1. **INVOCATION**

The invocation was given by Pastor Philip Kruis, Rincon Mountain Presbyterian Church.

2. **PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

All present joined in the Pledge of Allegiance.

3. **PERSONAL POINTS OF PRIVILEGE**

Supervisor Elías congratulated Supervisor Carroll for having won the Tikun Olam Award from the Tucson Hebrew Academy.

Supervisor Elías remembered the accomplishments of Rick Rhey, Executive Director of the Southern Arizona Housing Center.

Supervisor Carroll spoke regarding his exoneration of harassment allegations, referencing an article in the Arizona Daily Star.

Supervisor Miller congratulated Bill Beard, District 1 appointment to the Election Integrity Commission, for his appointment to the Secretary of State Elect's Transition Committee.

4. **PAUSE 4 PAWS**

The Pima County Animal Care Center showcased an animal available for adoption.

5. **CONVENE TO EXECUTIVE SESSION**

It was moved by Supervisor Elías, seconded by Supervisor Carroll and unanimously carried by a 5-0 vote, to convene to Executive Session at 9:16 a.m.

6. **RECONVENE**

The meeting reconvened at 10:30 a.m. All members were present.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

7. Pursuant to A.R.S. §38-431.03(A) (3) and (4), for legal advice and direction regarding potential actions regarding agreements with Select Development and Construction, Inc. for roadway construction work on La Cañada and Magee Road.

Chris Straub, Chief Civil Deputy County Attorney, stated the case concerned the Select Development and Construction, Inc. contracts for roadway improvements on La Cañada and Magee Road. The Pima County Attorney's Office sought authority to proceed as discussed in Executive Session.

It was moved by Supervisor Elías, seconded by Supervisor Valadez and unanimously carried by a 5-0 vote, to proceed as discussed in Executive Session.

8. Pursuant to A.R.S. §38-431.03(A) (3) and (4), for legal advice and direction regarding Broadway Realty and Trust, Inc., et al. v. Pima County, et al., Pima County Superior Court Case No. C20145528, Stewart Title and Trust as Trustee under Trust No. 3701, et al. v. Pima County Board of Supervisors, et al., Pima County Superior Court Case No. C20144304, the claim against Pima County and its officials and employees by Joseph Cesare and S.V.A. Corporation, and Pima County Resolution No. 2014-82 authorizing the abandonment and re-plat of Star Valley Blocks 4, 7 and 8.

Chris Straub, Chief Civil Deputy County Attorney, reported the Pima County Attorney's Office sought authority to proceed as discussed in Executive Session and continue to defend the following lawsuits and claims:

- Stewart Title and Trust of Tucson, as Trustee under Trust No. 3701 and USH/SVA Star Valley, L.L.C. v. Pima County Board of Supervisors, et al., Pima County Superior Court Case No. C20144304, related to a dispute over offsite transportation improvements for the Star Valley residential development and re-platting of Star Valley Blocks 4, 7, and 8.
- Broadway Realty and Trust v. Pima County, et al., Pima County Superior Court Case No. C20145528, related to the Star Valley Commercial Center development plan and the median to be constructed adjacent to the Commercial Center at the intersection of Wade Road and Valencia Road as part of the Valencia Road Improvement Project.
- Notice of Claim by Joseph Cesare, in his personal capacity and as a shareholder of SVA Corporation, dated August 13, 2014, alleging defamation

and other damages arising out of statements made by Pima County personnel in relation to the Star Valley off-site transportation improvements and trails located in the Star Valley residential development.

It was moved by Supervisor Elías, seconded by Supervisor Valadez and unanimously carried by a 5-0 vote, to proceed as discussed in Executive Session.

9. Pursuant to A.R.S. §38-431.03(A) (3) and (4), for legal advice and direction regarding a possible lawsuit related to the application of the Tucson/Pima County Outdoor Lighting Code to mining activities by HudBay Minerals, Inc. and its subsidiary Rosemont Copper Company at the proposed Rosemont Copper mine site located in the northeastern Santa Rita Mountains.

Without objection, this item was continued to the Board of Supervisors' Meeting of December 2, 2014.

10. Pursuant to A.R.S. §38-431.03(A) (3) and (4), for legal advice and direction regarding a settlement offer in Arizona La Cholla, et al., v. Pima County, et al., United States District Court Case No. 4:14-CV-01904.

Chris Straub, Chief Civil Deputy County Attorney, stated the case regarded a settlement offer concerning Arizona La Cholla, L.L.C. et al., v. Pima County, et al., United States District Court Case No. 4:14-CV-01904 involving various claims by Arizona La Cholla and its principal, Steven Nannini, involving the proposed development of property located at the southwest corner of Magee Road and La Cholla Boulevard. He explained that Arizona La Cholla and Mr. Nannini offered to settle the matter upon payment by Pima County of \$100,000.00. He stated the Pima County Attorney's Office recommended the settlement offer be rejected and sought authority to proceed as discussed in Executive Session.

It was moved by Supervisor Elías, seconded by Supervisor Valadez and unanimously carried by a 5-0 vote, to proceed as discussed in Executive Session.

It was moved by Supervisor Valadez, seconded by Supervisor Elías and unanimously carried by a 5-0 vote, to approve the item, effective immediately.

13. Call to the Audience

Discussion and vote on moving the Call to the Audience to the beginning of the meeting in order to better accommodate members of the public who wish to address the Board. (District 1)

Without objection, this item was removed from the agenda.

14. CALL TO THE PUBLIC

Sheldon Gutman addressed the Board about the Affordable Health Care Act, Kartchner Caverns and spring training baseball.

Schuyler Hilts, Pima County Medical Society, spoke about gun violence as a public health issue and instituting background checks for gun shows.

David Robertson, Save Saguaro National Park, spoke in opposition to the proposed bike ranch.

Jason Brow, CEO of a non-profit in the Picture Rocks area, addressed the Board regarding conflicts of interest in the County's application process for non-profit funding.

Nancy Newman commented on the Proposition 415 Bond Election, homeless children and the office budgets of the Supervisors.

Alex Bissett addressed the Board about Supervisor discretionary spending.

Mary Murphy spoke about Green Valley, censorship and fraud.

Dan Sullivan commented on news accounts regarding harassment allegations.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

15. Board of Supervisors' Meeting Time

Discussion and vote on holding one Board of Supervisors' meeting a month at 7:00 p.m. in order to allow those who are unable to attend during the morning hours, an opportunity to participate and observe in meetings. (District 1)

Supervisor Miller stated her office had several requests for evening meetings which would provide more opportunity for working individuals to attend and participate in the process at Board meetings.

It was moved by Supervisor Miller and seconded by Supervisor Carroll to approve this item. No vote was taken at this time.

Supervisor Carroll said his office had looked into this after a request by a constituent in 2011 and offered that town hall meetings within his district had been very successful in engaging the public.

Supervisor Elías stated that community outreach and involvement with neighborhood associations were a more effective way for people to have personal time with their Supervisor and understand the issues.

Chair Bronson explained that night meetings had been held when there were issues of particular public interest and stated other entities had experienced less participation at night.

Upon roll call, the motion failed by a 2-3 vote, Supervisors Elías, Valadez and Chair Bronson voted "Nay."

16. Procurement Department and Department of Transportation - Policy and Procedures for Department of Transportation Projects

Discussion and vote on Pima County procurement policies and process plan for all transportation projects including: the use of local, state and federal funds and the development of a pre-qualification plan for Pima County transportation projects. The objective is to ensure Pima County follows a robust process which facilitates documentation, efficient and auditable results. (District 1)

Chris Straub, Chief Civil Deputy County Attorney, explained that at issue was the design, bid and build system for horizontal projects, standard road projects, which are governed by A.R.S. Title 34. He stated that Title 34 did not provide authorization to counties to engage in a prequalification process for contractors.

Supervisor Miller expressed her intention to lobby the legislature for amendment of the statute and asked if it could be included in the County's legislative agenda. She then withdrew the item from the agenda without objection.

17. **Arizona Blind and Deaf Children's Foundation**

Allocation of \$5,000.00 from the Board of Supervisors' Contingency Fund to the Arizona Blind and Deaf Children's Foundation for their Stories that Soar Performances. (District 5)

It was moved by Supervisor Elías, seconded by Supervisor Valadez and carried by a 4-1 vote, Supervisor Miller voted "Nay," to approve the item.

