PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, Pima County is dedicated to protecting, promoting, and improving the health of all through responsible antibiotic use; and

WHEREAS, antibiotics are powerful, life-saving medicines used to treat bacterial infections; and

WHEREAS, antibiotic resistance can develop from inappropriate, unnecessary, or excessive use of antibiotics in human, animal, and environmental sectors; and

WHEREAS, inappropriate use of antibiotics allows bacteria to adapt and become resistant, making the antibiotics less effective over time; and

WHEREAS, if not mitigated, antibiotic resistance will adversely affect health outcomes by making common bacterial infections difficult or even impossible to treat; and

WHEREAS, appropriate use and disposal of antibiotics — from doctors to farmers to families — can reduce the impact of antibiotic-resistant pathogens on human, animal, and environmental health.

NOW, THEREFORE, **BE IT RESOLVED** that the Pima County Board of Supervisors hereby proclaims November 18 through November 24, 2025, to be:

"NATIONAL ANTIBIOTIC AWARENESS WEEK"

a time to promote the judicious use of antibiotics by healthcare professionals, veterinarians, and environmental and agricultural workers and prevent infections through everyday actions such as effective handwashing, staying current on vaccinations, and safe food handling among the general public. Pima County, alongside tribal, state, and national partners, encourages everyone to be part of the solution, because "It Takes All of Us."
