# \*Project Title/Description:

Fiscal Agent Pima County / Emergency Food and Shelter to Families and Individuals encountered by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS)

#### \*Purpose:

This amendment through March 31, 2023 will allow Catholic Community Services of Southern Arizona, Inc. (CCS) to continue providing services as a Pima County subrecipient of FEMA Emergency Food and Shelter Program, Humanitarian Relief 2022 funds. Services are only for U.S. southern border asylum seekers released by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security agencies. Services include food and shelter at the Casa Alitas Welcome Center (CAWC) and at overflow hotels which includes individuals who cannot be housed in congregate settings due to COVID-19 spacing restrictions. Other services include the facilitation of transportation.

#### \*Procurement Method:

This Subrecipient Agreement is a non-Procurement contract and not subject to Procurement rules.

#### \*Program Goals/Predicted Outcomes:

Reimbursement of eligible expenditures including CCS staff at CAWC and hotels as well as food and supportive services.

#### \*Public Benefit:

Safeguard the health and safety of Pima County by humanely and expeditiously facilitating the movement of asylum seekers, from the point of release by federal authorities in the community onward to their final destination.

## \*Metrics Available to Measure Performance:

Daily logs of migrants served, daily logs of meals served, and spreadsheet reflecting actual expenses incurred.

#### \*Retroactive:

Yes. In mid-November 2022, FEMA EFSP administration informed Pima County Department of Grants Management & Innovation (GMI) that no spend-down extensions for Humanitarian Relief 2022 (HR22) funding would be granted past December 31, 2022. GMI appealed and on December 13, 2022, the FEMA EFSP National Board voted to allow a spend-down extension of HR22 funds for Pima County to March 31, 2023. After the appeal was approved, GMI worked to finalize the extension with FEMA EFSP administration; this work was completed by December 19. GMI then worked with Catholic Community Services (CCS) to determine how much funding to add to this subrecipient amendment that CCS could assure would be spent down completely by March 31, 2023. Once these discussions were complete, amendment approval process commenced between GMI and the Pima County Attorney's Office for approval as to form. All of this amendment-related finalization work was completed by January 17, 2023. At that point, per County Administration and Clerk of the Board deadlines, the earliest BOS meeting available was February 7, 2023. If this amendment is not approved, there will be no funding to cover CCS's costs.

# FEDERAL FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE SUBAWARD AMENDMENT THREE

# 1. Background and Purpose.

1.1. Background. On June 22, 2021, Pima County ("County") and Catholic Community Services of Southern Arizona, Inc. ("Subrecipient"), entered into the above-referenced Agreement ("Agreement") to provide emergency food and shelter for both COVID-19 positive and COVID-19 negative families and individuals encountered by DHS. County, as Grantee, received federal grant funding from the EFSP Supplemental Funding Program to provide services to asylum seekers. In addition, the Pima County Emergency Food and Shelter Program Local Board identified Pima County Grants Management & Innovation (GMI) as the Fiscal Agent for the jurisdiction. The EFSP Supplemental Funds program for Humanitarian Relief 2022 has been extended through March 31, 2023.

- 1.2. The Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2022, Pub. L. No. 117-103 was signed into law on March 15, 2022. The Act provides \$150 million for the Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) Emergency Food and Shelter Program (EFSP) to provide humanitarian relief to families and individuals encountered by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS). FEMA awarded the funds to the National Board on April 15, 2022. The program's existing grant funds delivery-structure and public-private partnership makes it a viable means for providing funds quickly to organizations providing humanitarian relief to families and individuals encountered by DHS.
- 1.3. Purpose. This amendment, by extending the term of the Agreement, enables the parties to continue to spend down FEMA EFSP Humanitarian Relief 2022 funding and increase Subrecipient's funding for costs of providing emergency food and shelter to asylum seekers when they are released from U.S. Border Patrol custody and receive services at the Casa Alitas Welcome Center or at hotels/motels for overflow from Casa Alitas and for individuals who cannot be housed in traditional congregate settings due to COVID-19 spacing restrictions. These services keep legally present, homeless, immigrant families off the streets and help them to reach their relatives or sponsors within the United States, which will improve community safety, and enhance the general and economic welfare of the inhabitants of the County and the City.
- 2. Term. This Amendment No. 3 commences on January 1, 2023, and will terminate on March 31, 2023. If the commencement date of the Term is before the signature date of the last party to execute this amendment, the parties will, for all purposes, deem the Agreement to have been in effect as of the commencement date.
- 3. Israel Boycott Certification. Pursuant to A.R.S. § 35-393.01, if Subrecipient engages in for-profit activity and has 10 or more employees, and if this Agreement has a value of \$100,000.00 or more, Subrecipient certifies it is not currently engaged in, and agrees for the duration of this Contract to not engage in, a boycott of goods or services from Israel. This certification does not apply to a boycott prohibited by 50 U.S.C. § 4842 or a regulation issued pursuant to 50 U.S.C. § 4842.
- 4. Forced Labor of Ethnic Uyghurs. Pursuant to A.R.S. § 35-394, if Subrecipient engages in for-profit activity and has 10 or more employees, Subrecipient certifies it is not currently using, and agrees for the duration of this Agreement to not use (1) the forced labor of ethnic Uyghurs in the People's Republic of China; (2) any goods or services produced by the forced labor of ethnic Uyghurs in the People's Republic of China; and (3) any contractors, subcontractors, or suppliers that use the forced labor of any goods or services produced by the forced labor of ethnic Uyghurs in the People's Republic of China. If Subrecipient becomes aware during the term of Agreement that the Company is not in compliance with A.R.S. § 35-394, Subrecipient must notify County within five (5) business days and provide a written certification to County regarding compliance within one hundred eighty days (180).

### 5. Scope of Services.

5.1. Exhibit A (two pages) of the fully executed Agreement (06/22/2021), Section 4. Budget is replaced in its entirety with:

# 6. Compensation and Payment.

- 6.1. The NTE Amount in Section 4.1 of the Agreement is increased by \$1,502,211.28 so that County may reimburse Subrecipient up to \$2,314,304.33 for food, shelter and staffing including any sales taxes.
- 7. Counterparts. This Amendment No. 3 may be executed in counterparts, each of which, when taken together, will constitute one original contract.
