SUBJECT: Suggested Update to Board of Supervisors Rules and Regulations

In order to memorialize security planning and directives, I recommend the following language be included in the Board of Supervisors Rules and Regulations manual:

### K. Participation by Employees and Public

#### Orderly Conduct

7. Citizens attending a meeting will observe rules of propriety, decorum and good conduct. Any person making personal, impertinent, or slanderous remarks, or who becomes boisterous while addressing the Board, may be removed by the Sergeant at Arms at the direction of the Chair. Such person may be barred from further audience before the Board. The Chair will not permit unauthorized remarks from the audience, stamping of feet, whistling, yelling, booing, clapping, cheering and similar demonstrations. Members of the public are not permitted to stand in the aisles, walkways, or block exits. Members of the public may not stand or walk behind barriers intended for Pima County staff. The Chair may direct offenders from the Chambers

#### Removal

8. Should the Chair direct any member of the public be removed, the Chair will recess the meeting. The Sergeant at Arms shall ensure all members of the public exit the Hearing Room. Any member deemed to have violated these Rules and Regulations may be barred from re-entry. If there is a delay clearing the Hearing Room, the Chair may decide to conduct the remainder of the Board of Supervisors meeting virtually.

## Signs

9. 8. Signs must not obstruct the view of any person in the Hearing Room or hinder any person's participation in the proceedings. Signs shall be limited to no more than 11" by 14" in size. The Board Chair or a Board Member Vice Chair active as Chair, can direct the Sergeant at Arms to have offensive signs removed from the Hearing Room or otherwise be placed out of sight.
