*Purpose:				
For the Arizona Game and Fish Department to provide funds to Pima County Natural Resources, Parks and Recreation department for the maintenance of rural ranch roads which will allow the general public to access public lands for recreational purposes including hunting.

This IGA is a non-Procurement contract and not subject to Pro	curement rules.			
*Program Goals/Predicted Outcomes:				
To bring designated ranch roads up to a higher standard to pro	ovide public safety and recreational access to key ranch properties.			
*Public Benefit:				
The NRPR department manages over 200,000 acres of land, most of which are active cattle ranches with dirt roads that are open to recreation and subject to natural degradation from flooding and sheetflow. All of these uses and processes can create unsafe conditions on key roads. Maintaining these roads is a priority for public safety and for Pima County to carry out important land management functions. The Pima Countains taxpayer benefits whereby the Contractor will provide \$40,000 in funds to offset Pima County's road maintenance costs.

#### **COLLECTION AGREEMENT**

## BETWEEN THE ARIZONA GAME AND FISH DEPARTMENT AND PIMA COUNTY

This Collection Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into between the Arizona Game and Fish Department ("Department") and Pima County pursuant to the Memorandum of Understanding dated March 1, 2022 between the Arizona Game and Fish Commission ("Commission") and Pima County.

WHEREAS, the Department acts under the authority of the Commission and is authorized to enter into this Agreement pursuant to A.R.S. § 17-231(B)(7);

WHEREAS, Pima County is a political subdivision of the State of Arizona and is authorized to enter into this Agreement pursuant to A.R.S. §§ 11-251 and 11-952;

WHEREAS, the Department is responsible for securing and improving access to public lands;

WHEREAS, Pima County has adopted the biological goal of the Sonoran Desert Conservation Plan which is to protect all the plants and animals in Pima County and the ecosystem structure and function upon which they depend; and

WHEREAS, Pima County has purchased and leased over 200,000 acres of land to help meet the biological goal of the Sonoran Desert Conservation Plan; and

WHEREAS, these lands, which are primarily made up of working cattle ranches, are open to recreation, including hunting; and

WHEREAS, the Parties recognize and encourage a continued commitment to promote and improve public recreational access in the State of Arizona.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is the understanding of the Parties that:

## 1. The Department shall:

A. Provide Pima County Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00) to perform maintenance and restoration on a minimum of 25 miles of existing, publicly accessible dirt roads (Exhibit A). Payment shall be made within 30 days of receipt of invoice from Pima County.

### 2. Pima County shall:

- A. Perform maintenance on a minimum of 25 miles of existing, publicly accessible dirt roads owned or leased by Pima County (Exhibit A, B). Maintenance shall not require any new ground disturbance. Road maintenance will provide the general public greater access to hundreds of square miles of public land. Recreational opportunities on these lands will include hunting.
- B. Provide at least \$14,359 in cash match to complete the road maintenance activities. This represents 26% of the total project cost.
- C. The project shall be invoiced completely no later than June 14, 2024.

- 3. The Parties mutually agree:
- A. Maintenance shall only be performed on existing, publicly accessible dirt roads and shall require no new ground disturbance.
- 4. <u>Effective Date and Duration.</u> This Agreement is effective as of the last signature date and expires August 1, 2024.
- 5. Termination Generally. Either Party may terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days' written notice to the other Party. Upon termination, all work performed pursuant to this Agreement shall cease and Pima County shall not incur any new obligations for the terminated portion of the Agreement and shall cancel as many outstanding obligations as possible. The Department shall allow full credit to Pima County for Pima County's share of the non-cancelable obligations properly incurred by Pima County up to the effective date of the termination. Any remaining unobligated funding provided by the Department shall be returned to the Department within sixty (60) days after the effective date of termination.
- 6. <u>Notices.</u> All written notices concerning this Agreement shall be delivered in person or sent by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the Parties as follows:

- 7. <u>Non-discrimination</u>. In carrying out the terms of this agreement, the Parties agree to comply, to the extent they apply, with Executive Orders No. 2023-01 and No. 99-09 prohibiting discrimination in employment, the provisions of which are incorporated herein by reference.
- 8. <u>Audit.</u> In accordance with A.R.S. § 35-214, all books, accounts, reports, files, electronic data, and other records relating to this Agreement shall be subject at all reasonable times to inspection and audit by the State of Arizona for five (5) years after completion of this Agreement. Upon request, Party shall produce original of any and all such records.
- 9. Records Retention. In accordance with A.R.S. § 41-151.12 (Schedule GS 1018), all books, accounts, reports, files, electronic data, and other records relating to this Agreement shall be retained for six (6) years after completion of this Agreement.

- 10. <u>Arbitration.</u> In accordance with A.R.S. § 12-1518, the Parties agree to resolve all disputes arising out of or relating to this Agreement through arbitration, after exhausting applicable administrative review except as may be required by other applicable statutes.
- 11. <u>Termination for Conflict of Interest.</u> This Agreement is subject to termination pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-511.
- 12. Termination for Non-Availability of Funds. Every obligation of the Parties under this Agreement is conditioned upon the availability of funds appropriated or allocated for the payment of such obligation. If funds for the continuance of this Agreement are not allocated or are not available, this Agreement shall terminate automatically on the date of expiration of funding. In the event of such termination, the Parties shall incur no further obligation or liability under this Agreement other than for payment of services rendered prior to the expiration of funding.
- 13. <u>Indemnification</u>: Each party (as "Indemnitor") agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the other party (as "Indemnitee") from and against any and all claims, losses, liability, costs, or expenses (including reasonable attorney's fees) (hereinafter collectively referred to as "Claims") arising out of bodily injury of any person (including death) or property damage, but only to the extent that such Claims which result in vicarious/derivative liability to the Indemnitee are caused by the act, omission, negligence, misconduct, or other fault of the Indemnitor, its officers, officials, agents, employees, or volunteers.
- 14. Other Agreements. This Agreement in no way restricts either Party from participating in similar activities with other public or private agencies, organizations, or individuals.
- 15. <u>Compliance with Applicable Law.</u> All work performed pursuant to this Agreement shall be in compliance with all applicable state and federal laws and regulations.
- 16. <u>Severability.</u> In the event that any provision of this Agreement or portion thereof is held invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, such provision or portion thereof shall be severed from this Agreement and shall have no effect on the remaining provisions of this Agreement, which shall remain in full force and effect.
- 17. <u>Illegal Immigration</u>. To the extent required by law, the Parties agree to comply with Executive Order 2005-30, "Ensuring Compliance with Federal Immigration Laws by State Employers and Contractors," the provisions of which are hereby incorporated by reference.
- 18. Legal Arizona Worker's Act. If Contractor, under this Contract, furnishes labor, time or effort to County within the State of Arizona, the following applies: Contractor warrants that it will at all times during the term of this Contract comply with all federal immigration laws applicable to its employment of its employees, and with the requirements of A.R.S. § 44-4401 (together the "State and Federal Immigration Laws"). Contractor will further ensure that each subcontractor who performs any work for Contractor under this Contract likewise complies with the State and Federal Immigration Laws. A breach of this paragraph will be deemed a material breach of this Contract that subjects Contractor to penalties up to and including termination of the Contract. County retains the legal right to inspect the papers of any Contractor or subcontractor employee who works on the Contract to ensure that the Contractor or subcontractor is complying with this warranty.
