Dear Pima County Supervisors,

I wrote you three days ago objecting to introducing electronic poll books and voting centers. Now I discover that you want to reduce voting locations from 232 to 100. Pima county has 9,189 square miles. The present 232 locations yields 39.6 square miles per voting location. Only 100 voting locations would yield 91.9 square miles per voting location. If you approve the 100 voting locations, you obviously make it harder for voters to reach the voting locations. Why are you doing this? Do not do this.

\*\*\*Instead, take the \$100,000, or \$10,000,000, or whatever the cost is, that you will contract out for the electronic poll books and voting centers, and the costs to reduce the number of voting locations, and do something to make voters smile instead of frown at your actions: Repave 100 yards or a mile or three of the terrible roads of Pima County. Let us see something tangible for our high taxes. Leave the voting system we know alone.
