**Department of Transportation Recommendation for Arterial and Collector Road Repair
Using \$16 Million of 1997 HURF Bond Funds**

Background

The April 17, 2018 Board Agenda includes a proposed bond ordinance amendment that contains the reallocation of \$16 million in 1997 Highway User Revenue Fund (HURF) money for road repair. The attached memorandum from Deputy County Administrator, Carmine DeBonis Jr., summarizes the Department of Transportation's recommendation for use of the \$16 million for arterial and collector road repair.

The proposal splits the funding into \$10 million of repairs in Fiscal Year (FY) 2018/19 and \$6 million of repairs in FY 2019/20. Funding is recommended to be distributed to the Board of Supervisors Districts based on their percentage of total road mileage. The plan focuses heavily on "mill and fill" repairs on failed roads, and some poor roads, prioritized based on Average Daily Traffic (ADT) volume.

Recommendation

It is recommended the bond ordinance amendment be approved and direction be provided regarding the Department of Transportation's proposed road repairs utilizing the reallocated HURF funds.

RE: **Recommended Arterial and Collector Road Repair Using \$16 Million of 1997 HURF Bond Funds**

The Department of Transportation (DOT) presented a proposal to the Transportation Advisory Committee (TAC) to utilize \$16 million of unallocated 1997 HURF Bonds for pavement repair in Fiscal Years 2019 (FY19) and 2020 (FY20). On Friday, March 9, 2018, the Bond Advisory Committee approved this Bond Amendment proposal and it is now pending Board of Supervisors (BOS) approval on April 17, 2018.

DOT proposes that the \$16 million be divided to perform \$10 million of repairs to failed arterial and collector roads in FY19 and \$6 million of repairs to failed and poor roads in FY20.

The department has developed a recommended roadway repair plan using this funding. In the past few years, available arterial and collector funding was prioritized for preservation treatments to extend pavement life. To balance treatment needs, the recommendation for the \$16 million is to perform "mill and fill" repairs on failed roads, and some poor roads, prioritized based on Average Daily Traffic (ADT) volume, where traffic counts are available.

It is recommended that funding be distributed amongst the Board of Supervisors Districts based on the percent of total road mileage. Using this criteria, funding would be distributed as follows:
