PimaREACH (Racial and Ethnic Approaches to Community Health) Coalition: Restoring Cultures of Health Among Native American and Hispanic/Latinx Communities in Pima County, Arizona.			

*Purpose:

The Pima County Health Department is one of fifty organizations nationally awarded a new 5-year REACH (Racial and Ethnic Approaches to Community Health) Grant from the Center for Disease Control and Prevention. REACH strategies "aim to improve health, prevent chronic disease and reduce health disparities among racial and ethnic populations with the highest risk, or burden, or chronic disease." The Pima County Health Department will work with community partners to improve health and quality of life of the Latino/a/x and Native American communities by working collaboratively on strategies related to: food and nutrition security, safe and accessible physical activity and nutrition and physical activity in early care and education settings.

For the REACH Year 1 contract, the award is \$539,256.00 for a 9-month project period (12/30/23 - 9/30/24). For years 2-5, PCHD can anticipate an award of \$719,008 for each of four additional 12-month project periods.

*Program Goals/Predicted Outcomes:

REACH aims to improve health, prevent chronic diseases, and reduce health disparities among our population at the highest risk/burden of chronic diseases including hypertension, heart disease, Type 2 diabetes, and obesity. The program addresses food and nutrition security, safe and accessible physical activity and nutrition and physical activity in early care and education settings.

*Public Benefit:

The REACH program benefits target communities by reducing the risk of chronic disease and decreasing health disparities.

*Metrics Available to Measure Performance:

The work plan submitted as part of the proposal includes outcome measures such as number of community support actions, number trained tribal and Latino community spokespersons, materials distributed to community-based organizations and other partners, and number of partnerships formed.

*Retroactive:

Yes, the Program Period begins 12/30/2023. PCHD was notified of award on 12/15/2023 and the item was scheduled for the next Board meeting date. If not approved, PCHD will not implement the REACH program.

AWARD INFORMATION

Incorporation: In addition to the federal laws, regulations, policies, and CDC General Terms and Conditions for Non-research awards at https://www.cdc.gov/grants/federalregulationspolicies/index.html, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) hereby incorporates Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) DP-23-0014 Racial and Ethnic Approaches to Community Health (REACH) and application dated April 11, 2023, as may be amended, which are hereby made a part of this Non-research award, hereinafter referred to as the Notice of Award (NoA).

Approved Funding: Funding in the amount of \$539,256.00 is approved for **Year 01** budget period, which is **December 30, 2023 through September 29, 2024**. All future year funding will be based on satisfactory programmatic progress and the availability of funds.

The federal award amount is subject to adjustment based on total allowable costs incurred and/or the value of any third party in-kind contribution when applicable.

Substantial Involvement by CDC: This is a cooperative agreement and CDC will have substantial involvement beyond site visits and regular performance and financial monitoring during the period of performance. CDC activities are intended to ensure the success of the project and will include the following:

- Provide ongoing programmatic and evaluation technical assistance
- Provide REACH program implementation guidance to recipients on identifying and implementing strategies and activities
- Facilitate collaborative opportunities with other CDC funded NOFO national and state partners
- Provide training on how to use web-based data entry system;
- Promote information sharing among recipients:
 - Facilitate routine conference calls, webinars, and other informational exchange
 - Develop mechanism for documenting and sharing lessons learned
- Convene recipient strategy-specific and equity trainings

Financial Assistance Mechanism: Cooperative Agreement.

Budget Revision Requirement: By January 29, 2024, the recipient must submit a revised budget with narrative justification, revised workplan, signed cover letter and SF424-A in GrantSolutions as an Amendment. Failure to submit the required information in a timely manner may adversely affect the future funding of this project. The following class categories of funding has been reduced based on the availability of funds: Salaries, Fringe Benefits, Travel, Equipment, Supplies, Contractual/Consultants, Other and Indirect Cost.

FUNDING RESTRICTIONS AND LIMITATIONS

Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) Restrictions:

- Recipients may not use funds for research.
- Recipients may not use funds for clinical care.
- Recipients may use funds only for reasonable program purposes, including personnel, travel, supplies, and services.
- Generally, recipients may not use funds to purchase furniture or equipment. Any such proposed spending

must be clearly identified in the budget.

- Reimbursement of pre-award costs generally is not allowed.
- Other than for normal and recognized executive-legislative relationships, no funds may be used for:
 - Publicity or propaganda purposes, for the preparation, distribution, or use of any material designed to support or defeat the enactment of legislation before any legislative body
 - The salary or expenses of any grant or contract recipient, or agent acting for such recipient, related to any activity designed to influence the enactment of legislation, appropriations, regulation, administrative action, or Executive order proposed or pending before any legislative body
 - See <u>Additional Requirement (AR) 12</u> for detailed guidance on this prohibition and additional guidance on lobbying for CDC recipients.
 - The direct and primary recipient in a cooperative agreement program must perform a substantial role in carrying out project outcomes and not merely serve as a conduit for an award to another party or provider who is ineligible.
