## **Funding Purpose:**

The contract agreement, no cost, assignment will allow Catholic Community Services of Southern Arizona dba St. Elizabeth's Health Center to transition the services provided under the agreement to St. Elizabeth's Health Center, Inc. (SEHC). SEHC became an independent corporation separated from Catholic Community Services of Southern Arizona on October 1, 2014. Both entities agree to the transfer of the contract. SEHC will continue to use funds appropriated in the original contact from the FY2014-2015 Pima County Outside Agency allocation.

# **Program Goals/Predicted Outcomes:**

The goal is to utilize Outside Agency funding for the provision of comprehensive care and coordination of health care needs for individuals who lack health insurance and/or financial resources to address their health issues.

#### **Public Benefit:**

SEHC will provide for the care and maintenance of the sick of the County through the coordination of health care services, disease prevention, health education and support.
