ITEM SUMMARY, JUSTIFICATION &/or SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The Pima County Sheriff's Department would like to dispose of an asset through the sale of a Cessna T210 aircraft. This Cessna T210 was seized by Customs and Border Protection in 1991 and converted to the Pima County Sheriff's Department for use in 1992. Over the course of the past 21 years, the airplane has been used for a variety of reasons to include: site survey, border evaluation, prisoner transport/extraditions, personnel transport in support of investigations as well as crime scene documentation. The Cessna T210 is an aging aircraft that no longer meets the operating needs of the department.

*If approved, the sale of the aircraft will be facilitated through Rod Robertson Enterprises, County MA 13*559. The Department hopes to have the sale finalized by year end.*

The proceeds from the sale will be used towards the purchase of a new aircraft in the future.

With the addition of several other aircraft over the years (Helio Couriers, Helicopter, Cessna 310), we have found the aforementioned uses of the T210 to be in decline and no longer in demand as a mission essential vehicle.

The proceeds from the sale will be used towards the purchase of a new aircraft in the future.
