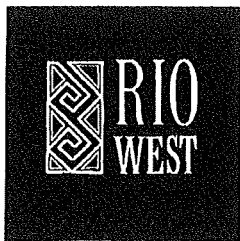

I have several concerns as I review the June 6th agenda and addendums...

To start Mr. Scott, your opinion piece that has led to agenda item #19 - Call to the public..... you board members were elected to serve the residents of the county and to be able to serve them well, wouldn't you need to hear what they have to say? With a population of roughly 1,057,000 and hearing (say for example) 20 residents - you're taking input from approximately .00189 % of your constituency.... It seems pretty crazy to me that if folks want you to hear their message and have taken the time and trouble to make their voices heard that you would hear them regardless of how it extends your bimonthly meetings. Some points can't be made in 2 minutes, let alone 3 as currently done.

The comparison to school district hearings to my mind is apples and oranges... they don't represent near the population that they do.

Agenda #31 - Visit Tucson... that contract ends on June 30 so you're giving them \$1,200,000 to spend in 3 weeks to promote Pima County and City of Tucson? I see it's newly found money but what will be the return on that investment? Is the city of Tucson kicking in on this too...I see we've already spent a lot. Why not do some boost to the Sheriff's office for public safety?

Agenda #42-47..Health Literacy....I see no cost at least to Pima County but as a US Taxpayer.....what does art have to do with making people healthier? Will a poster or storyteller really help someone be healthier - will the art create more places for residents to get medical services? I truly don't understand the connection/benefit.

Agenda #55... ill and possibly contagious immigrants being housed in a large metropolitan area, how does that keep us safer? These folks are bringing diseases to this country that there is no herd immunity for. Seems to me they would be housed and treated in a more rural area to there is less chance in it "accidentally" getting out in our community.
