Subject: Appointment of Chief Deputy Treasurer Jake Martin to Pima County Treasurer

Dear Members of the Board of Supervisors,

I am writing to you today with the sincere hope that my story will help solidify your decision to appoint Chief Deputy Treasurer Jake Martin to the Treasurer position recently vacated by Brian Johnson.

As you are well aware, Brian Johnson resigned from his position as Pima County Treasurer following severe allegations of sexual harassment and inappropriate workplace behavior. Unfortunately, I was one of the victims of his actions. On multiple occasions, Mr. Johnson attempted to coerce me into joining him for "dates." While in the office, he went out of his way to approach me and speak to me while touching himself inappropriately.

During this incredibly traumatic time, the single person I was able to confide in was Jake Martin. Mr. Martin did everything within his power to help me report these violations through the proper channels, while continuously providing a safe space and an empathetic ear. If Mr. Martin had not handled this situation with such immense compassion and professionalism, I doubt I would have been able to remain with this office. Even after Mr. Johnson's resignation, Mr. Martin never assumed the damage was automatically repaired. He has continued to show unwavering support for myself and the other victims in the office as we recover from a deeply hostile environment, never once turning anyone away or invalidating our experiences.

Throughout this crisis, and indeed since the very start of Mr. Johnson's term, Mr. Martin has effectively been performing the duties of both the Treasurer and the Deputy Treasurer. The entirety of the Pima County Treasurer's Office, including the victims of Mr. Johnson's harassment, has witnessed his incredible effort and leadership. With 11 years of service to the Treasurer's Office, I have worked under multiple Treasurers and I can state with absolute confidence that Jake Martin is by far the most qualified person for this position. Furthermore, appointing Mr. Martin ensures vital operational stability for the department's ongoing projects and day-to-day operations. By promoting an internal leader who possesses an operational understanding of Arizona statutory duties and local tax codes the County will avoid the prolonged transition period associated with introducing an outside candidate unfamiliar with our specific administrative processes.