18. **Luz Social Services**

Allocation of \$3,000.00 from the Board of Supervisors' Contingency Fund to Luz Social Services, Inc. for the Thanksgiving in the Barrio event on November 25, 2014. (District 5)

It was moved by Supervisor Elías, seconded by Supervisor Carroll and carried by a 4-1 vote, Supervisor Miller voted "Nay," to approve the item.

It was moved by Supervisor Valadez, seconded by Supervisor Miller and carried by a 4-0 vote, Supervisor Elías recused himself due to a potential conflict of interest, to approve the item.

COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR

20. **The University of Arizona Family and Community Medicine Mobile Health Program**

Staff recommends approval of an allocation from the Board of Supervisors' Contingency Fund in the amount of \$5,000.00 for The University of Arizona Family and Community Medicine Mobile Health Program.

It was moved by Supervisor Valadez, seconded by Supervisor Elías and carried by a 4-1 vote, Supervisor Miller voted "Nay," to approve the item.

21. **Quarterly Report on Collections**

Staff recommends acceptance of the Quarterly Report on Collections for the period ending June 30, 2014, and approval of the write-off requests in the amount of \$226,036.00.

It was moved by Supervisor Miller, seconded by Supervisor Elías and unanimously carried by a 5-0 vote, to approve the item.

22. **County Obligation for Animal Care Services Inside Cities and Towns**

Staff recommends the following:

1. Waive privilege regarding the County Attorney's September 29, 2014 Legal Opinion regarding the obligations of the County inside cities, towns and municipalities for the provision of animal care services.
2. Direct staff to continue to negotiate with all cities and towns to reach intergovernmental agreements that fund the increasing cost of animal care services by December 31, 2014.

It was moved by Supervisor Elías, seconded by Supervisor Carroll and unanimously carried by a 5-0 vote, to approve the item.

23. **Release of Supplemental General Fund Appropriation for Transportation Pavement Rehabilitation and Repair**

Chuck Huckelberry, County Administrator, summarized the information, options and recommendations regarding the 2015 Legislative Agenda and transportation funding.

The following speakers addressed the Board:

- Annette Jones, Golden Eagle Distributors
- David Stowell

They offered the following comments:

- A definite plan for road repairs in the Sabino Town and Country Estate area was requested.
- The estimated average daily traffic numbers used to prioritize pavement preservation funds were not accurate.
- Road improvements would attract quality businesses and jobs.

- The Board was encouraged to find additional funding sources for road repairs and infrastructure.
- The County has relied too much on Federal and State funding.
- The business community offered assistance to find solutions to funding issues.
- The longer roads went unrepaired, the higher the eventual cost.
- Poorly maintained roads had a negative impact on businesses.
- The business community was interested in the conditions of roads due to equipment damage, cost to businesses and employees and the image projected to businesses and families considering a move to Pima County.
- Businesses, communities and governments working together was the best way to solve the problem.
- Preliminary results of a public opinion poll completed by Tucson Association of Realtors were shared.
- The public needed to be educated regarding the County budget.
- If transportation and road issues were not shown to be a priority, getting support for any other bond package or revenue stream would be difficult.
- The process of reporting potholes, requesting repairs and getting status updates needed to be improved.
- Lottery revenues were a potential funding source option.

It was moved by Supervisor Elías, seconded by Supervisor Valadez and unanimously carried by a 5-0 vote, to approve the item.

24. **Recommended Legislative Agenda for 2015**

RESOLUTION NO. 2014 - 108, of the Board of Supervisors in Pima County, adopting a Pima County Legislative Program for 2015.

It was moved by Supervisor Elías, seconded by Supervisor Valadez and unanimously carried by a 5-0 vote, to adopt the Resolution.

25. **County Contribution to the Operating Expenses of the New Oro Valley Children's Museum**

Staff recommends approval of an allocation from the Board of Supervisors' Contingency Fund in the amount of \$6,250.00 to support the operating expenses of the Children's Museum in Oro Valley and to request the Outside Agency Review Committee annualize this expense at \$12,500.00 in Fiscal Year 2015/16.

