Dear Board of Supervisors:

On behalf of the Greater Vail Civic League, we are requesting your support for Agenda Item 22: Ordinance No. 2014-24 relating to Capital Improvements Funding within Development Fee Benefit Areas.

The rapid growth over the last decade and the changing demographics in the Rincon Valley/Vail area, have put a strain on the transportation system with increased congestion and safety concerns. The combining of the Mountain View Benefit Area and the Rincon Valley Benefit Area to create a single Southeast Benefit Area represents another important step forward to provide the county with the flexibility to meet the growing safety needs of school access, businesses, and residents in the southeast portion of the County, including Colossal Cave Road.

The Greater Vail Civic League recognizes that road maintenance and repair is a National, State, and Local issue and accessing adequate funds is a challenge.
