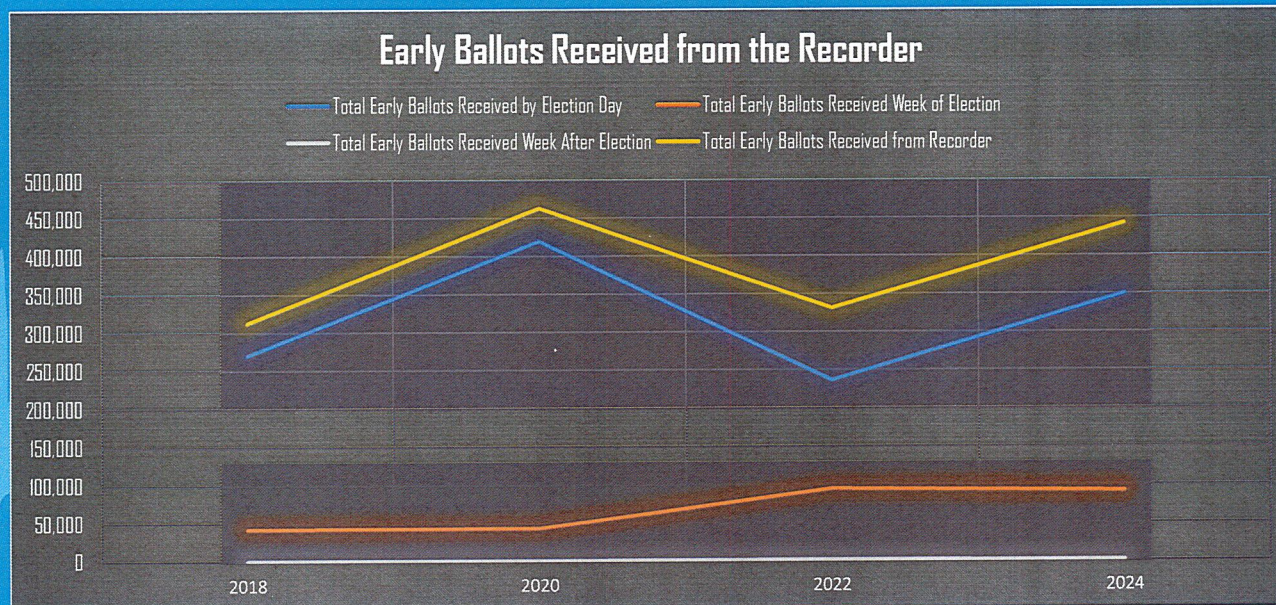

# Lessons Learned and Future Concerns

## We Learned:

Vote Centers – size matters

Early Ballot Processing – flexibility critical

Ballot Duplication – options to expedite processing needed

Receiving Stations – increase the number of locations

## We are concerned about:

Early ballot processing at vote centers in 2026

New legislation extending early voting on Monday nights



## Accomplishments

Improved training

Streamlined and expedited poll worker payroll

Reduced the amount of printer problems encountered on Election Day

Implemented electronic adjudication, reducing the number of ballots requiring duplication thereby expediting the counting of ballots

The creation of Pima.vote as a central location to obtain trusted election information

Educating voters about the two-card ballot