It was moved by Supervisor Miller, seconded by Supervisor Elías and unanimously carried by a 5-0 vote, to approve the item.

26. **Allocation Request for the Microbusiness Advancement Center's Grant Application for Economic Development in Ajo**

Staff recommends approval of an allocation from the Board of Supervisors' Contingency Fund in the amount of \$25,000.00 for the Microbusiness Advancement Center's Rural Business Enterprise Grant from the U.S. Department of Agriculture for use in Pima County.

It was moved by Supervisor Elías, seconded by Chair Bronson and carried by a 4-1 vote, Supervisor Miller voted "Nay," to approve the item.

27. **Contingency Fund Request for the January 8th Memorial Foundation**

Staff recommends approval of an allocation of the Board of Supervisors' Contingency Fund in the amount of \$10,000.00 to defray the administrative cost of the Tucson-Pima Arts Council, the artist selection and the design process associated with the January 8th Memorial adjacent to the historic Pima County Courthouse.

It was moved by Supervisor Elías, seconded by Chair Bronson and carried by a 4-1 vote, Supervisor Miller voted "Nay," to approve the item.

28. **Board of Supervisors' Contingency Allocation for Major League Soccer Preseason Training**

Staff recommends approval of an allocation of the Board of Supervisors' Contingency Fund for a maximum of \$190,000.00 to Visit Tucson for the promotion of 2015 Major League Soccer preseason training at the Kino Sports Complex in Pima County.

It was moved by Supervisor Elías, seconded by Supervisor Valadez and carried by a 4-1 vote, Supervisor Miller voted "Nay," to approve the item.

29. **Proposed Allocations of Decision Packages Included in the Fiscal Year 2014/15 Adopted Budget**

Staff recommends approval of the following changes to the Fiscal Year 2014/15 Adopted Budget:

A. Certificates of Participation - \$5,000,782.00

Approve the operating transfer of \$5,000,782.00 in cash from General Fund Contingency to the Debt Service Fund to fund the annual debt service for Certificates of Participation for FY 2014/15.

B. Sheriff - \$2,581,407.00

1. Move \$270,000.00 of expenditure authority from General Fund Contingency to the Sheriff's General Fund base operating budget to address the continuing growth in costs.

2. Move \$162,034.00 of expenditure authority from General Fund Contingency to the Sheriff's General Fund base operating budget to fund three corrections officers for the new Justice Court.
 3. Approve the operating transfer of \$1,768,800.00 in cash from General Fund Contingency to the new Information Technology Internal Service Fund to provide the hardware, software, server and storage needs of the Sheriff's Department and to meet other information technology infrastructure needs. See Decision Package E below.
 4. Retain \$380,573.00 of funding earlier earmarked for funding six Sheriff's positions previously funded by grants within the Contingency Fund. If the Sheriff wishes to fund these positions, existing General Fund operating budget funds should be used.

Allocate \$1,800,000.00 of expenditure authority from General Fund Contingency to the Contract Attorney General Fund base operating budget.
- D. Stadium District - \$2,177,931.00
Approve the operating transfer of \$2,177,931.00 of cash to the Stadium District Special Revenue Fund.
- E. Information Technology - \$6,073,113.00
*Recommendations 1 through 3 total the \$6,073,113.00 from this Decision Package.
- *1. Allocate \$1,582,564.00 of expenditure authority from General Fund Contingency to the Information Technology General Fund base operating budget to support additional personnel, software and maintenance costs listed in the original Information Technology decision package and not included in the attached initiatives.

It was moved by Supervisor Valadez, seconded by Supervisor Elías and unanimously carried by a 5-0 vote, to approve the item.

ELECTIONS

30. November 4, 2014 General Election Canvass

Pursuant to A.R.S. §16-642, canvass of the election results for the November 4, 2014 General Election.

Kevin Hamilton, attorney representing the Ron Barber campaign, addressed the Board and requested the Board delay certifying the election pending an investigation of uncounted ballots.

Eric Spencer, attorney representing the Martha McSally campaign, argued the Board's statutory authority regarding the canvass. He stated the issues raised by Mr. Hamilton were matters for a court to decide.

Chris Straub, Chief Civil Deputy County Attorney, addressed issues raised by the speakers and explained that any source of inquiry made by the Board in regard to the canvass should concern missing precinct returns. He stated that the issues in question could not be pursued until the canvass was accepted and confirmed, and the Secretary of State's declaration made.

Supervisor Valadez requested clarification on the election and ballot process.

Brad Nelson, Elections Director, reviewed the processes of counting for early ballots, ballots voted at the polls on election day and provisional ballots submitted at polling places. He addressed ballot recounting and auditing and the verification process by the County Recorder. He explained that a misprint for the ballot on the Continental School District Governing Board necessitated the reprinting of separate ballots for that race only. Mr. Nelson stated that confusion resulted in the submission of the General Election and Continental School District Election ballots in the incorrect envelopes which resulted in those ballots not being included in the original General Election count. He reported that once it was discovered, the ballots were counted for the appropriate elections.

Supervisor Miller requested a report detailing the number of ballots counted in the General Election versus the Continental School District Election for the affected precincts and recommended future ballots be reviewed by candidates or jurisdictions for accuracy before printing. She voiced concern with the current audit process.

Mr. Nelson reported on the current process for the early ballot audit process pursuant to the Secretary of State's Election Manual. He added that the new election tabulation equipment may allow for an audit by precinct.

Mr. Nelson explained the timeline, process and possible variances for the mandatory recount as directed by the Courts for the Congressional District 2 race.

Supervisor Valadez stated the issues raised needed to be adjudicated by the Courts and that the Board did not have the authority.

It was moved by Supervisor Valadez and seconded by Supervisor Miller to canvass the election. Upon roll call, the motion carried by a 4-1 vote, Supervisor Elías voted "Nay."

Any other uses on the site will require, at a minimum, a public hearing before the Board of Supervisors. Adherence to the revised sketch plan as approved at public hearing, including depicted augmentation of natural areas. Uses are restricted to a tea room, café which is comparable in type, scale and intensity, or a single detached residence. Any further change in use is a substantial change which first shall require a Comprehensive Plan amendment to Neighborhood Activity Center.~~

Standard Conditions and Requirements

1. The property owner shall:
 - A. Record the necessary development-related covenants as determined appropriate by the various County agencies.
 - B. Provide development-related assurances as required by the appropriate agencies.
 - C. Submit a title report (current within 60 days) to Development Services evidencing ownership of the property prior to the development-related covenants and any required dedications.
2. There shall be no further lot splitting or subdividing of residential development without the written approval of the Board of Supervisors.
3. Access shall be located as depicted on the sketch plan submitted with the application.
4. Upon the effective date of the rezoning ordinance associated with this rezoning, the owner(s)/developer(s) shall have a continuing responsibility to remove buffelgrass (*Pennisetum ciliare*) from the property. Acceptable methods of removal include chemical treatment, physical removal, or other known effective means of removal. This obligation also transfers to any future owners of property within the rezoning site and Pima County may enforce this rezoning condition against the current any future property owner. Prior to issuance of the certificate of compliance, the owner(s)/developer(s) shall record a covenant, to run with the land, memorializing the terms of this condition.
5. The property owner shall adhere to the sketch plan as approved at public hearing.
6. In the event the subject property is annexed, the property owner shall adhere to all applicable rezoning conditions, including, but not limited to, development conditions which require financial contributions to, or construction of infrastructure, including without limitation, transportation, flood control, or sewer facilities.
7. The property owner shall execute and record the following disclaimer regarding Proposition 207 rights. "Property Owner acknowledges that neither the rezoning of the Property nor the conditions of rezoning give Property Owner any rights, claims or causes of action under the Private Property Rights Protection Act (Arizona Revised Statutes Title 12, chapter 8, article 2.1). To the extent that the rezoning or conditions of rezoning may be construed to give Property Owner any rights or claims under the Private Property Rights Protection Act, Property Owner hereby waives any and all such rights and/or claims pursuant to A.R.S. §12-1134(l)."

Standard Conditions and Requirements per the Pima County Zoning Code

The Pima County Zoning Code requires Fire Stations in all zones require a conditional use permit.

