## Federal Executive Orders & Other Actions

- Since January 20<sup>th</sup>, there have been over 89 Executive Orders issued and signed, with over 121 legal actions in response to the Executive Office actions
- Federal Funding and Pima County Grants
  & Budget Implications Paused Funding
- Substantial Reduction in Federal Workforce with Court actions to reverse course on firing of employees
- Federal Budget and Expiration of March 14<sup>th</sup> Continuing Resolution
- State-level Update



Pima County Grant Portfolio Overview

#### Impacted CFDA\* numbers represented \$157M in FY2024 reported grant expenditures

#### Of the \$157M, \$105M (67%) are from:

- American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) awarded and ramping down
- Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP) awarded and ramping down
- Emergency Food and Shelter Program (EFSP) awarded and closing out
- FEMA Shelter Services Program (SSP) March 12th paused reimbursement ~\$10M

# The remaining FY2024 grant expenditures **\$52M (33%)** are representative of discretionary grants and reoccurring grants

Currently reviewing programmatic, staffing, timelines of grant obligations with departments accounting for FY2025 YTD expenditures

### Congressionally Directed Federal Funds

#### Pause of <u>Congressionally Directed</u> Funding:

American Rescue Plan Act - signed into law 2021

Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act – signed into law 2021 Notice of Pause within EOs

Inflation Reduction Act – signed into law 2022 Notice of Pause within EOs

Shelter and Services Program - Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023 Pima County and other recipients received notice of temporary withholding of payments



## House Budget Bill and March 14<sup>th</sup> Impact

#### March 14<sup>th</sup> is the expiration date for Continuing Resolution HR10545

House Budget Proposal – passed with significant proposed cuts to programs such as Medicaid, FEMA, Veteran Services, among many others

Senate has advanced the bill to avoid government shut down



## Federal Workforce

- Estimated number of Federal Workers across Arizona
  - ~63,817 (~34,000 if not including postal workers, intelligence agencies or appointees)
  - ~12,016 estimated in Pima County
- Federal Judge ordered six federal agencies to rehire thousands of workers with 'probationary' status – issued March 13<sup>th</sup>
- The large-scale February layoffs will be reflected in April / May's Bureau of Labor Statistics reporting and UCFE benefits data



### State Legislative Update

Just over 2 months in this year's legislative session:

- Floor activity is running about 2 weeks behind and there are still bills to hear in the House of origin
  - Bill review and committee assignments averaging 10 – 15 days

There are still a sizable number of bills moving through the system limiting local authority and transferring costs to county government

There is little progress on a new state budget and no negotiations with the Governor's Office on a budget.

New State revenue numbers come out after the April 15<sup>th</sup> – final versions of budget proposals slated for April, but anticipated delays.
