Purpose:

The second amendment to the Pima CARES project extends the end date of the original subrecipient agreement by one year and adds \$110,489.88 in funding. Pima CARES is aimed at reducing overdose deaths and injury. The purpose of this subrecipient agreement is to support individuals who are at risk of experiencing an overdose and are simultaneously involved in the justice system or are in an emergency medical setting to prevent overdoses and enhance linkages, engagement, and retention to care. Through this agreement, services will be delivered by trained Forensic Peer Support Staff in a variety of justice system and emergency medicine settings.

Program Goals/Predicted Outcomes:

The goals for the agreement with Helping Ourselves Pursue Enrichment, Inc. (HOPE, Inc.) include:

- 1. To reduce the occurrence of fatal and non-fatal drug overdoses.
- 2. To enhance linkages to substance use and support services for individuals at risk of an overdose who are involved with the justice system or who present to the hospital or emergency department.
- 3. To increase engagement and retention to substance use treatment and/or harm reduction programs.
- 4. To refer individuals to long-term substance use treatment programs, such as

**Public Benefit and Impact:** 

The agreement with HOPE Inc. provides services to community members who are at increased risk of an overdose. The period after release from a justice system or emergency medicine setting can be a period of heightened overdose risk for individuals who are using substances. Strengthening linkages in those critical periods can help reduce fatal and non-fatal overdoses and engage individuals in treatment as needed. The Subrecipient will also help individuals remain in substance use treatment and/or support programs that can help improve the wellness of the individual and the community.

#### SUBAWARD AMENDMENT

#### 1. BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE.

- 1.1. <u>Background</u>. On September 1, 2023, County and Subrecipient (collectively "Parties") entered into the above referenced agreement to prevent overdoses and provide support to individuals at risk of an overdose.
- 1.2. <u>Purpose</u>. The parties wish to provide these services for an additional year.
- 2. **TERM**. The County is exercising the second extension option to renew the contract for one additional year commencing on 09/01/2025 and terminating on 08/31/2026. If the commencement date is before the Effective Date of this amendment, the parties will, for all purposes, deem the amendment to have been in effect as of the commencement date.

#### 3. COMPENSATION AND PAYMENT.

- 3.1. <u>Maximum Payment Amount.</u> The maximum amount the County will spend under this Contract, as set forth in Section 8.1 of the original agreement, is increased by \$110,489.88. County's total payments to Subrecipient under this contract, including any sales tax, will not exceed \$620,481.78.
- 3.2. <u>Budget; Adjustment.</u> The budget in Exhibit B.1 is replaced in its entirety with the attached **Exhibit B.2 –Compensation and List of Unallowable Costs** (2 pages). This budget will remain in effect throughout the term unless otherwise adjusted and formally agreed to.

All other provisions of the Agreement not expressly modified in this Amendment will remain in effect and be binding on the parties.