G. Fire Stations.

1. Scope:
 - a. Fire stations and related facilities are permitted in all zones, subject to the requirements of this subsection.
 - b. The location of any proposed fire station shall be discussed with county staff prior to proceeding with the provisions of this subsection.
2. A Type 2 Conditional Use Permit with a hearing notification area of five hundred feet is required in accordance with Chapter 18.97.
3. Development standards.
 - a. Fire stations shall meet the requirements of the zone in which located, except that the minimum site area in:
 - 1) CR-2 zoning shall be thirty-six thousand square feet;
 - 2) CR-3, CR-4, CR-5, TR, CMH-1 and CMH-2 zoning shall be ten thousand square feet.
 - b. All fire station sites shall have a minimum one hundred feet of frontage for primary access on a road shown on the Major Streets and Scenic Routes Plan.
4. Performance standards:
 - a. Off-street parking: All parking for employees and visitors shall be off-street and shall be provided in accordance with Chapter 18.75 (Off-street Parking and Loading Standards).
 - b. Screening: An aesthetically pleasing visual screen shall buffer all outdoor facilities, including parking areas, when the site is either zoned for, or adjacent to, rural or residential zoning.
 - c. Traffic safety: The provision of access for emergency vehicles shall include appropriate methods to minimize the endangerment of passing vehicles.
5. Development review: A development plan shall be submitted and reviewed in accordance with Chapter 18.71 (Development Plan Standards).

Special Conditions

1. This conditional use permit is for a fire station only, together with those ancillary activities that normally and routinely accompany this use. No other commercial uses are approved for the site.
2. The proposed use shall generally conform with the location and particulars as shown on the conceptual site plan that was submitted by the applicant in conjunction with this conditional use permit application.
3. The owner/applicant shall procure whatever variances and/or modifications of street standards that are required to facilitate the site plan as proposed. For the record, the Hearing Administrator is in support of the separate approvals needed.
4. The fire station will operate in accordance with the Rural Metro Station No. 71 Standard Operating Guidelines (SOG) regarding the use of sirens and warning lights near the existing residential neighborhoods. The SOG's are attached and considered a material part of this decision.

Supervisor Valadez excused himself from the dais.

Jim Portner, Hearing Administrator, reported there had been no public objections to the permit.

57. Colossal Cave Mountain Park Performance Audit Report and Recommendations

Staff recommends the following:

1. Approve keeping Colossal Cave Mountain Park open under the current operating agreement, which expires in August 2015, with increased operational oversight of Escabrosa, Inc., from the Pima County Economic Development and Tourism Department with assistance from other appropriate County departments and make necessary repairs to ensure safe operation until a new park operator can be secured.
2. Exercise the option to not renew the current operating agreement with Escabrosa upon its expiration on August 3, 2015.
3. Direct staff to prepare a Request for Proposals to find a qualified and experienced park operator with investment capital and appropriate vision to develop Colossal Cave Mountain Park.
4. Direct staff to develop and present a short-term plan with cost estimates within 90 days to the Board of Supervisors that will stabilize Colossal Cave Mountain Park infrastructure and make immediate repairs and improvements necessary for safe and viable operation.
5. Direct staff to develop mid- and long-term plans to develop a sustainable attraction that respects the natural resources and cultural and historical values of Colossal Cave Mountain Park.

Tom Moulton, Director of Economic Development and Tourism, introduced John Baker, Committee Chair, who, along with Mike Holmes, Project Manager, presented the report and gave the following recommendations of the Colossal Cave Mountain Park Performance Audit Committee:

1. Keep Colossal Cave Mountain Park open with increased oversight and make necessary repairs.
2. Do not renew the current operating agreement with Escabrosa in August 2015.
3. Direct staff to prepare an RFP to find a qualified and experienced park operator.

Chuck Huckelberry, County Administrator, reviewed current budgeting, but stated the Bond Advisory Committee was exploring capital funding, pending the audit report and action by the Board of Supervisors.

- Colossal Cave Mountain Park was an asset to Pima County.

- Geotourism was a strong marketing attribute for the area.

Chair Bronson noted that all other requests to speak or comments submitted on this item were in support.

It was moved by Supervisor Carroll, seconded by Supervisor Elías and unanimously carried by a 5-0 vote, to approve the Audit Committee recommendations.
