FY 2023-2024 Recommendations for Outside Agency Program Funding

*Introduction/Background:

The Outside Agency (OA) Program provides financial support to nonprofit community agencies that collaborate with the County to provide public services to County constituents. The six funding categories are Community Services; Emergency Food & Clothing; Senior Support; Support Services, Shelter, & Domestic Violence Services; Youth, Young Adults & Family Support; and General Services. Prior to funding recommendations being made, each program is reviewed for both programmatic and financial performance, capacity, contract compliance, and potential risk.

*Discussion:

OA funds are available on a two-year funding cycle. On July 5, 2022, the Board of Supervisors approved the OA Committee funding recommendations for FY2022-2023, and on April 4, 2023, the Board of Supervisors approved an increase of the funding amounts for awarded programs for FY2022-2023, repurposing unspent funds from programs that had not been awarded. The Committee and staff assumed level budgeting for the Outside Agency FY 2023-2024 Budget. At this time, the Committee and staff are recommending year two, FY 2023-2024 OA funds.

*Conclusion:

The Outside Agency Program complements and expands services provided directly by the County. This recommendation includes full funding to identified agencies based upon FY 2022-2023 awards. Allocations for applicable programs as administered by other departments and OA resources to social services organizations, as reviewed by the Committee, are listed in the attached.

*Recommendation:

It is recommended by both staff and the OA Committee that the Board of Supervisors approve the list for FY 2023-2024 Outside Agency Program and authorize the Chair of the Board to sign funding contract amendments with each of the agencies listed.

RE: FY 2023-2024 Recommendations for Outside Agency Program Funding

Background

The Outside Agency Citizen Review Committee (the Committee) is a panel of six members, one appointed by each Member of the Board of Supervisors and one by the County Administrator to serve as their representatives. Community & Workforce Development (CWD) staffs the Committee. Functions of the Committee include the review of community request for proposals (RFP) for Outside Agency funding, making recommendations to the Board of Supervisors, receiving community input on the types of programs and priorities needed, and to review the progress of awarded programs.

The Committee reviews proposals based on five of the approved service categories that align with the critical needs of Pima County. Outside Agency (OA) service categories are Community Services; Emergency Food and Clothing; Senior Support Services; Support Services, Shelter, and Domestic Violence Services; and, Youth, Young Adults and Family Support. The Committee does not make recommendations for the sixth category, "General Services," nor other funding requests for other County departments that manage and administer OA funds.

Discussion

OA funds are available on a two-year funding cycle. In the fall of 2021, CWD issued a bi-annual RFP, via the ZoomGrants online application system. CWD received 54 community-based agencies submitting 88 program applications for first-year 2022-2023. On July 5, 2022, the Board of Supervisors approved the OA Committee funding recommendations for FY2022-2023, and on April 4, 2023, the Board of Supervisors approved the OA Committee funding recommendations to increase the funding amounts for 2023.

The Committee held four (4) open public meetings, between April and June, for FY 2023. The Committee reviewed progress and performance reports of all funded programs, inviting those with any programmatic, fiscal, or contractual issues. Agency representatives provided a presentation to the Committee to determine capacity or recommend further customized technical assistance.

FY 2023-2024 OA Committee Recommendations

The Committee and staff assumed level budgeting for the Outside Agency FY 2023-2024 Budget. At this time, the Committee and staff are recommending year two, FY 2023-2024 OA funds to 49 agencies, 77 programs totaling \$3,623,520.00. This recommendation includes full funding to identified agencies based upon FY 2022-2023 awards. Allocations for applicable programs as administered by other



departments and OA resources to social services organizations, as reviewed by the Committee, are listed below.

The agencies continue to provide important services to help meet Pima County needs, both rural and urban from Ajo, Arivaca, and Green Valley to Catalina. Listed below is a summary of the OA Category Funding Recommendations:
