR shall provide and maintain as many sweepers and other support equipment as noted in this contract as necessary to perform the work as required by the COUNTY.
8. The CONTRACTOR shall maintain all sweepers in good working condition and all sweeping equipment shall be kept clean and presentable at all times. The equipment used shall be equipped with all necessary safety equipment as noted by the manufacturer and all safety equipment shall be in working condition at all times including any and all arrow boards and rotating or strobe warning lights.
9. The COUNTY reserves the right to inspect any and all equipment intended to be used in this contract by the CONTRACTOR prior to issuing a notice to proceed or at any other time as deemed necessary by the COUNTY.
10. The COUNTY also requires that the CONTRACTOR provide to the COUNTY copies of any and all manufacturers operator and maintenance manuals,
11. The COUNTY shall have the right to reject any piece of equipment that does not meet the requirements listed above until such time that equipment is properly repaired or replaced and is in conformance to the conditions described above.
12. The COUNTY also reserves the right to require documentation that the CONTRACTOR has qualified operators and that all operators have the appropriate State of Arizona operators' license as required for each piece of equipment used by the operators.

REPORTING

1. The CONTRACTOR shall submit by noon the following day to the COUNTY Inspector via e-mail, a listing of each road swept for work done on the previous day.
2. All work shall be completed in the specified time allowed, as directed by the Maintenance Operations Division Manager or his designee.
3. Except as may be otherwise approved in writing by the Operations Division Manager or his designee, the work shall be accomplished during the work week, except for official COUNTY holidays, and at those hours chosen by the CONTRACTOR which have been previously approved by the COUNTY.
4. If inclement weather occurs to the sweeping operations, the CONTRACTOR shall suspend sweeping operations and resume sweeping operations when weather permits.
5. Emergency sweeping or extra sweeping shall be swept on an hourly unit price basis as directed by the COUNTY.
6. The work schedule approved by PIMA COUNTY shall be strictly adhered to and changes made only with the permission of the PIMA COUNTY DOT Operations Division Manager or his designee. An approved monthly schedule **shall serve as a monthly notice to begin work**. The end of the same **month shall serve as the specified time allowed for completing the work** unless previous arrangements have been approved by the Pima County DOT Operations Division Manager or his designee.
7. The COUNTY does not guarantee a minimum amount of work per day, per week, or work per month.
8. The COUNTY reserves the right to modify the Task Order WORK SCHEDULE by adding, deleting roads, streets or intersections and the CONTRACTOR will be paid per the unit bid price where each addition, deletion or revision occurs. As deemed necessary by the COUNTY, the COUNTY may increase or decrease the frequency of the street, road or intersection sweeping at no additional unit costs.

TRAFFIC SAFETY

Traffic flow around the sweeper shall be maintained. All sweeping shall be accomplished "with" traffic flow instead of opposing traffic. In the event line of sight vision may be impaired, the CONTRACTOR shall use signs and any other approved traffic control devices as necessary and as required and recommended in the Millennium Edition of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices. PIMA COUNTY **will require** a flashing arrow board mounted on the rear of the pick up and vacuum sweepers and shall be in conformance with PART VI of the Millennium Edition on Uniform Traffic Control Devices. All Sweepers shall also be equipped with strobe or rotating warning lights. This is considered incidental to the safe operation of the sweeping operation. All sweepers used in the performance of this contract shall be equipped as noted and ready for use within 10 days after the issuance of the notice to proceed. Sweepers not properly equipped will not be allowed to begin work until the equipment is properly equipped. **This is not a pay item.**

DUMP SITES

PIMA COUNTY requires that all regularly scheduled and routine hourly sweeping be disposed of in State permitted solid waste municipal landfills. PIMA COUNTY will not provide dump sites for temporary material storage for use during regularly scheduled, or routine hourly sweeping services.

If the CONTRACTOR chooses to utilize privately owned sites for the temporary storage and transfer of swept materials, the CONTRACTOR must provide the COUNTY with a letter from the owner of the land authorizing the CONTRACTOR to use the property for a Dump Site, and that the land owner will hold the COUNTY harmless. This must be done prior to any dumping on the site. If and as necessary, the COUNTY may review the site and approve or reject the location.

The CONTRACTOR will be responsible for pick up and proper disposal of all swept materials in landfills. The CONTRACTOR shall provide evidence of disposals in landfills with copies of landfill receipts. Copies of receipts shall be provided to PIMA COUNTY each month. Failure to provide copies of receipts may result in cancellation of this CONTRACT.

MEASUREMENT AND PAYMENT

The Contractor shall provide daily lists of roads swept in any pay item unit area. In addition, the Contractor shall provide invoices to the Department of Transportation on a monthly basis, including one copy of each approved work report and in a format specified by the Maintenance Operations Division Manager or his designee. Conditional lien releases from any subcontractors and material suppliers shall be provided with the monthly invoices, together with unconditional lien releases for the first previous month's billing. Payment will be made only after completion and acceptance of the work performed and receipt of supporting invoices.

