FY 2022 Collaborative Crisis Response and Intervention Training Program

*Purpose:

The Board of Supervisors' approval is requested to allow minor and routine modifications within our grant deliverable timeline. Due to delays in the hiring process and grant initiation taking longer than anticipated, the County is shifting two deliverables to later quarters within the grant timeline. No significant programmatic or financial impacts are associated with this modification, only a shift in completion dates. The project period (10/1/2022 - 9/30/2025) and the total amount accepted by the Board on November 1, 2022, remains unaltered. The grantor has approved the shift of these deliverables within the project timeline.

*Procurement Method:

Not Applicable.

*Program Goals/Predicted Outcomes:

By developing a deeper understanding of various perspectives, experiences, and conditions through Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) training, officers become more prepared to serve their community effectively and identify better alternatives to incarceration. Not only do these tools aid in preserving the safety of individuals in the community, but also of those on the front line. Law enforcement officers are uniquely positioned to be agents of change, as they are the first interceptors of the justice system, often seeing the disparate outcomes of behavioral health challenges and substance use disorders (SUDs) firsthand. Equipped with more knowledge and further insight, officers can ameliorate individual outcomes and be the catalysts for reducing disparities system-wide.

A few objectives outlined in the grant are: advance to a program rather than just a training, expand and enhance the current CIT course (current demand surpasses supply), develop and launch additional trainings (advanced and refresher courses), prepare for a local and national certification, make resources and materials available to rural, smaller agencies who may not be able to attend, and many other enhancements.

*Public Benefit:

CIT Training will improve outcomes for the community and officers while reducing incarceration, recidivism, and detention costs. Additionally, this training assists in building strong relationships of mutual trust between community and law enforcement agencies; critical to public safety.

*Metrics Available to Measure Performance:

Participants complete pre- and post-program surveys designed to assess changes in 1) crisis intervention knowledge, 2) attitudes toward individuals experiencing behavioral health conditions, substance use disorders, neurodivergence, and/or homelessness, and 3) attitudes towards the CIT training program. Additionally, speaker evaluations inform sections and presenters.

*Retroactive:

Yes, the funder approved the grant modification on December 5, 2023. If not approved, the current grant timeline will not be in compliance with the federal grantor's expectations.

This letter is the formal request for Change in Scope, specifically Objective 5, Objective 1.3, and 2.2, for the Pima County CRIT **15PBJA-22-GG-03589-NTCP**.

Pima County is requesting the following:

Objective 1.3: Organizational readiness assessment in preparation for CIT Regional Program Certification (Q4, YR2023). The request is to move the objective deadline to Q4, YR2024. All other provisions of the project remain in effect.

Objective 2.2: Attain CIT Regional Certification (Q4, 2024). **The request is to modify the deliverable to Prepare the CIT Regional Certification Application (Q4, 2025).** All other provisions of the project remain in effect.

A preliminary assessment was initiated, however, the delay in hiring and onboarding the CIT Coordinator impacted the initiation of the formal preliminary assessment and application. The CIT Coordinator was hired in July 2023, and since has dedicated substantial time and effort to developing the implementation plan, approved activities to meet grant goals, objectives, and deliverables, and required duties. All required project activities are currently being implemented.

All Award Conditions remain in effect. Evidence-Based Practices, OJB Priority Areas, and Project Deliverables are currently implemented. It is anticipated that all other programmatic goals will be successfully accomplished. Deliverables, goals, objectives, aims, purpose, duties, and responsibilities will remain as in the approved narrative.

It is anticipated that all requirements will be satisfactorily met. The level of effort of the proposed key personnel will remain as proposed, within the budget threshold. All key staff and project partners are fully staffed and have remained consistent throughout the project period. This grant award modification will be associated with a budget allowable under the threshold.
