The third amendment to this agreement revises Article IV. District Responsibilities and Article V. County Responsibilities, subsection H.6. The revision to Article IV adds subsection G, which includes provisions to facilitate the exchange of aggregated, non-identifiable student health data. The revision to Article V. includes collaboration between Public Health Nursing staff and TUSD staff in the use of on-site mobile vaccination units.

The Pima County Health Department (PCHD) has long had agreements with many school districts related to immunizations and other health programs and services such as tobacco education and oral health.

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INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT AMENDMENT

The parties agree to amend the above-referenced contract as follows:

1. Background and Purpose.

- 1.1. Background. On January 1, 2022, County and Contractor entered into the above referenced agreement to cooperate on the administration of childhood immunizations and other health services.
- 1.2. Purpose. The Parties agree to modify the County Responsibilities listed in the IGA.
- 2. District Responsibilities. The parties have revised Article IV. District Responsibilities, to add subsection G to read as follows:
 - 2.1. Purpose. This amendment establishes a data-sharing agreement between TUSD and the Pima County Health Department (PCHD) to facilitate the exchange of aggregated, nonidentifiable student health data. The intent of this agreement is to support public health initiatives, enhance disease prevention efforts, and mitigate health risks in the community.
 - 2.2. Scope of Data Sharing. TUSD will provide the PCHD with de-identified, aggregated health data, including but not limited to immunization compliance rates, trends in communicable diseases within school communities, chronic health condition prevalence among student populations, and summary statistics from health screenings conducted within TUSD.
 - 2.3. Use of Data. The PCHD will utilize the shared data for the following purposes: identifying emerging public health concerns and trends, developing targeted interventions to improve student and community health, informing public health policy and decision-making, strengthening collaborative health initiatives between schools and the county health department.

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- 2.4. <u>Confidentiality and Compliance</u>. Both parties agree to comply with all relevant federal and state regulations regarding student privacy, including the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA). Only de-identified, aggregated data will be shared, and no personally identifiable information will be disclosed under this agreement.
- 2.5. Allowances of Personal Information Sharing Secondary to Health or Safety Emergency without Parental Consent. Notwithstanding the above, TUSD and PCHD may exchange personal identifiable information (PII) without parental consent if meeting 34 CFR § 99.36 health or safety emergency exception if the disclosure is necessary to protect the health or safety of students or other individuals and based on the totality of circumstances, including communicable disease outbreaks and/or other significant public health threat. PCHD will make the determination of "outbreak" under this provision.
- 3. **County Responsibilities.** The parties have revised Article V. County Responsibilities, subsection H.6 to read as follows:
 - 3.1. Provide Public Health Nursing staff who will conduct Community and Population based services; Case Management/Home Visitation and immunization services as select District sites. These services may include but not limited to: (6) Work collaboratively with Tucson Unified School District staff to provide immunizations to all age groups, including the use of on-site mobile vaccination units.

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All other provisions of the Contract not specifically changed by this Amendment remain in effect and are binding upon the parties.
