As you may be aware, the Board of Supervisors will be considering an item on their April 17, 2018 agenda to reallocated \$16 million of unspent 1997 HURF funds from road construction projects to road repair work. Included in my recommendation to approve the reallocation of funding is the recommended repair of Territory Drive from Craycroft Road to Grey Mountain Trail.

The proposed work on Territory Drive would consist of removing the top 2 inches of failed asphalt and replacing it with 2 inches of new asphalt. In addition, some stabilization and repair of the shoulder adjacent to the paved surface will occur as part of the work. Subject to approval of the reallocation by the Board, and their concurrence with the roads I have recommended for repair, work on Territory Drive would be done during the fiscal year beginning July 2019. Given that the work will be competitively bid, it is reasonable to expect that the work would not begin prior to mid-2019.

I am a resident of Sunrise Mountain View Estates in District 1. On March 28, Supervisor Miller and Deputy Administrator for Public Works Carmine DeBonis spoke to our Fairfield homeowner association meeting. The purpose of the meeting was to address the terrible condition of the failed Territory Drive which is a collector road for multiple HOAs.

Mr. DeBonis discussed a proposed amendment to a 1997 Road Bond program that would repurpose \$16 million to provide for repair of failed collector and arterial roads. \$10 million dollars would be proposed for fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018. The remaining \$6 million would be used for the second year. Mr. DeBonis was going to recommend a portion of Territory Drive from Grey Mountain Trail to Craycroft (1.1 miles) for repair in the first year due to road deterioration and unsafe condition. This road carries a lot of traffic on a daily basis.

I urge you to support this amendment and to include Territory Drive on the priority list of roads to be repaired during the first year.

I am writing to you as a concerned citizen who travels this area everyday. The condition of this road is well documented as in need of major repair work.

My concern goes beyond the repair issue. Attached you will find 2 pictures that show a very dangerous situation on the south side of Territory just east of Sonoyta. The shoulder of the road in this area is below the surface of the pavement and if a driver was to drift to the right off of the pavement there is a high probability that they could loose control and go off of the road into the wash which is about 5 feet below the road level. Such an accident could result in serious injury or death.

Delaying fixing this hazard could leave the County at risk for a major lawsuit not to mention injury or death to one of our neighbors.

When making your decision as to which road projects should receive priority please look at the pictures and discuss the matter with your engineering team. This is not a political matter it is a safety issue..
