I am requesting you vote **NO** to centralized Voting Centers and E-Poll books. The proposal will disenfranchise Pima County voters.

Research shows that consolidating polling places by creating centralized Voting Centers suppresses voter turnout. This is particularly true for minority and low-income voters. Voting Centers cause confusion on where to go, and forces voters to put their health and safety at risk by standing in long lines and in crowded unsafe conditions. Reducing voting locations by 57% would make it less convenient for people to vote on Election Day or to drop off their Early Ballots.

E-Poll books are a disaster: they're connected to the internet, have no uniform standards, are easily hackable, and frequently malfunction. E-Poll books have contributed to chaos in multiple states with their malfunctions, which has caused excessive delays, preventing people from voting.

Voting Centers and E-Poll books separately or together equal the definition of **Voter Suppression** and is **UNACCEPTABLE**. Pima County needs to earn back the trust of voters by ensuring our local precinct voting locations aren't consolidated, and there's no change to our paper Poll books. This is **NOT** the time to make a complete overhaul of voting operations in Pima County, so I request you vote **NO** to centralized Voting Centers and E-Poll books.

I request the following comment becomes part of the Agenda comments for the Board of Supervisors Meeting of Tuesday, February 15, 2022.

The election integrity committee should be commended for looking into this important issue. Free and Fair elections are paramount and unless the committee can insure that every voter is a valid Pima County resident, it's a futile effort. Important components of voting are the signature and identification verification with current voter rolls, photo ID, proof of residency, and proof of citizenship. Additionally the changes being proposed should provide the ability to release a list of who is eligible to vote prior to the election; and shortly after the election (within 5-7 days) the record of votes cast, ballot images, and the portable file of who voted should be available. I suggest before proceeding significant research is necessary.

Vote Centers versus neighborhood-based precincts can mean more options for voters:

- Convenience as voters can use any vote center in the county (turnout may increase)
- Financial savings — Fewer locations to staff mean Election Day expenses are reduced.
- Because it is more automated there will be less need for manual checks/handwritten reconciliations
- Workers may help voters with other issues (registering to vote and other election-related questions)

but add complexities as voters can use any vote center in the county:

- Staff and particularly volunteer training will be significant - and there will be less volunteers from the community who frequently recognize neighbors.
- Additional staff costs may be incurred as long-term temporary workers may be needed rather than one-day paid volunteers.
- The equipment to produce appropriate ballot for each voter either touchscreen machines that can be reset for each voter or "print-on-demand" equipment will be necessary.
- Drop off locations are insecure.
- Electronic technology is subject to disruption of the transmission of information and other malfunctions, and the physical security of the data involved.

Most importantly

- Change in tradition can cause confusion if not well publicized and explained to the public. The mistrust among citizens regarding the manipulation of electronic transmissions requires careful planning and a slow introduction.