Upon acceptance, the County shall forward all necessary papers to the Finance Department for payment.

1. Measurement

Measurement shall be on the basis of unit area satisfactorily cleaned or hours of sweeping satisfactorily completed. Quantities for this work will be paid under the appropriate schedule at the applicable contract price per unit of measurement, with no allowance for waste. Payment will be made monthly after completion and acceptance of all locations.

2. Dump Fees

The CONTRACTOR shall be paid for landfill disposal fee incurred, per unit price bid only. No additional disposal fees shall be paid other than what is listed herein. The CONTRACTOR shall provide, per pay item, documentation of the amount of debris removed in terms of tonnage. Tonnage shall be based on certified scale landfill receipts submitted to the COUNTY by the CONTRACTOR.

3. Payment

Payment for various items in the Bid will be made at the unit price and shall be compensation in full for furnishing all materials, labor, tools, equipment, traffic control and appurtenances necessary to complete the work in a satisfactory manner as specified. No additional payment will be made for work related to any item unless specifically indicated in the Bid.

4. Billing

The Contractor shall bill the Department of Transportation monthly upon completion and acceptance of the work utilizing the Contract Work Document. Billing shall include the unit areas satisfactorily cleaned for that billing period.

FINAL ACCEPTANCE

"Final Acceptance" shall mean a written final acceptance of the work by the Operations Division Manager or the Public Works Manager. The Operations Division Manager or the Public Works Manager shall make the final acceptance promptly after work has been completed in accordance with the Contract Documents and after inspection is made.

EQUIPMENT

All vehicles must be maintained in good repair, appearance and sanitary condition at all times. The County reserves the right to inspect equipment at any time to ascertain said conditions. The COUNTY's representative has the right to suspend sweeping operations until all items associated with the maintenance, appearance, and sanitary conditions are addressed. All equipment used for sweeping operations shall have appropriate watering systems to control dust during sweeping operations. Said watering systems shall be used during all sweeping operation. **Watering is not a separate pay item as associated with this item.**

MISCELLANEOUS**1. Dust Control and Permits**

The CONTRACTOR shall take whatever steps, procedures, or means to prevent abnormal dust conditions due to his operations in connection with this Contract and, in accordance with the requirements of all applicable air pollution control regulations. All sweeping equipment used by the CONTRACTOR shall comply with current PM - 10 requirements under dust control and in strict conformance with Pima County Department of Environmental Quality Control. **This is not a pay item.**

2. Overtime

The contract does not allow for an overtime rate as a separate pay item. The CONTRACTOR may work in the evening on non-residential streets only after obtaining written permission from the COUNTY.

3. Inspection

The COUNTY Inspector may direct attention of the CONTRACTOR to unsatisfactory work, but such inspection shall not relieve the CONTRACTOR from any obligation to provide completed work that is satisfactory in every particular.

In case of any dispute arising between the COUNTY Inspector and the CONTRACTOR as to the manner of performing work, the COUNTY Inspector shall have the authority to suspend the work until the question and issue can be referred to and decided by the Operations Division Manager.

COUNTY Inspectors are not authorized to revoke, alter, enlarge, relax, or release any requirements of these specifications and are not to issue instruction contrary to the plans and specification.

COUNTY Inspectors shall in no case act as foreman or perform other duties for the CONTRACTOR or interfere with the management of the work by the CONTRACTOR.

Inspection or supervision by the COUNTY shall not be considered as direct control of the individual workman and his work. The direct control shall be solely the responsibility of the CONTRACTOR's foreman and superintendent.

4. Supervision by Contractor

The CONTRACTOR shall supervise and direct all work and equipment scheduled, extra, or emergency. The CONTRACTOR shall be solely responsible for the means, methods, techniques, sequences, and procedures for work. The CONTRACTOR shall employ a qualified supervisor who shall be designated in writing by the CONTRACTOR as the CONTRACTOR's representative. The cost of providing a supervisor shall be considered incidental to the bid item in this contract. The CONTRACTOR shall provide this information at the time of the pre-construction meeting between the COUNTY and the CONTRACTOR. The supervisor shall have full authority to act on behalf of the CONTRACTOR and all communications given to the CONTRACTOR. The supervisor shall be available at all times as required to perform adequate supervision and coordination of the work.

5. Guarantee

Bidder shall guarantee that workmanship and work performed pursuant to this agreement complies with the specifications listed herein and conform with the generally accepted procedures, practices, and methods that are appropriate for the services provided, as well as all applicable Federal, State and County laws and regulations.

Any defective workmanship, materials or equipment discovered prior to or during the term of this contract shall be corrected at no expense, and to the satisfaction of Pima County.

6. Claims and Disputes, and Arbitration

Pima Association of Governments (PAG) Standard Specifications for Public Improvements, 2015 Edition, Sections 105-18 and 105-19 shall apply to this contract.
